TEXAS HUMAN RIGHTS FOUNDATION FUNDS LESBIAN CUSTODY BATTLE

AUSTIN -The Texas Human Rights Foundation has awarded \$2,000 to a lesbian mother in Travis County to help her in a court battle to regain custody of her six year old son.

Since the custody battle is being fought solely on the grounds that the woman is a lesbian, the Foundation's Board of Directors felt that the case warranted support from the Foundation's Legal Rights Fund. As President Lee Taft explained, "Each custody case is unique, because the overriding criterion in each one is:'what is in the best interest of the child?' Since this lesbian mother is a competent provider who loves her son and takes excellent care of him, there should not be an impediment to her having custody of the boy just because of her sexual orientation."

Scientific research has shown, and both the American Medical Association and the American Psychiatric Association confirm, that sexual orientation that differs from the majority is not considered sexually dysfunctional nor is it

considered a mental disorder. Homosexuality in no way prevents a parent from raising children using appropriate love and attention. In addition, recent psychological evidence has proven that there is no higher incidence of homosexuality children raised among by lesbian or gay parents than there is among children raised by THRF heterosexual parents. for will be used funds preparation of supportive expert testimony to this effect. Human Rights The Texas Foundation funds cases dealing with AIDS discrimination and other lesbian/gay discrimination in areas such as employment, custody. housing, Or Foundation President Taft

Foundation President Taft remarked, "We have many cases requesting funding from us right now. Many, of course, deal with AIDS discrimination. Our Legal Committee examines each one carefully. We'd like to eventually reach the point where we can support every case that needs help. We're working dililgently to make sure that there are enough funds available to help as many as we can."





Dear Agnes,



As December ushers in cold nights, most of us think about building up the fire and resting our socked feet in front of the fire place. But before you run back and forth to the convenience store on the corner and spend all your spare dollars on four or five logs consider these tips on buying firewood.

<u>Seasoned wood</u> is dried. It burns quicker, starts easier, and leaves less buildup in the chimney.

<u>Green wood</u> is recently cut. It is hard to start, burns slowly, and is more apt to spark and pop. There is more buildup in the chimney.

Some dealers sell <u>mixed cords</u>; a combination of green wood and seasoned wood.

A <u>cord</u> is a stack of wood 8 feet long by 4 feet high by 2 feet wide.

An <u>apartment cord</u> is a stack of wood 8 feet long by 4 feet high by 16 to 18 inches wide.

It pays to shop around before buying. Call several dealers and ask if you are buying seasoned wood, green wood, or mixed. _21Prices will vary depending on the type of wood you select and the location you live in. For instance, oak is generally a better buy if you live in Dallas than pinion. We received quotes from \$90 to \$315 per cord. Ask questions, it's an investment.

Dos & Don'ts

Do use a fireplace screen.

Don't leave a fire burning if you are leaving the house unattended.

Don't leave a fire burning while you are sleeping.

Don't start a fire with any flammable liquid.

Do check the chimney for buildup. Have it cleaned if necessary.

Do remember a fire can get out of hand and always think safety.

And most of all, do enjoy your fireplace this winter. Nothing is nicer than sitting with your feet in front of the fire with a big mug of hot chocolate.



This story is reflective of a common experience among people during the holidays - loneliness! Everyone I know has experienced a holiday away from loved ones. I believe we all take moments to reflect where we've been and where we're going. This story was written as a tribute to some of my friends who have passed away and the impact of their absence at holidays, in particular. With the severe outbreak of AIDS, most members of the gay community will be addressing one or two less Christmas cards this year. Possibly this account may help someone who is suffering from that emptiness. It is sometimes a comfort to know others have suffered and survived.

It is three a.m. Monday morning, which is quite possibly the quietest time of the week. It's Christmas again. Unable to sleep, I open a bottle of wine. I sip slowly on my first glass as thoughts crowd my head, on this, a significant morning.

I remember the Magic of Christmas as a kid. I long to once again grasp the excitement and wonder I felt at that time. The waiting for Santa Claus, unable to sleep due to my anticipation, being frustrated at the heaviness of my eyelids as the minutes crept slowly into hours ... That mad rush to be the first one down the stairs and under the tree. What happened? Now Christmas brings me the blues. I pour another glass of wine hoping to muddle my depression. Though the season focuses on thankfulness and joy, I generally find myself dwelling in the past. My past. I wonder where so many of my friends disappeared, and why I'm not there...out in the world...out of by Christine Johansen

A stack of returned Christmas cards on my coffee table peer up at me accusingly. It is apparent I have let my Rolodex get out of date. The days became years, and I lost some of the people I love most.

I wonder if my first lover found the pilot husband and three kids she wanted. She seemed content to want these things which I could never give her. She was my First Christmas away from home. Drunkenly in love, I felt I had, at long last, learned the True meaning of Christmas. I was but a child then. The Magic has long since gone away.

This is the Eleventh Christmas since I got Bartholomew, the runt of a friend's collie's litter. The father was anonymous so it seemed Barth-olomew Bastard was an appropriate name. He has filled my years with happiness and understanding.

This is the Ninth Christmas since my Uncle was senselessly killed in a Christmas Eve robbery. Ten minutes later would have found him on his way home from work.

This is the Seventh Christmas since I left my hometown. Once again, In Love, Bartholomew and I packed our bag, closing another chapter of life. When the relationship was over, lost addresses erased the chances of contacting old friends. Thus

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I entered the social scene of another community, making new friends.

I sigh at the realization this is the Second Christmas since my good friend/former lover passed away unexpectedly in a car wreck. With a heavy heart, I try to swallow the lump in my throat. Tears threaten to fall. I empty my glass, quickly refilling it. I get up and turn on the stereo for distraction. Soft sounds pierce the silence. My exertions alert me to the fact that the wine is beginning to affect my balance. Welcoming the numbing effects of the wine, I sink back onto the couch, raising my glass to my lips. I try to loose my train of thought to no avail. She's gone.

This is my Third Christmas without my beloved best friend. The First Christmas after his death, his absence haunted me. Bartholomew restlessly paced, as though he too noticed the absence of the familiar shuffling of Jim's approach. That Christmas found me still trying to face my grief, accept my loss. It was a very lonely Christmas. I had a bad case of the blues. As I got some typing paper out of my desk, I noticed I also held a large Christmas card. I opened it, immediately recognizing the scrawled handwriting. I remember feeling reassurance from this unexpected voice of the past. I felt comforted. This is how I made it through Christmas Past.

Christmas Present haunts me. It is a reminder of Christmases shared with lovers. My house is empty this year. Bartholomew and I are quiet victims as the hours pass, catapulting us through this day called Christmas. Bartholomew has had a rough winter. His health is decaying and I know this to be his last Christmas. I call him over, letting him find a spot on the sofa. Caressing him, I allow him to drink the wine in my glass. I can't conceive how lonely life will be without Bartholomew. My future looks bleak.

I take an inventory of the good and bad of this Christmas. It's not snowing this year. It's unseasonably hot. Santa's on street corners, ring bells while sweating profusely. Ho Ho Ho's weakly welcome an irritable public. Dried up trees stand forlorn, uninvited to share the holiday. Homeless, these rejects. Outcasts of society. I wonder if I am the only person spending Christmas alone? Do other people feel this letdown today? I imagine so.

I call my grandparents to wish them well. They lift my spirits. They have survived worse things than I and maintained a positive outlook on life. Cheered somewhat, I hang up the phone.


I am lucky to have shared my life as fully as I have. One cannot lose what one has never had. I have a roof over my head, plenty of food on the table, and a steady well paying job. I have friends I love dearly. My parents are still alive and part of my life. Basically I am satisfied with my life. I feel lonely sometimes because I do not have a lover at this time. I am aware that often it's easier to live without, than to live with a lover. I let this thought comfort me.

So my blues fade in and out like a distant radio station. And I find myself anxious for the morrow which is but just another regular day.





A Discussion of Lesbian Literature Both New and Old

This Month T. Sumner Reviews:





Let's talk stocking stuffers. All of us like to find our Christmas stockings filled with things that are fun, provocative, informative, erotic or all of the above. I've got two books this month that fit the bill. Both are new editions of lesbian books that are several years old, but if you have yet to read them, they are well worth the time.

First we have <u>The Law of</u> <u>Return</u>, (by Alice Bloch, \$8.95, Alyson Publications) a novel of some distinction. The story revolves around a young Jewish girl who is on a search for herself. The search first takes her to Israel and eventually to lesbianism.

It is a touching book that will take you beyond this place into worlds unknown. Alice Bloch writes wonderfully and gives -27-

real insight into the process of growing up and coming out.

My only wish is that Elisheva (the main character) would have made her lesbian debut earlier in the book. But, alas, that would have been to easy, and coming out, as we all know, is a long, involved process.

All personal complaints aside, I would definitely recommend this book to everyone. Especially those women interested in Jewish culture and Jewish lesbianism.

Next, we have Coming to Power: Writings and Graphics on Lesbian S/M, (\$8.95, Alyson Publications) collection of writings edited by members of SAMOIS a lesbian/feminist S/M organization. Just so you'll know, SAMOIS was the name

of the estate of Anne-Marie, a lesbian in *The Story of O*, who pierces and brands O.

Now, while this may not sound like such a great stocking stuffer, it covers all on the list of requirements for such things: provocative, erotic, informative and fun. As Katherine Davis says in the introduction, "This is an outrageous book. It has many purposes and will have many effects on those who read it, on those who only hear about it, and on those who will never know it exists."

This a book that is trying to show that, just as lesbianism is considered a "deviant" lifestyle by the straight community, so is S/M considered deviant by the majority of the lesbian community. It is not so much a plea for tolerance but a definition of S//M written by many women in hopes to gain understanding.

This is not a book for the faint of heart, nor for the unadventurous. However, if you start with an open mind, you may find yourself coming away with a new understanding of S/M and what it means to these women socially as well as politically.

Included in this updated edition are several important articles on AIDS and safe sex.

So, try it, but only if you are comfortable enough with your sexuality to dare.






