#### Hate Crimes Phone Line In Operation

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Victims of homophobia and racism can now have their voices heard at the federal level. New legislation calls on the Justice Department to collect statistics on hatemotivated crimes including homophobia. The number to call to report hatecrimes is 1-800-347-HATE.

The passage of the Hate Crimes Bill represents a "first" in many areas: the first time lesbians and gay men have been specifically referenced in federal legislation; and the first time a delegation of lesbians and gay men have been invited to attend the President's signing of a law.

#### International March Planned for Houston Economic Summit

HOUSTON - The Miami Based Organization CURE AIDS NOW (CAN) has announced plans for an International March and Rally in downtown Houston during the International Economic Summit.

The purpose of the march is to make world-leaders more aware of the devastating effects of the AIDS epidemic throughout the world.

The Economic Summit represents the only time in recent years that this many world leaders will be gathered together in a U.S. city. In addition, Houston will host over 15,000 media personnel and thousands of other concerned citizens

from around the world.

The objectives of the March are: an adoption of a set of universal laws to provide protection against discrimination for persons with AIDS/HIV and other physically and mentally challenged persons; creation of a global medical/scientific research organization; and, a commitment from our world leaders to relegate 18 billion dollars to cure AIDS now.

The March and Rally will be held on Sunday, July 8th. The March begins at Texas and Smith streets and the rally will be held at city hall. For more information contact the Houston Chapter of CURE AIDS NOW at (713) 529-2898

#### Western Union Takes On Gay Rights Law

SAN FRANCISCO, CA - Western Union, the telegraph giant, has launched an attack against local laws that protect lesbians and gays from discrimination. Armand Ertag, a former Western Union executive in San Francisco charged the firm with harassment and intimidation based on his sexual orientation. Rather than denying the charge, Western Union is arguing that the city's gay rights law is unconstitutional, claiming only the state government can enact anti-discrimination legislation.

The case is now winding its way through the courts. If Western Union is successful, gay rights advocates see a potential domino effect, state by state.

According to the Human Rights Campaign Fund (which will no longer use the communications firm to deliver its "Speak Out" constituent messages), "What Western Union is doing presents a greater threat to the rights of lesbian and gay Americans than any other corporate action in recent memory."

#### Two Jehovah's Witness Groups To Meet In Houston

HOUSTON - The leaders of two national support networks for gay and

lesbian ex-Jehovah's Witnesses have announced plans for their 1990 conference.

Reach Out! of Portland Oregon, will host a one-day conference on Saturday, August 25 and the members of "A Common Bond" of Pittsburgh will meet on Saturday, September 15.

Unlike some religions who condemn homosexuality but welcome the homosexual, Jehovah's Witnesses tolerate neither. Besides gays and lesbians, this strict religious order excommunicates, or disfellowships, thousands of Witnesses each year for offenses ranging from tobacco usage to open disagreement with the sect's doctrines. Witnesses who wish to remain in good standing with the faith — including family members — are required to shun all those who are disfellowshipped.

Dan Restid, founder of "A Common Bond" says, "Jehovah's Witnesses are a relatively small group compared to other religions. The disfellowshipped gays and lesbians are few and far between. Our two groups have instilled a sense of belonging to two-hundred disfellowshipped gays and lesbians. We are no longer alone."



#### DEAR AGNES

Answers to your questions about love, relationships & personal problems

#### Dear Agnes,

My lover of six years has recently gone wild with her credit cards. I can't really recall when it first started happening, but she is out of control. She knows no limits — no pun intended.

At first we would go out to eat two or three times a week at really expensive restaurants and Ann would pull out a card to pay for dinner. I really didn't think much about it. Then there were gifts for me and various members of her family. I don't mean little "I'm thinking of you gifts", I mean fifty to one hundred dollar apiece gifts.

This behavior has been going on for a while, but it has become worse over the last six to eight months.

Ann has never handled her money this way. She was always very responsible, paid her bills on time, and used credit cards very conservatively. In fact, she always insisted the bills be paid off at the the end of each month.

But now! Well let me put it this way, the Visa bill came the other day and it was \$3,515 and I nearly died when I saw it. Two days later the Discover bill came in the mail and the balance on it was \$1,500. I am afraid what will arrive tomorrow. I really had no idea this thing with her credit was getting so out of hand.

Ann makes good money, but she can not keep spending at this rate, we will be broke. We don't have the money in savings right now to pay off our credit cards.

#### Dear To The Limit,

The first approach you should take is talking to her. Let her know you are aware that she has run up all her credit cards to the max. I get the impression you think this situation is none of your business. After six years in this relationship, unless you keep very secret financial arrangements, I would say you definitely should have some input. If you don't say something now, when Ann is so strapped for money that she can't pay her part of the rent or house payment, you will have a different attitude. It may be too late then!

Ask her why she has suddenly stopped paying off her bills at the end of each month. Don't make her defensive, but try to get her to talk about her sudden attitude change toward money. Such a drastic change in behavior could signal a serious underlying problem. If she refuses to talk to you suggest a counselor.

If she will talk, try talking her into cutting up the credit cards. It is the only way to clear this mess up.

# Head For The Cool!

WHETHER IT'S THE MOUNTAINS OR THE OCEAN, WE'VE GOT SOME PLACES FOR YOU TO ESCAPE THE SUMMER HEAT!

Summer is here! Has the heat got you down? Do you long for a cool mountain vista or an ocean breeze? Well, what are you waiting for? Pack your bags and get going. There are plenty of options for the lesbian/gay traveler — and many within a few hour drive.

If it's the mountains you've set your sights on, check out New Mexico. Fly to Albequerque, rent a car and in no time you'll find the altitude rising and the temperatures

dropping. If you prefer to stay in the Albequerque area, the Corrales Inn Bed & Breakfast [(505) 897-4422] may be the place for you. Only 15 minutes from the heart of the city this B&B is in a prime location for day trips both into the mountains and the desert. If Santa Fe is more your style, then the Triangle Inn [(505) 455-3375], 11 miles north of Santa Fe on the road to

If the ocean is more to your liking — head south. South Padre's Lyle's Deck [(512) 761-LYLE] offers private baths, maid service, kitchen facilities and a pool. Women are welcome all the time, but if you want to meet other women, go during the third week and weekend of the month. Further north on the Texas coast is Port Aransas and the Sea Horse Inn [(512)-749-5221]. Located on

# No matter where you choose to stay, you'll have a chance to soak up the local culture as well as the scenery.

Taos might be the ticket. All their guest cottages include a full kitchen and bath. Still further north, in Taos, you'll find the Ruby Slipper [(505) 758-0613]. Located near the "square" in the heart of Taos, the Ruby Slipper offers private or shared baths, standard or water beds and a kiva fireplace or wood-burning stove.

No matter where you choose to stay, you'll have a chance to soak up the local culture as well as the scenery. Art galleries, historical monuments and interesting gift shops are numerous and worth visiting. In most areas, you'll also find fishing, hiking and horse back riding within a short distance.

Check with your host or hostess for names and addresses of local nightspots that cater to lesbians and gays. As locals they will have the inside info.

Although the days in the mountains of New Mexico are warm, the nights in the mountains are usually cool. So, be sure to pack a jacket and a long-sleeved shirt. Mustang Island the Inn features a pool and kitchenettes.

Here again, you should check with your host for local attractions and nightspots. For a little different view of the ocean, check out Olivia Records women's cruises. Olivia's next cruise is a 7-night Halloween (October 28-November 4) Caribbean cruise to San Juan, St. John, Nassau/Blue Lagoon aboard the S.S. Seabreeze, or you can catch the Valentine's cruise (February 11-15, 1991). Also in the works is a possible Alaskan cruise. For more info call 1-800-631-6277.

If you prefer an outdoor experience, there are a variety of organizations that offer wilderness trips for women.

Woodswomen offers outdoor trips all year long. They offer trips all over the U.S. and to a number of exotic locales around the world. They offer a variety of activities including, but not limited to; backpacking, rock climbing, canoeing, snow skiing, bicycling, snorkeling,

# WHAT A WORLD, WHAT A WORLD?

#### SERIOUS ABOUT SUNSCREEN BY NANCY FORD



R-r-r-r-ringgggggggg. Hello?

Hi, Nance. It's me. Well, girl, it's sun day!

You need some more sleep. Today's only Tuesday.

No, not Sunday — it's sun day! Beach day! Let's go to the beach!

Can't. I've got the cramps, and besides, I've got to write an article about skin cancer. But have a good time.

Thanks to example setters like Gidget, the entire cast and crew of *Beach Blanket Bingo* and Louis Reard (Inventor of the bikini), reported incidence of skin cancer has increased 900 percent since the 1930's.

What a coincidence. In the thirties, Ronald Reagan was somewhere in southern California, preparing for a life of acting and tanning, ranching and tanning, and ultimately, politicking and tanning. But, while Ron was searching for his place in the sun (so to speak), his probiscus was developing a bumper crop of one of the most common forms of skin cancer.

Therefore, as yet another special service to all of you out there in WAW, WAW land, the following guidelines are helpful hints for a happy and healthy summer in this hell-like swelterdom we call home.

#### TANNING MYTHS — IF I'M LYIN', I'M FRYIN'

— A "base tan" acquired early in the season will prevent skin cancer. Wrongo. The maximum protective effect of a base tan in sun screen language (see sunscreen decoder in this section) is a factor of "4", meaning the tanner with a base can stay in the sun four times longer than she could with unprotected skin. However, the base tan does little else than hide the redness from that afternoon's fresh burn.

— People of color don't need to fear overexposure to the sun. Wrong again. While this skin contains a higher level of the protective melanin layer, it is not exempt from damage.

—Sunglasses are adequate eye protection from the sun. Strike three, unless those sun glasses are specifically designed to block ultraviolet light. In fact, non-UV treated glasses may actually do more harm than good, inasmuch as darkened lenses allow the pupil to dilate, thereby admitting more harmful rays.

— Tanning salons are a safe, healthy alternative to natural sun. There is much grey (or, more appropriately, beige) area when it comes to the topic of "canned tans". The process used in most tanning salons is based on exposure to UV-A which is a specific wave length of ultraviolet light similar to rays provided by the sun in the early morning and late afternoon. UV-B is a more intense wavelength of ultraviolet light more comparable to mid-day sun and considerably more dangerous. Check with your salon to see which type of light

light treatment it provided. However, it should be noted that most dermatologists do not endorse unprotected exposure to ultraviolet light in any form. Specifically, Dr. Leonard Harber, Director of Dermatology at New York's Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center, states, "The use of high-intensity light sources emitting UV-A for cosmetic tanning should be discouraged.

#### SUN SCREEN DECODER

Most sunscreen applications available on an over-the-counter basis are assigned a number, or sun protection factor (SPF), based on the amount of protection they provide. For example, a lotion or cream with a SPF of 4 allows its user to stay in the sun four times as long as they could with no protection at all. The Skin Cancer Foundation recommends nothing less than an SPF of 15, especially for the face and tender, generally unexposed areas.

Skin types are rated from 1 to 6 according to the intensity of sunburn resulting from 30-45 minutes of sun exposure. Skin type 1 always burns easily, never tanning; skin type 2 burns easily but eventually acquires a minimal tan; skin types 3 and 4 experience minimal to moderate burning, and tan fairly well; skin types 5 and 6 rarely burn and have that George Hamilton look. (Who, incidentally, blends his own brand of tan juice, which is a mixture of aloe, vitamin E, germicide, and PABA with a SPF of 4. Perhaps soon we'll see it on our supermarket shelves next to Paul Newman's spaghetti sauce.)

#### SPF TRANSLATION

- 2 Minimal protection against sunburn and should be used only by those with skin type 6. Never should be used by light complexioned people or children.
- 4 Moderate sunscreen. Recommended for people with skin no lighter than type 5. SPF 4 permits moderate tanning.

6 — "Extra" protection. Should be used with those of skin type 4 or darker. Allows limited, gradual tanning.

8 — "Maximal" sunscreen. Does not actually afford maximum protection since some tanning eventually occurs. Recommended for use by people with skin type 3.

15—"Ultra" protection for those with highly sun-sensitive skin. Permits lengthy stays in the sun and allows tanning to occur very slowly. Especially good for blondes, red-heads, and fair-skinned people.

23 — A relatively new product. Intended to be a complete sun block, it will prevent nearly all ultraviolet rays from reaching the skin.





LESBIANS IN THE ARTS . BOOKS, MUSIC, MOVIES, ETC.



This month we're going to take a look at a very interesting novel and have a little chat with the author. The book is Doc and Fluff; The Distopian Tale of a Girl and Her Biker (Alyson Publications: Boston) and the author is Pat Califia.

Doc and Fluff is an exciting novel set in California sometime in the future. Society as we know it has crumbled and the effects of the drug war, AIDS epidemic and racial strife are in evidence everywhere.

Doc is a tough dyke biker who makes

her living running drugs between the various factions who produce and sell them. Fluff has been the property of a biker gang for some time, and she convinces Doc to help her escape. The book follows their adventures (and their hot, kinky, sometimes violent, sex life) as they are pursued by the gang.

Among other things, the novel addresses serious issues like addiction and domestic violence.

Pat has some interesting comments to make on the writing of this book and we'll share them with you here.

#### Why the switch from erotica to science fiction?

I don't write erotica, I write porn. Doc and Fluff is futuristic fiction, but if you pick it up expecting to be aroused, you won't be disappointed. I'm a big fan of sci-fi, and a couple of the stories in Macho Sluts are science fiction. It's a potentially radical genre that allows the writer to be more imaginative and engage in some forms of social criticisms that mundane fiction doesn't permit. I was curious about what separatist women's communities are going to look like a hundred years from now, what impact the New Christian Right and the AIDS epedemic are going to have on America. Of course, any description of the future is also commentary upon the present. I like that dialect.

Doc And Fluff addresses serious problems like co-dependency, substance abuse, and battery. Why did you raise these issues?

Because they are part of my life and my friends' lives. It's hard to be this queer. We take alot of shit, and it makes us angry. There are only so many ways to deal with being under that much pressure. Sex and drugs and violence are three of them. This is not a book about women's studies. These are

women sstudies. I hese are women who have had to make hard choices if they are going to survive. They will do anything — deal drugs, struggle, fight, hustle their asses on the street, move the mountains and set up their own communities — rather than give up their dyke identities. I honor that tenacity and ingenuity, but I didn't

want to ignore the self-destructive aspects of life on the fringe.

I found <u>Doc and Fluff</u> to be totally enthralling. I couldn't put it down. On top of being one of the most entertaining (and exciting) novels I've read, it also made me stop and think about the consequences of some of things we, and our government, are doing now, that will have a drastic effect on our future.

I really wouldn't want to live in the world Ms. Califia describes, but it was certainly interesting to visit there for a while.


I would love to see a sequel, but I'll let Ms. Califia have the last word on that:




