FT. WORTH POLICE PLACE FAKE GAY AD

According to the TCGA NEWS Tarrant County Gay Alliance has discovered that a telephone number listed in a personal advertisement in an area gay publication belongs to the City of Fort Worth, and is apparently being answered by the Fort A local man notified Worth Police. Tarrant County Gay Alliance that he was supposed to meet with the man in the advertisement, but he never showed up, and also acted strange. When he began receiving harassing telephone calls a few days later, he became worried that the advertisement may have been a phony placed by an anti-gay hate group. A few months ago in Illinois, a hate group placed a fake personal ad in a gay publication. When the ad was answered, the group sent copies of the replies to neighbors and employers, along with a warning to 'avoid this homosexual at all costs.' A member of the Gay Alliance called the number printed in the advertisement (shown at right). A man's voice on an answering machine urged the caller to leave information, and stating that "Your call is very important to me, and I am very discreet." This seemed like a very odd message to put on an answering machine, so further investigation revealed that the telephone was located at 350 West Belknap Street, on the third floor. This address was not familiar to the TCGA investigator, but he guessed it might be the housing project at Belknap and Henderson streets. He decided to drive to the address, and was shocked to find that the address is that of the new county jail and Fort Worth Policy administration building west of the Court House. The directory in the lobby showed the Police

Investigative Division on the third floor. The TCGA investigator reported an overwhelming feeling of disgust as he discovered that this fake ad to entrap gays was not placed by some kook, but by the Fort Worth Police, who are paid through his taxes to "protect" him.

Relations between the gay community and Fort Worth Police Chief Thomas Windham have been somewhat cool. Windham promised an open line of communication between the police and gays, but has irked some gays and civil libertarians by what is seen as excessive interest in raiding businesses selling 'dirty' books and video tapes to consenting adults. Windham took credit for closing last year the city's only gay bookstore. Arrests of gays in public parks are up sharply. Although the laws against public lewdness apply equally to heterosexuals and homosexuals, we don't recall any of heterosexual couples arrest automobile back seats.

Magazines accepting personal ads of this type are very careful to accept ads only from adults seeking other adults.

It would seem that the police would have

better things to do than sit around waiting for phone responses from ads in 'swinger' magazines. This ad is written in such a way that it may even appear in heterosexually- oriented magazines.

What's disturbing is wondering exactly what the police are doing with the names and phone numbers the ad generates. It would be naive to think that they are not keeping this information for 'queer files,' which takes us back to the 1970's. At that time the Fort Worth Police were observed taking down license plate numbers at gay bars and at a church with a ministry to gays. The predecessor organization of TCGA filed a civil action suit, and Judge Eldon B. Mahon ruled in March, 1978 that the police must cease this activity and destroy their files of license numbers.

The Gay Alliance finds the current action of the Fort Worth Police Department in the same vein: A gross invasion of the privacy of consenting adults. The publisher of the magazine involved says he has never run into a situation like this, and gay organizations in other Texas cities cannot recall local police being involved in such dirty business. The Gay Alliance requests that the Fort Worth City Council conduct an independent investigation as to whether this sort of activity is a proper function of the police department.

NAMES PROJECT NEEDS HELP FOR AIDS QUILT

SAN FRANCISCO- Organizers of the NAMES Project are requesting assistance of local activists and organizations in building the national "AIDS Quilt" memorial. Fabric panels bearing the names of people lost to the AIDS epidemic are being sewn into a massive quilt for display in Washington, D.C. on Sunday, October 11, 1987. Creators of the fabric tribute are asking local organizations and individuals to sponsor panel-making workshops or

quilting bees during the week of August 17-24. Calling their effort "AIDS Ouilt Week ", organizers hope to encourage participation in the NAMES Project throughout the United States in time for the October 11th display on the Capitol Mall, part of the National March on Washington for Lesbian and Gay Rights. "We hope that political clubs, AIDS agencies, sports teams, professional associations, churches, synagogues, and other groups will set aside time during Quilt Week to create memorial panels for their members and friends who have died." said Executive Director Cleve Jones. The three-feet by six-feet panels may be made of any durable, light-weight fabric. Complete panels will be sewn together by the NAMES Project in San Francisco. then shipped to Washington, DC for the National March. "We hope to include panels from every part of the country for the display at the Capitol, but we must receive them in San Francisco by September 15th," stressed Managing Director Mike Smith. "Local groups and individuals can help us reach this goal by sponsoring workshops and displays during AIDS Quilt Week."

DALLAS LESBIANS FORM ORGANIZATION

DALLAS- There is an amazing group of women in the city of Dallas who believe the time has come for lesbians to be a visible force of the community. Several hundred women have united under the name of the DALLAS AREA LESBIAN VISIONARIES (DALV). A name which clearly identifies their purpose. They share a vision that Dallas has the capacity to become one of the major Lesbian cultural centers in the southwest area.

They have implemented several projects that clearly state this to the rest of the world. First and most impressive was the establishment of a telephone hot-line aimed at informing callers of happenings and events in the area. The Lesbian Information Line (nicknamed 'LIL', area code 214-528-2426) goes beyond just being a calendar of events. It is a useful tool for travelers in search of a place to stay, people in search of a job, jobs in search of people, or anything else for which a use might be found. It consists of a recording informing the listener of events and allows for unlimited time to leave a message. The lines are monitored hourly and all calls returned.

Although the phone line will help Lesbians in the southwest, the Visionaries didn't stop there. They meet monthly and assess the needs, wants and issues of the community. They have established and helped coordinate special interest groups which allow those interested (in whichever groups) to participate at a level where they feel comfortable. Some of the groups Arts & Entertainment, available are: Sports, a Business Referral Directory, an Group, Educators Support Womenspace, a Newcomers Welcome Wagon, and many more.

The Visionaries made a terrific showing at Dallas' Razzle Dazzle. They have plans for a Lesbian "Floatilla" for the Gay Pride Parade. One special interest group is planning a Gay Festival Day which hopefully will become an annual event with music, crafts, entertainment and fun for all.

The DALV have the visions to determine what goals they want to achieve. They have the cohesive energies to accomplish any goal and they have a good track record. The Visionaries meet every third Tuesday of each month at Rumors (located at 5039 Willis) from 7:30-9:30. For information call LIL at (214)528-2426.

The Association of Gay and Lesbian Psychiatrists (AGLP), after a two year period of rapid growth, has become one of the largest nationally oriented physicians' organizations in the United State dedicated to gay and lesbian issues. Current projections anticipate that AGLP will become the nation's largest sometime in 1987. In 1986, the American Psychiatric Association (APA) completely removed all references to homosexuality from its diagnostic nomenclature. Psychiatry is the only medical specialty to have taken a public stance that homosexuality does not represent a medical or mental disorder and has decried state laws discriminating against gays and lesbians. This stance has enabled many psychiatrists, who otherwise would have remained well closeted, to join the AGLP (which is loosely allied with the APA) resulting in AGLP's dramatic AGLP will be celebrating its 10th Anniversary during the APA Annual Convention in Montreal in May of 1988. Answers your questions about love, relationships & personal problems

Dear Agnes,

I am twenty-five years old and I fell in love with a woman who was eleven years older than me. She knew that I loved her, but she felt that I was only "in love" with her. I helped her get over her last lover and I stood by her. She helped me get over a rape that happened in March. We were together for seven months and have had several fights.

My problem is that she just told me she has been seeing my best friend. I was very shocked. Both of them have told me that they did not mean for this to happen. They have even asked me to share a house with them.

I do need a place to live. I have been staying at my ex-lovers house and so has her new girlfriend. I sleep in the kid's room or in the floor. It hurts me knowing that there is someone on my side of the bed, I still get along with my ex-lover, but not too well with my best friend.

My question is, do you think I will just keep hurting myself if I keep living with them?

My ex-lover knows that I will always be there for her and I feel she will always be there for me. I just can't stand to talk to my best friend anymore.

Am I wrong for that?

Dear Confused,

Yes, move out immediately if not sooner! Living in the same house with them is not going to help your already ailing ego or self esteem. Life is too short to put yourself through such emotional hell. Noone can be all giving all of the time, and it is definately time for you to stop giving. Your letter leaves me with the impression that you feel you have brought this on yourself. If there is a victim, it's you. You shouldn't feel guilty about moving out, or about not wanting to talk to your "best friend". However remember your "best friend" did not get in this situation all by herself. As I have said before, often we place blame on friends and not lovers, when in fact lovers are just as much to blame, if not more.

I moved to Houston three weeks ago. I am eighteen and I have a lover who had to stay home while I am here going to school. I'm very in love with her. Since I came here I decided to see how much I love her and how faithful I am. So I tried going out to the clubs here and I met nice loking women that were interested in me. I noticed that I didn't want of feel anything for them.

My lover is only 16 and, according to the law, she cannot leave home until she is 17. Her parents hate me because they won't accept that we are gay and love each other. So, I can't even write to her. I talk to her once a week on the phone and she tells me she loves me and she will wait. But both of us are going crazy without each other. This is the longest we have ever been apart. What do we do? Going Crazy in Houston

Dear Crazy,

There is nothing to do but wait! According to the law, you could be put in jail for contributing to the delinquency of a minor and/or kidnapping and statutory rape. Considering the way her parents feel this is a very real possibility if she leaves home to live with you right now.

A year may seem like a long time to you right now, but try to see the positive side of your seperation. You will have time to make new friends and concentrate on establishing yourself in school. 



AIDS

SOME FACTS YOU

SHOULD

KNOW.

Most of us know by now how the AIDS virus is transmitted and, as lesbians, most of you probably know alot about safe sex for men and heterosexuals. You may also have heard that several lesbians in the U.S. have or have died of AIDS. These cases *are* isolated, but what about you?

Everyone has focused so much attention on the "high risk groups" that many lesbians have the mistaken idea that they cannot get AIDS. Those who have wondered if they are at risk have found it hard to get information about safe sex for lesbians or how they can protect themselves against the AIDS virus.

AM I AT RISK?

Yes, if you:

- Share needles or other paraphernalia if using IV drugs. This is the most important single risk factor for lesbians.
- · Have had sexual contact with:
- -people who use IV drugs
- -men who have had gay sex since 1979
- -people of either sex whose

you are considering pregnancy. Listed below you will find the safe sex guidelines for lesbians who have reason to believe they may be infected with the AIDS virus or whose activities may place them at risk. Most coincide with safe sex practices for gay men and heterosexuals although there are some differences.

- -sexual histories are unknown
- -people who are hemophiliac, or who have received blood transfusions or blood products between 1979-1985.
- Have used semen for donor insemination from a donor in a high risk group who is known to be antibody positive or whose risk status is unknown.
- Have received a blood transfusion or blood products between 1979-1985

If you think you may have been exposed to the AIDS virus you may want to consider taking the AIDS antibody test at a testing site where your anonymity is guaranteed. If the antibody is found you may not get AIDS but you will be infectious for an indefinite period of time. You may also want to take the test if

SAFE SEX PRACTICES

If either woman may be carrying the virus, she should not allow her menstrual blood, vaginal secretions, urine, feces or breast milk to enter her partner's body through the mouth, rectum, vagina or broken skin. Although the virus has been found in saliva, there is no evidence that it can be transmitted through this fluid.

Safe Sex practices for Lesbians at Risk

- -massage, hugging
- -social (dry) kissing
- -body-to-body rubbing
- -voyeurism, exhibitionism, fantasy
- -masturbation
- vibrators or other sex toys (keep separate toys for each partner and always use your own on yourself)
- -S/M or other activities that do not involve the exchange of body fluids

Possibly Safe Sex Practices

-oral-genital centact (cunninglus) using a thin piece of latex placed between the vulva and the tongue.

-hand/finger-to-genital contact, vaginal or anal penetration with finger(s) using a disposable latex glove.

-french (wet) kissing

-anal-oral contact (rimming) with a latex barrier

Unsafe Sex Practices

unprotected cunninglus (especially during menstruation)

 unprotected hand/finger-to-vagina contact especially if you have cuts on hands

-sharing needles (IV or other skin peircing needles)

-blood contact of any kind including menstrual blood

-urine or feces in mouth or vagina

-unprotected rimming (anal-oral contact)

-fisting (hand in vagina/rectum)

-sharing sex toys that have contact with body fluids.

If you have sex with men in high risk groups, learn about, and always use a condom.

You may also wonder what all this has to do with you if you and your lesbian friends are not at a high risk for AIDS.

 Many lesbians have been affected by the AIDS related death or illness of friends and loved ones.

 The AIDS epedemic emphasizes the need to address the problems of substance abuse, and especially IV drug use within the lesbian community. Insemination choices and coparenting options have been limited by AIDS.

 Many lesbians are involved in AIDS related work as volunteers

and paid workers.

Approximately 7% of the people with AIDS in the U.S. are women - 50% of these women are Black, 23% Hispanic, 26% are Caucasian.

Women account for 7% of people with AIDS in the U.S.

Most lesbians are not at a high risk for contracting or transmitting the AIDS virus. However, if you use IV drugs or have unsafe sexual contact with people in a high risk group you are at risk.


