Tribal nations

Used when referring to individual Indigenous cultures and communities

Indigenous

Used when referring to the collective Indigenous American community of all tribal nations



Project background

The project began after discussion at last year's symposium on sourcing volunteers for various projects.

Project Goals

- ✦ Create a way for preferred terms to be listed
- ✦ Make the list of terms available to information professionals
- ✦ Source the information in a way that isn't intrusive

Project Objectives

- ✦ Gathered data from Tribal Nation websites
- ✦ Gathered controlled vocabulary from frequently used sources
- ✦ Created database by adding collected information to Omeka

In sum, forced removals due to United States policies and Treaties resulted in the Shawnee People being fractured into three independent sovereign Shawnee Communities: the Shawnee Tribe, Absentee Shawnee Tribe of Oklahoma, and the Eastern Shawnee Tribe of Oklahoma. Each of these Shawnee tribes are federally recognized with headquarters within the borders of the State of Oklahoma. The citizens of these three Shawnee communities comprise all saawanooki (Shawnee People) in existence today.

Future Steps

Reach out to the Indigenous community for feedback

Questions to ask:

- ✦ Understanding the complexity and diversity of Indigenous perspectives, does this resource succeed at our intended goal of culturally responsive description of Indigenous archival material held by non-tribal organizations?
- ✦ Is there a different resource we could refer to for the Tribal Nation Names and/or Indigenous Tribal Nation Names other than the Tribal Nation websites?
- ✦ Have we excluded any tribal nation or indigenous communities in Oklahoma?

Questions to ask specific tribal nation members:

- ✦ Have we correctly sourced the names represented in the Tribal Nation Names?
- ✦ When found, have we correctly sourced the Indigenous Tribal Nation Names?
- ✦ When thinking of applying a term as a subject heading, is there a preferred Name?

- ✦ Can you see yourself or your team using this resource when cataloging/remediating metadata/etc.?
- ✦ What could be added or amended to make this a beneficial resource?

- ✦ Track progress
- ✦ Acknowledge those who have worked on and assisted this project

Linked data

- ✦ Linking out to special collections in other institutions

Expand project to tribal nations in other U.S. states
