#### OU Libraries Awarded \$95K IMLS Grant

OU Libraries is among a team of three universities that has been awarded an Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) National Leadership Grant in support of 3D visualization and virtual reality technologies. The \$95,024 grant will allow for a series of three national forums on different themes: Content Creation and Publishing at Virginia Tech's Executive Briefing Center in Arlington, VA, Visualization and Analysis here at OU, and Repository Practice and Standards at the Big Ten Center in Chicago, IL.

## Unpaywall

In September's newsletter, we wrote about <u>Unpaywall</u>'s installation on computers throughout OU Libraries. Unpaywall helps users find free, legal, open access copies of academic works.



Making your work legally, openly available—whether in open access journals or by depositing your work in <a href="SHAREOK">SHAREOK</a>—will increase

## Assignment Calculator

Did you know that OU Libraries offers an <u>assignment calculator</u>? Several assignment templates are available including, video/media projects, research papers, lab reports, posters, primary sources research projects, and speeches or presentations. Students plug in start and due dates, and the calculator generates dates by which various steps (select topic, design research strategy, organize sources, etc.) should be completed. Each step has supporting information to help students understand how to complete the step and get assistance.

The <u>Digital Scholarship Lab</u> offers consultations on <u>digital tools</u> to help you organize, dean, analyze and visualize data, find hosting services, utilize GIS/mapping, create digital collections or exhibits, engage in text analysis, and apply programming languages.
