Budget Update

The University Libraries must reduce its budget in 2018 by \$379,000. At present, approximately 90% of our collections budget is spent on ongoing commitments (journals and databases). As the cost of journal subscriptions has risen far in excess of inflation for the past several years, we have continually allocated more and more funds to them, to a degree that has become unsustainable. A substantial portion of those subscriptions are for multi-year agreements with publishers. These agreements provide access to all or nearly all of a publisher's journals during the life of the agreement; in return, they require us to maintain all of our existing journal subscriptions, making us unable to adjust our subscriptions to meet changing teaching and research needs.

As part of our efforts to meet our required budget reduction, the Libraries is reviewing our journal commitment with Wiley, which is currently \$990,000. We will not renew our multi-year agreement, and we intend to reduce our spending with this publisher by approximately \$250,000. We will continually review our ongoing commitments throughout 2018 to identify additional reductions for meeting our \$379,000 target. We will provide students and faculty access to Wiley journals through a combination of continued subscriptions, aggregators like JSTOR, and interlibrary loan.

We invite your comments on the recommendations from March 19 until April 27. Please contact your liaison librarian with any feedback or questions. We will finalize our commitments with Wiley by the end of the spring semester.
