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Gay New Orleans Politician Makes Run Off

New Orleans - After beating sixteen other candidates in the primary election, Louisiana's first openly gay politician, Larry Bagneris, Jr., will face Jacquelyn Brechtel Clarkson, a well financed conservative candidate in the March 3rd run off for a hotly contested New Orleans City Council seat.

Bagneris is a New Orleans native who has been active in gay politics nationally as well as in Houston where he was once a resident.

He is a former Board member of the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force and of the Gay Rights National Lobby. He served on the planning board of the first March on Washington in 1979. In 1980 he was the first openly gay delegate from Texas to the National Democratic Convention.

Success in the primary was due in large part to the grass roots efforts of local gay political groups, and the political arm of the NOW chapter. Bagneris has been a long supporter of choice for women.

Lesbian Mother Wins Court Case

Austin - "S", one of the mothers that the Mother's Legal Defense Fund in Austin was established for, recently won her case against her ex-husband. He was denying her visitation rights to her seven year old daughter, which was in contempt of their child custody agreement.

Egyptian Leader Calls for Death for All "AIDS Infected" People

From the New York Native - One of Egypt's leading theologians has stated that all people living with AIDS should be killed "to stop them from harming the many members of society." According to Rites of Canada, Abdullah al-Mashad, who is head of the Fatwa Committee of Al-Azhar University of Cairo, an influential religious body which rules on important social issues in Egypt, has declared that people with AIDS should be denied food, water, and medical treatment, saying: "We must purge society of the AIDS patient and those like him, because his existence causes public harm." Texas Lesbians to Gather in San Antonio

The San Antonio Lesbian Community will host the 3rd Annual Texas Lesbian Conference (TLC) May 18-20 at the Menger Hotel in downtown San Antonio. The conference theme is *Lesbians in the 90's: Speaking Out*, and is being cosponsored LISA (Lesbian Information San Antonio) and ELLAS, a statewide network of latina lesbians.

Keynote speakers will include Letitia Gomez, co-chair of LLEGO (Latino/a Lesbian Gay Organization, a national organization located in Washington, D.C.; Joan Nestle, founder/curator of the Lesbian Herstory Archives in New York City and author of <u>Restricted</u> <u>Country</u>; and Ivy Young of the National Lesbian Gay Task Force, also headquartered in Washington, D.C.

In addition to keynote speakers and a variety of workshops, the conference will feature a lesbian art exhibit and lesbian film festival. The conference is held annually in Texas to provide a forum for lesbians to gather in a cooperative spirit for networking, the exchange of ideas, and the promotion of community.

Discrimination Survey Needs Participants

Austin - The Lesbian/Gay Issues Committee of the Texas Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers (NASW) is gathering information about discrimination faced by lesbians and gay men in Texas. The information will also be shared with organizations advocating antidiscrimination ordinances within their own communities.

NASW is particularly interested in discrimination in adoptions, foster care and child custody issues. We hope to use the information collected to advocate for statewide policies prohibiting discrimination against lesbians and gay men in this area. Participation in the project is highly confidential. Latin American Conference Moved Due to Violence

The Lesbian Feminist Group of Costa Rica, Las Entendidas, will be hosting the 2nd Latin American and Carribbean Lesbian Feminist Conference in San Jose, Costa Rica, April 11-13, 1990. The conference was originally scheduled for Lima, Peru, but GALF, the Lesbian Feminist Self-Knowledge Group decided not to host the conference due to violence against gays and lesbians and political instability in Peru.

Both left and right wing groups in Peru

have been attacking alternative social movements such as feminists and homosexuals.

The recent assasination of feminist leader Consuelo Garcia and death threats against two other feminists caused GALF to fear for the safety of conference participants.

The reports of the murder of nine gay men in Tarapoto, Peru, under the pretext of a moralizing action, by an armed group who proclaimed their purpose to be the elimination of drug addicts, prostitutes and homosexuals, became the final influence, causing the Organizing Commission to withdraw their plans to host this conference in Peru.

I really hate to say anything to either one of them. I don't want to hurt anyone's feelings. I really like her sister, and I know she's going through arough time right now. I would just like to have my house and my lover to myself every now and then. I don't think it's too much to ask, but I don't know how to start.

Dear Crowd,

Start by mentioning to your lover that you "are never alone any more". Bring it up when you are alone — first thing in the morning perhaps. Gauge her reaction to this statement. It is your lover's responsibility to say something to her sister, not yours. She is probably also missing your time alone, but hasn't mentioned it for fear of hurting or offending her sister.

You might try introducing "Sis" to some of your friends. After six years in a relationship, she may not know anyone socially except the two of you. Don't try to "fix her up" with a date that could backfire. What she needs now are friends.




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Social & Psychological Theories On Homosexuality Through The Ages Psychological and societal views on homosexuality have obviously changed throughout the ages. There have been eras of acceptance, ages of witchhunts and times of indifference. Among the different views have been a variety of interesting theories on what causes homosexuality and how it could be "cured". These theories range from the mundane to the outrageous. Below, we will give you a little taste of some of these theories as presented by science writer, Keay Davidson of the San Francisco Examiner. This examination of homophobia through the ages was first published in the San Francisco Examiner's Gay In America series in June of 1989.

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Middle Ages:

"The famous surgeon William of Bologna ... attributed lesbianism to a growth emanating from the mouth of the womb and appearing outside the vagina as a pseudopenis," according to sociologist David E. Greenberg's book "The Construction of Homosexuality."

13th Century:

Scholastic thinker Albert of Magnus suggests that a powder prepared from the fur of a hyena and applied to the

anus would cure a patient of desire for sodomy," according to Greenberg.

19th Century:

Scottish Physician Robert Macnish claims to have explained homosexuality via the pseudo-science of phrenology, which holds that one's personality is related to the shape of one's skull.


Lote 19th Century: Some doctors advocate castrating or vasectomizing homosexuals as genetic "degenerates" who shouldn't reproduce.

Turn of the 20th Century:

Sigmund Freud expresses views on homosexuality to some kind of inhibited emotional development. On the other hand, he denies it is a "sickness" and says the "causes" of heterosexuality are no less mysterious than those of homosexuality.

1930s:

Psychoanalysts take a dimmer view. One writes that the homosexual, by not



reproducing, is "trying to extinguish the race." Hence "society would be justified in ... taking steps against him."

Mid-20th Century:

Scientists suspect homosexuality might be "caused" by variations in sex hormones. During World War II, psychiatrists take soldiers' urine samples seeking to detect hormonal differences between gays and straights. According to a 1947 issue of Newsweek, in some cases the tests "showed a higher degree of estrogen (female hormones) than androgens (male hormones), just the opposite of a normal man. But this test was too uncertain and too expensive to try on every inductee."

1940s & 1950s:

Colorful New York pshycoanalyst Edmund Bergler argues that male homosexuality is "caused" by an infant's failure to get enough milk from its mother's breast. Upset, the child grows into an adult who unconsciously seeks revenge against women by having sex with men.

1950s:

Famed computer pioneer Alan Turing is convicted of homosexual acts in England. The court orders "treatment" including injections of female hormones. Later Turing commits suicide by biting into a poisoned apple.

1950s & 1960s:

Media warns parents to keep an eye out for signs of homosexuality in their kids. In 1966 Parents Magazine runs an article by New York Medical College psychoanalyst Irving Bieber, who says a mother may promote homosexual tendencies in her son. This mom "may be overly occupied with (her son's) manners and appearance... She probably spends too much time in his company ... She holds her husband in contempt and usually dominates him ..."

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



This month, T. Sumner Reviews:

Wilderness Trek

We'll start this month with a first novel from a Texas author. <u>Wilderness Trek</u> by Dorothy Tell (Naiad Press, Inc., \$8.95) is an engaging tale of eight women who set out on a two week trek into the Ozark mountains.

The group includes: Kay and her life partner, Ray, the guides on the trek; Lu and Desiree, lovers of twelve years who face a life changing revelation during the trip; Poppy Dillworth who's lover, Irma, recently died; Marcie, an Austin school teacher who is trying to become a South American missionary; and Jane and Ramona, two conventional women whose passions are awakened when they become tentmates.

All of these women are very different, but their trek will bring them closer in ways they never imagined. In some ways, this is the same old "coming out" story that has been told dozens of times, but it has one difference — Poppy Dillworth. Her character brings the entire story to life. Her gruff manner and determination give <u>Wilderness</u> Trek a tinge of black comedy.

Ms. Tell is currently at work on another book starring Poppy. <u>Murder at Red</u> <u>Rook Ranch</u> will be out soon, and if it is as good as <u>Wilderness Trek</u>, it will be a good one!

Not only was this a very enjoyable book, I enjoyed reading about locales I am familiar with. Most of the women in this tale are from Texas, and the cities of Dallas and San Antonio figure prominently in the story. I commend Ms. Tell on her first novel.

Moving on, we'll take a look at a novel from the darker side. <u>Virago</u> by Karen Marie Christa Minns (Naiad Press, In., \$8.95) revolves around lovers Manilla and Ginny. These two have only each other to rely on as their world is turned upside down by events beyond their control.

Unbeknownst to them, they are being watched by Darsen, a creature thought to live only in legend. Darsen has chosen Ginny to be her next "companion" — and Darsen always gets what she wants. You see, Darsen is a vampire ... a very powerful vampire. Also involved in Manilla and Ginny's lives is Professor Slater, the new head of the Anthropology Department at Manilla's school. Slater has been having strange hungers ever since her experiences with Darsen while on a research expedition in an Amazon jungle.

Professor Slater is determined to rid the world of Darsen forever, and she and Manilla set out to do just that. They are Ginny's only hope.

<u>Virago</u> is a strange and exotic tale. The dark sensuality and underlying fear will leave you breathless. It is definitely one lesbian vampire tale I would recommend to anyone.

From 1962 to 1979:

West German physicians try to "treat" about 30 gay men by performing brain surgery on them, according to Greenberg's book. Their goal: to eliminate the part of the hypthalamus where doctors believe a "female center" is located.

1970s:

Psychological research indicates gays are no more or less innately prone to mental disturbance (e.g., phychosis) than straights. A study by UCLA phsychologist Evelyn Hooker finds no psychopathological difference between non-patient homosexuals and heterosexuals.

1972:

The American Psychiatric Association votes to drop its designation of homosexuality as a mental disorder. The American Psychological Association follows suit the next year. longer try to "cure" homosexuality but try instead to treat homophobia.

Although discrimination is still to be found among mental health providers, it is much less severe than in years past. Twenty years ago it was almost impossible to find a sympathetic straight therapist, musch less an admitted gay or lesbian therapist. Now there are major organizations consisting of nothing but lesbian and gay psychologists and psychiatrists. This, in itself, shows the acceptance we have gained in the mental health professions.

As Brian Gladue, a researcher from the University of North Dakota is quoted as saying in the San Francisco Examiner, "... if we assume heterosexuality is 'natural' then why not homosexuality?"




