
Armstrong Amendment Struck Down

WASHINGTON - U.S. District Judge Royce Lamberth ruled that the U.S. Congress does not have the constitutional power to compel the District of Columbia and its council members to enact legislation, including anti-gay legislation.

The amendment, sponsored by Sen. William Armstrong (R-Colo), would have allowed religiously associated educational institution to discriminate against "any person or persons that are organized for, or engaged in, promoting, encouraging, or condoning any homosexual act, lifestyle, orientation, or belief."

Congress coerced the Washington D.C. City Council to pass the amendment by the end of 1988 or face the cutoff of all city funds.

Judge Lamberth held that council members have the right to exercise their own judgement in voting for or against legislation and that the U.S. government has no right to force council members to vote for any legislation.



Doctors Confirm Kowalski Can Communicate

MINNESOTA - Sharon Kowalski can understand and communicate her needs and wishes say three court appointed doctors.

Kowalski was severely injured in an automobile accident in 1983 and has been kept in a nursing home since 1985. This is the first full evaluation for competency since 1984 although such testing was required annually for her father to retain legal guardianship.

This is all in response to Kowalski's partner, Karen Thompson's, fight for proper medical care for Kowalski and the right to visit and help care for her. District court judge Robert Campbell has ordered the Kowalski be moved from her present location to a rehabilitation unit to receive communication rehabilitation. Visitors will be allowed based on Kowalski's wishes.

Thompson and her attorneys were elated with the evaluation.

Oak Lawn Counseling Center Changes Name

DALLAS - Oak Lawn Counseling Center has changed its name to Oak Lawn Community Services (OLCS).

The change was official on January 1, 1989.

The name change reflects the growth of the diversity of services offered. OLCS now encompasses Health Services and Public Information and Education in addition to Counseling Services.

Health Services includes the Buddy Project and PWA Care-A-Van transportation system.

Public Information and Education will include a 24-hour bilingual AIDS Hotline, all media relations and publications within the OLCS, a speakers bureau and corporate education.

The Counseling Services division includes all group, individual, AIDS, career and relationship counseling. Also under this division are the wellness programs, educational seminars and the Oasis Recovery Program for drug and alcohol abuse.

OLCS is also offering special programs of interest to the lesbian community. Women-only therapy groups, lesbian AIDS education and space at the center for lesbian organizations are just some of the outreach programs planned.

Herland Sister Resources Moves Into New Building

OKLAHOMA CITY - Herland Sister Resources is all moved in to their new building at 2312 NW 39th. The new

resource center is also expanding its services to include free showings of lesbian and gay films on the second and fourth Friday of every month.

Herland is a women's collective that provides a framework for a variety of projects for the support and enjoyment of Oklahoma City's women's community.

Gay Spirituality Workshop Slated

AUSTIN - Daniel Helminiak will present an advanced workshop on gay spirituality at Metropolitan Community Church of Austin, 1100 Springdale Road, on Saturday, February 18 from 10am to 4pm.

The workshop is designed for people who are already religiously comfortable being lesbian or gay and who want to explore how their sexuality can foster spiritual growth. Although the program will touch on issues specific to Christianity, the workshop will be appropriate for any person of good will, including those who do not believe in God.

A ten-dollar donation is requested, but no one will be turned away because of inability to pay. All proceeds go to the MCCA building fund. Participants should bring their own lunch.

Dr. Daniel Helminiak is a Roman Catholic priest and theologian. He is author of The Same Jesus and Spiritual Development and numerous articles on psychology, theology, and spirituality.

He has lectured nationally on sexuality and spirituality and is an instructor in human sexuality at Austin Community College. He is also the Director for Spiritual Growth at Omega Point Counseling Center in Austin. For further information about the workshop, call (512) 338-0577.

National Lesbian Conference in Planning Stages

WASHINGTON, D.C. - According to the *Herland Sister Resources Newsletter*, a group of east coast lesbians convened an open meeting to begin to set goals and establish the initial planning structure for an all-lesbian conference tentatively

scheduled for late 1989 or early 1990. The conference envisioned is the first of its kind: broad based coalition effort to set a lesbian agenda for social, economic, and political change, to increase lesbian visibility and to acknowledge lesbian diversity and common ground.

Regional planning meetings on the national conference are being organized throughout the country in the months ahead. The first national steering committee meeting is set for March 4-5 in Raliegh-Durham, NC.

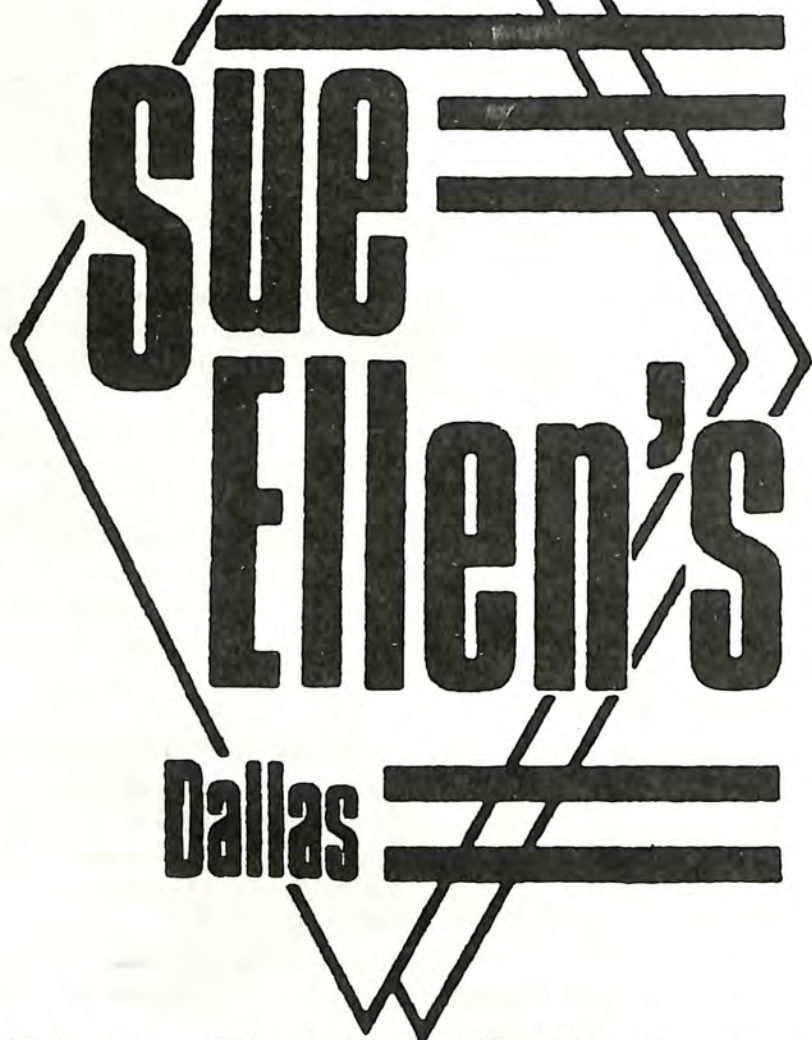

WINTER TRAVEL FOR WOMEN

A Look At Lesbian/Gay Travel Opportunities In The Southern Rockies

I've attempted skiing a couple of times and although I won't say I was good, I will say I wasn't too bad for someone who never did master the art of stopping. Now, I always claimed that skiing was too expensive and dangerous for a klutz like me, but I just might be willing to try it again since I've discovered a number of lesbian and gay guesthouses sprinkled throughout the ski areas of the Rockies.

Of course, downhill skiing isn't the only thing you'll find to do! There's also cross-country skiing, snow shoeing, tubing, sleigh rides, and of course romantic nights by the fire with snow piling up outside.

Listed on the following pages are some of the guesthouses in Colorado and New Mexico. You'll also find some winter activities, events, and info for "family". So, get out your snow chains, your gloves, your ski clothes, and get ready!

COLUMBINE LODGE

Located about 8 miles west of Colorado Springs, the
Columbine Lodge offers very reasonable



rates and lots of specials! \$30 per couple, per night is the basic rate. Over Valentine's you can get a room for \$25 per night or \$36 per night including flowers, champagne, and a dance for sweethearts! Things to do nearby include: cross country skiing, sleigh rides, ice skating, ice fishing, and downhill skiing just 20 minutes to an hour and a half away. Summer fun includes white water rafting, fishing, hiking, etc. Owners Barbara and Marty also plan women's music concerts, dances and a group campout in the near future.

BRECKENRIDGE MT. HOUSE

Breckenridge, CO

This is a little different concept. You can rent this 2 1/2 bedroom plus a loft house for a minimum of four, or up to ten women. Rates vary between winter and summer. Winter rates run approximately \$275 per night (\$27.50 per person based on a group of ten), summer rates are \$120 and up, depending on the number in your group. All the linens, cooking utensils, etc. are provided, but you must bring your own food (and cook). The house is about 1 mile from the ski area and from the town of Breckenridge.

THE GALISTEO INN

Just minutes from Santa Fe, you'll find this little Inn. Of course, you'll be within driving distance of ski areas, shopping and sight seeing, but you'll also be right on the spot for cross-country skiing, horseback riding etc... The main house is 250 years old and situated on 8 acres. A heated lap pool,

spa, and indoor sauna a just some of the amenities. Winter rates range from \$45-\$90 and summer rates from \$50-\$115. Women only times are available upon request.

This bed & breakfast is predominantly male oriented but welcomes women. 30 minutes west of Colorado Springs and 1 hour from major ski areas, there is much to keep you entertained here. You can also find cross-country skiing, ice skating, shopping, etc.

15 Minutes from the heart of Albuquerque and 40 minutes from Santa Fe you'll find this charming little bed & breakfast. In a great location for day trips, you can find downhill and cross-country skiing, horseback riding, hot air ballooning and a natural hot springs all within an hours drive. Rates are \$45 per person, \$50 per couple with an optional breakfast for a small amount. There is a hot tub in the courtyard, as well as, a fireplace and library in the common room.

WINTER SPORTS TRIPS

WOODSWOMEN, a women's adventure travel organization also offers much in the way of winter activities. The Yellowstone Ski Extravaganza happens February 25th thru March 4th and a Cross Country Powder Ski is offered in Colorado February 11th thru the 18th. Woodswomen also offers ski

THINGS OF NOTE

Other information of note for lesbians and gay men planning a winter vacation:

ASPEN has no lesbian or gay accommodations. However, Aspen has had a non-discrimination policy since 1976 and there should be no problems with lodging for same-sex couples.

GAY SKI WEEK is offered yearly in Aspen. It is traditionally held the last week in January but you should call the Aspen Gay/Lesbian Group at (303) 468-1956 for specific dates and details. Although it's too late this year, plan on 1990! This has been a predominantly gay male event but organizers would like to see more women participate.

Also of invaluable interest to those who travel are the guide books for lesbians and gays. Three of the biggest are listed below. Here are some addresses - write to them or check your favorite bookstore for copies of your favorite one.

A Discussion of Lesbian Literature Both New and Old

This month T. Sumner Reviews:

This winter has been so warm that I haven't been able to do one of my favorite things - sit in front of the window with a good book and a cup of hot chocolate and watch it snow. I did get to sit down with a good book - just the snow and the hot chocolate were missing. The book is *A Mistress Moderately Fair* by Katherine Sturtevant (Alyson Publications, Inc, \$8.95). With the seventeenth-century London theater district as a backdrop, we meet Margaret Featherstone, a widow who manages her own affairs and is a playwright. While we may not think this is so shocking, 17th century London would have undoubtedly

thought so. Margaret literally runs into Amy Dudley, a mysterious woman and talented actress, and both their lives are forever changed.

Romance develops and blossoms as Margaret vows to write a masterpiece to launch Amy to stardom. But, Amy has a secret and should her past ever come to light, both she and Margaret could be delivered to the gallows.

Amy never reveals her secret to Margaret in fear that she will no longer love her. When she can no longer keep her secret, she disappears leaving Margaret bewildered and hurt.

Margaret retreats into her shell and vows to write her finest play. The new

work demands a great actress and all believe that only Amy can play the part. The rush to find her leads to a very surprising conclusion.

Lesbian literature has been in need of a good historical novel since *Patience and Sarah* and think I've found it. Historically correct in both language and manner, Ms. Sturtevant has placed two wonderful characters in an accurate setting.

A Mistress Moderately Fair is Sturtevant's first novel but, she has published stories in *Sinister Wisdom* and *Calyx* as well as reviews in the *San Francisco Chronicle* and the *San Jose Mercury News*. She has also written an, as yet unpublished, travel book, *Women's Walks: A Feminist Guide to Historical London*.

Sturtevant is a native Californian although she has traveled to England to research material for *Women's Walks*. I would recommend this novel to everyone but particularly those who enjoy history or the history of theater. I hope Ms. Sturtevant will bless us with another novel soon.
