Kanopy Changes

Due to budget constraints, we will limit our spending with Kanopy for 2018-19. We have set an initial budget limit for Kanopy spending; when this limit is reached, we will shift our Kanopy offerings to mediated access, which will require users to request access to video content. Mediated access will also have a budget limit, after which we will cease to provide access for the remainder of the fiscal year to any Kanopy video that has not been previously licensed for use.

Course Support



Course Materials in Canvas

The OU Libraries' Course Materials tool is designed to help instructors incorporate library materials in their Canvas courses. Instructors can use the tool to build reading lists that include books and articles owned by the library, videos, web resources, and more. Benefits:

- Use Discover to identify and link directly to resources; no need to deal with offcampus access or link maintenance
- Course materials can be saved and reused in other courses or future semesters
- Course materials are added to Canvas course navigation so that students have easy access
- Avoid copyright issues by linking directly to electronic resources
- Contribute to usage data which Libraries review when determining which resources to continue supporting
- Libraries personnel are available to help input course materials into Canvas. Learn

U.S. Congressional Records Search Engine

OU Libraries personnel have created a publicly available, U.S. Congressional Search Engine that harvests the published transcripts from the U.S. Government Printing Office on a monthly basis and automates the process of downloading, indexing and analyzing the PDF documents. Through the search engine, you can search hundreds of thousands of pages of full text in seconds and can search for keywords in the congressional hearing files spanning from the 99th Congress (1985-1986) to present.






Software/Data Carpentry

The Carpentries teach foundational coding and data science skills to researchers worldwide. Hands-on workshops cover basic concepts and tools, including program design, version control, data management, task automation, and fundamental data skills. Participants are encouraged to help one another and to apply what they have learned to their own research problems and workflows. Currently there are two curricula, Software Carpentry and Data Carpentry, which together cover R, Python, Git/Github, OpenRefine, tidy data, SQL, and bash. 
New Capabilities:


OU Libraries and the Graduate College invite you to meet your
