
DATA Grant

University Libraries has released an open-source Markdown Converter designed to help make open content, including open educational resources OER), shareable to the fullest extent possible. By using the Markdown Converter, well-structured documents can be converted into PDF, HTML, EPUB, and DOCX file formats with an easy-to-use web interface instead of the command line.
