TEXAS RIGHTS LOBBY IN TROUBLE

Texas Human Rights Foundation Sponsors Second Challenge to 21.06

AUSTIN - The Texas Human Rights Foundation (THRF) announced the filing of a lawsuit in Travis County District Court on April 12, 1989, challenging the constitutionality of Section 21.06 of the Texas Penal Code, which criminalizes the private sexual relations between consenting adults of the same gender.

The case was filed against the State of Texas as defendant, by five plaintiffs: Linda Morales of Houston, Tom Doyal of Austin, Patricia (Pat) Cramer of Austin, Charlotte Taft of Dallas and John Thomas of Dallas. The five plaintiffs are represented by Austin attorney J. Patrick Wiseman with THRF acting as "of counsel".

The lawsuit seeks to have 21.06 declared unconstitutional and barred from enforcement on the grounds that it violates the plaintiffs rights under the Bill of Rights of the Texas Constitution and under the common law right of privacy as recognized by the courts in Texas. The plaintiffs allege that they are all practicing homosexuals who deeply fear prosecution under 21.06. Specifically, they contend in their petition that the statute:

1. unconstitutionally criminalizes their private sexual relations with other

consenting adults of the same gender; 2. encourages disruption of their family relationships, thereby causing them alienation and separation from their families;

3. limits their employment opportunities, thus requiring them to tailor their career choices to avoid discrimination; 4. encourages hate crimes against gay

 encourages hate crimes against gay men and lesbians, tacitly condoning such practices as "gay bashing" and verbal assaults;

 encourages discrimination against gay men and lesbians in the judicial system, and harassment of them by law enforcement officials; and

 subjects gay men and lesbians to emotional stress because of the statesanctioned stigma attached to the nature of their private consensual relations.

In commenting on the reasons for the bringing of the lawsuit, Houston attorney David Bryan, the legal director of THRF said:

"The State of Texas is one of just six states in this country that criminalizes only the intimate and private consenting relations of two men or two women. The rationale given to support this criminalization is frequently that the majority has the right to dictate its view of morality to the populace—precisely the same reasoning used in this country until 1967 to criminalize interracial marriages. To borrow words from Justice Blackmun of the U. S. Supreme Court, it is precisely because the issue

raised by this 21.06 lawsuit touches the heart of what makes individuals what they are, that we should be especially sensitive to the rights of those whose choices upset the majority."

THRF also has pending at this time its formal complaint with the Texas State Commission on Judicial Conduct to remove Judge Jack Hampton of Dallas from the bench.

Lesbians To Keynote State Conference

HOUSTON - Two native Texas Leshians will keynote the second annual Texas Lesbian Conference (TLC), June 2-4, 1989 at the Astro Village Hotel. Gloria Anzaldua, chicana, tejana and co-editor of This Bridge Called My Back: Writings by Radical Women of Color, will keynote the Saturday morning session. Her address will focus on the borderland experience: caught between two cultures, an alien in both. Capturing the social diversity in Texas communities. Sunday's presentor and lesbian novelist Antoinette Azolakov explores the contrasting views of the feminist and the non-feminist and of women in traditional versus non-traditional occupations. Her published works include Cass and the Stone Butch, Skiptrace and Contactees Die Young.

The objectives of the conference are to create a network of lesbians to facilitate communication, promote grass root organizations and increase visibility. The conference is being produces by All Mujeres Interested in Getting Active (AMIGA) and Womynspace of Houston. AMIGA is a lesbian latina

organization committed to increasing the visibility of latinas and which works toward civil rights for all. Womynspace of Houston is a non-hierachial feminist organization founded to create an alternative space for womyn in a chemical free, women only, supportive environment.



SEXUAL HARASSMENT

What You can Do about It.



Case 2: Fred Slez is the company trash mouth. There has never been a sexist or dirty joke that has not passed his ear or lips for that matter. It is Monday morning and he is loaded with a new list and here he comes, "Do you



know how many lesbians it takes to change a light bulb?..."

Case 3: "Yes, Jamie your work here is really appreciated, but if you ever

expect to get a raise or promotion of ion around here, Honey, you better lighten up and start socializing... Know what I mean?.."

Since 1986, employers are held responsible for a harrassment-free environment as well as for the prevention of sexual harassment.

ronment. This can be a result of teasing, comments, the presence of suggestive posters, or sexual jokes. The second is unwelcome physical or verbal behavior of a sexual nature. This behavior may

be implied or an outright condition of your e m p l o y m e n t , wages, or advancement.

Once upon a time, a person who was being sexually harassed at work had to either put up with it or leave the job, hoping that a new job would offer a more professional work environment. By 1980 things began to change, you had the option of filing a complaint, but a final resolution of the case could take years. Then, in 1986, the Supreme Court handed down a decision that said the employer was responsible for a harassment free environment and further responsible for the prevention of sexual harassment.

Today most stajor companies have a sexual harassum nt policy.

But, what is sexual harassment???

There are no clear cut guidelines for determining what and what isn't sexual harassment. See a harassment is what ever makes yo a luncomfortable. There are two cassment: Legally are still ever work environments.

What to do.... ...if you are being sexually harassed?

1. Confront the "harasser"! Tell him that his behavior is offensive and that if it continues you will report it. [Document the date you confront him. This can be a simple note on your calendar at home.]

...if he doesn't stop?

2. Warn him verbally and in writing that if his behavior continues you will notify his supervisor or manager and the personnel department. [Document this on your calendar too.]

All documentation should include the date, time, specific behavior, and details involved. Be sure to note any witnesses present. Always keep copies of all your records.

... If the behavior persists?

- **3.** Use the company complaint procedure. If there isn't a complaint procedure go to the next ranking supervisor in the department. Remind the supervisor, manager, or employer that it is the company's responsibility to correct the situation.
- 4. Further contacts include your States' Labor Department and the EEOC [Equal Employment Opportunity Commission] 1-800-USA-EEOC. They will direct you to a regional office and tell you what needs to be done.

It is essential to follow these guidelines and to document your actions. You should always confront the person verbally first. That gives them the benefit of a doubt; and there is always a possibility that they really do not realize their behavior is offensive. Further, a sexual harassment charge can ruin a career and won't leave either party untouched. Following the steps listed above can help resolve the problem with less career and emotional damage.

At the beginning of this article we asked you to choose which case(s) represented sexual harassment. As you now know, all of them constitute harassment. If it makes you feel uncomfortable, embarrassed or pressured - it is harassment. Keep in mind that even though the examples in this article refer to the male harasser/female harassee, this is not always the case. Harassment can occur at all levels of employment and can come from

members of either sex. It is very unprofessional for a supervisor, manager, or anyone of authority to solicit sex for favors. Under the law you are entitled to a comfortable, harassment-free work environment.



Our next book is much more intriguing. Of Love and Glory by Evelyn Kennedy is a story of passion in the midst of war. The setting is 1943 London. England is






