# Maxey Resigns

AUSTIN - In an effort to devote more time to his new job, recently elected State Representative Glen Maxey will step down as Executive Director of the Lesbian Gay Rights Lobby of Texas (LGRL). He submitted his letter of resignation to the LGRL Board at its May 4th meeting in Austin. The Board expects to bring Maxey on as an ex-officio member at its July meeting.

For four years Maxey has worked for repeal of the state's "anti-homosexual conduct" law (section 21.06 of the Penal Code) and promotion of AIDS legislation for funding and community-based programs. He also worked in coalition with CHOICE activists on legislation affecting a woman's right to choose abortion.

Maxey was elected State Representative from District 51 in south Austin on March 6 in a special election that was called after Governor Ann Richards appointed Representative Lena Guerero to the Railroad Commission. Following his election, Maxey requested a ruling from the Legislative Legal Council to determine in what capacity he could stay on with the Lobby. The council ruled that he was well within the law if he maintained an administrative position, the only restriction being lobbying.

As the first openly-gay elected state official, Maxey says his decision to

leave the Lobby was not an easy one. but that several things finally convinced him it was a necessary and positive step. On a personal level, he said he struggled with burnout and realized there simply weren't enough hours in the day for him to do both jobs. Maxey also says that while current Texas law allows him to have a paid position with the Lobby, new ethics legislation currently being written by the Legislature will likely change that law when it goes into effect in September. Maxey emphasized to members of the LGRL Board that it is crucial for the Lobby to maintain a sense of propriety, and in fact to be a leader on the ethics issue. Maxey's departure leaves the Lobby under the direction of Lobbyist Laurie Eiserloh.

# Hotline Established To Free Sharon Kowalski

MINNESOTA - A national "Let Sharon Kowalski Come Home" hotline has been established by a coalition of organizations to pressure Minnesota Governor Arne Carlson to intervene on behalf of Sharon Kowalski. Each call to the 800 number will generate a letter to Governor Carlson, demonstrating the level of national outrage surrounding this case and the the recent decision.

Judge Cambell's April 24 decision denying Karen Thompson guardianship of Kowalski has spurred outrage from disabled and lesbian and gay rights activists. Despite overwhelming testimony by medical professionals that Kowalski's interests would be best served by moving her home to St. Cloud to live with Thompson, Campbell awarded guardianship to a "neutral third party," Karen Tomberlin, a friend of Kowalski's family. In response to the court's decision, Thompson's attorney has initiated the appeal process.

The hotline number is 800-325-6000, ID #9860. The charge for each call is \$6.25. The charge for the call will pay for the letter to Governor Carlson, and a portion of the funds generated will go to the Karen Thompson Defense Fund.

# NOW Demonstrating to Overturn Gag Rule

NEW YORK - A march and rally will highlight the National Organization for Women's 1991 National Conference in New York City July 5-7. Thousands of feminists from around the country will mobilize at the New York Hilton to rally in support of legislation that would overturn Bush Administration regulations upheld in the recent Supreme Court decision Rust v. Sullivan, which deny a woman who uses a federally funded health clinic any information on abortion, even if her pregnancy endangers her life or health.

Activists at the Conference will also debate NOW's policies and priorities for the coming year. Hot topics will

include violence against women, civil rights, and recent abortion legislation. The march will step off at the New York Hilton at noon on Saturday, July 6th and culminate in a rally at Grand Army Plaza at the Southeast corner of Central Park, Dr. Irving Rust, the plaintiff in the recent Supreme Court case, Eleanor Smeal, President of the Fund for the Feminist Majority, and other noted speakers and performers will address the crowd. Activists will be encouraged to mobilize political pressure on Congress in support of Legislation to overturn the gag rule. This is part of a coordinated national campaign by a coalition women's rights, women's health, free speech and medical groups.

# Lesbian/Gay Health Concerns To Be Addressed at Louisiana Conference

NEW ORLEANS - The largest national conference concerning lesbian and gay health issues is expected to draw over 1,500 attendees when the 13th National Lesbian and Gay Health Conference convenes in New Orleans on July 24-28.

This year's Conference will feature more than 225 presentations dealing with issues such as: volunteer management, lesbian and gay health, mental health, substance abuse, and lesbian and gay youth issues.

Hilda Hidalgo, PhD, Professor of Public Administration and Social Work at Rutgers University and author of <u>Les-</u> bian and Gay Issues; A Resource Manual for Social Workers will present seminars about mental health, including "Coming Out".

Other conference presentations will be led by Jim Graham, Administrator of Whitman-Walker Clinic; Richard Isay, MD, Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at Cornell Medical College and author of Being Homosexual; Gay Men and Their Development; Dan Bross, Executive Director of the AIDS Action Council; and Tim McFeely, Executive Director of the Human Rights Campaign Fund. Ellen Ratner, Board Member of the

National Lesbian and Gay Health Foundation which co-sponsors the conference with the George Washington University Medical Center, said, "This annual meeting brings together health care professionals and community leaders from around the world. Participants are often on the front lines of AIDS research, treatment and care. Our conference provides a forum for the exchange of ideas, information, and technical support for all providers of health care to the lesbian and gay community."



# BABY BOOM

THE STORY OF NIKKI AND HOW SHE CAME TO BE.

AS TOLD TO TASHA SUMNER



We sit down in the living room among a sea of toys. Nikki is fascinated with the buttons on my tape recorder. She giggles and gurgles as she plays with the buttons and pulls on the cord.

Nikki is the secondary subject of this article. She is a beautiful nine monthold girl with brown hair and the biggest blue eyes you've ever seen. The real subject here is how Nikki came to be. Her mother, Cindy, was artificially inseminated, and she is going to tell you (in her own words) what that entails.

I had been thinking about this for about ten years. When I started to get close to thirty-five, I realized I needed to "do it" before the risks got too great. I had talked about this alot and my partner, Jean, said, "You should go ahead and do it — you won't be happy if you don't." So I decided to at least look into it. Jean did let me know from the very start that she did not went to be the main caretaker. It was my dream to have a child, not hers. Although she loves Nikki and has a great time with her, she is not the primary caretaker.

If Jean had had a brother, we would have used him as a donor. We also talked about having a friend donate the sperm, but most of the men we know are gay, and the risk for AIDS was just too great. (In fact, one friend we had considered has since died of AIDS). Plus, I didn't want anybody who could claim custody or anything like that.

I went to Dr. Jones\* (who was my doctor already). Because she is a woman and a single parent herself, I felt like she would be understanding and a good place to start.

She was very receptive, even though she had never done artificial insemination before. She asked me questions about my stability, and after we talked, she decided I would be a good parent and helped me get started. She went and talked to another doctor who had done artificial insemination, and we started looking for sperm banks.

The first place we checked was with the sperm bank at the Texas Tech Health Sciences Center here in Lubbock, We were told that they wouldn't inseminate unmarried women so that left the out. Dr. Jones got a pamphlet from the other doctor on the California Cryobank. The pamphlet told about their screening proces, and we decided to go with them.

They use frozen sperm which means they can check the donor for AIDS and go back and check him again in six months, before they release the sperm. This means they are alot more accurate than sperm banks who use fresh sperm and can only test the donor once. They also do extensive screening for alot of other health problems.

After we had chosen the sperm bank, they sent me and the doctor some forms to fill out, After they received my forms, they sent me a catalog of donors every month. The catalog gives the donor number, ethnic origin, hair color, eye color, height, weight, body type, how many years of schooling, major interests and age. From that you pick four or five that sound interesting, and they send you a more complete profile that details their family health history (including the cause of death of any deceased family members), as well as a more complete description of the donor. At the time I became pregnant, the sperm cost about \$165 (from this sperm bank) and another \$65 to ship.

After they've sent the detailed descriptions, you pick one or two that you think you want to use. It's best to pick two so that you have a backup in case they're out of the one that you want.

One thing that is scary is you don't get

to see what the donor looks like. You don't know what their facial features are. You don't know if they've got a big nose or ears that stick out. I really didn't think about that until after I was pregnant. I know it really doesn't matter, but you do want your child to have everything.

While all this was going on, I had to keep detailed records of my temperature. I had to take my temperature every day and chart it to find out when I was ovulating. I kept records for five months before I even tried to inseminate the first time. There is usually only a fortyeight hour period when you are fertile during the month, so you want a pretty good idea of when you are ovulating or it can get very expensive.

When my temperature indicated that I was about to ovulate, I called the sperm

nate me. All I had to do was hold the sperm in my hand until it thawed. Then she checked it under the microscope to make sure it was motile, and used a syringe without the needle on it to inseminate me. I didn't get pregnant any of those times. The fourth time, my ovulation fell on a weekend. I didn't want to skip a month so I ordered the sperm and had Jean inseminate me. Nikki was conceived this time, so I can honestly say "Jean got me pregnant." Miracles do happen!

Nikki's donor was 25 years old with brown wavy hair and green eyes, he's 5'10", 165 lbs. and he's a Russian Jew. He's working towards his Masters in Child Psychology. He is interested in music, sports and movies and is pretty active.

After the insemination, all I had to do

bank and said "Send me my sperm tomorrow", and gave them the donor number. They need twenty-four hours notice and then they send the sperm out overnight UPS. The sperm comes in a styrofoam cooler packed in dry ice. The vial is only about an inch tall and a little bigger around than a pencil. You can have the sperm delivered to your house or to the doctors office.

The first three times, I took the sperm to the doctors office and had her insemiwas wait and see if my period came. After the fourth time I knew I was pregnant almost immediately. I was so in tune with my body that I noticed all the changes. Within a week my breasts had gotten sore and I had a numb feeling in my abdomen. When my period was late, I went and had a pregnancy test, and it was positive!

Within a month everything changed. I got sick in the afternoon and evening instead of in the morning. My breasts

got larger. I had to urinate constantly. I got just enough of a paunch so that none of my pants fit (I didn't get big so that I looked pregnant, but none of my clothes fit). Later on I lost the curl in my hair and my skin got splotchy. Everything in my body was going to take care of the baby. I didn't want to eat the whole nine months. I only gained 15 pounds during the pregnancy. I started to really look pregnant about the fifth or sixth month. Alot of people would ask about the father. If I wanted to, I told them I had been artificially inseminated, if not, I just told them I wasn't married and they dropped the subject. It was really neat during the delivery because there were only women in the room, Jean, my mom, my sister and the doctor were all there for the birth. Nikki was born on August 26th and weighed 7lbs. 9oz.

Everything worked out great at work. I managed to get a position where I work at home. I had to take a cut in pay, but it's worth it because it allows me to stay home with Nikki, and I get to keep all my benefits. I would like to go back to school and get my teaching certificate, so that I can be on the same schedule as Nikki when she starts school.

My family was very supportive. They have known I was gay since I was 22. My mother was really excited, especially when we found out it was going to be a girl. Nikki is the only female grandchild she has. My dad didn't approve. He never even mentioned the fact that I was pregnant. Even in the ninth month, it was like he didn't notice I was pregnant. He would come and

visit her when she was real little and say all the right things, but you could tell he wasn't really connected to her. Then when she was about four months old, he came in and said "hi" to her and she smiled at him, and you could see him melt. Ever since then she's been PaPa's little girl. My sister was great from the very start, she's always been supportive of me.

If I was going to give any advice, it would be to take a look at your life and make sure you are in a situation that you can do this. Your life will change completely. It's expensive and the responsibility is twenty-four hours a day. Your life will be planned around the baby for quite awhile. If you feel certain you can handle it, and it is what you really want, do it.!



# LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

An Overview of the Recent Session of the Texas Legislature

On May 27th at midnight, the 72nd session of the Texas Legislature ended. This has been a victorious session for the Lesbian and Gay community. We defeated house bill 2509, sponsored by Rep. Clemons (D-Pollock), that would have criminalized persons living with HIV infection and undercut all of our past policy successes. We defeated house bill 2448, sponsored by Rep. Carona (R-Dallas), and House Bill 1362, sponsored by Rep. Hartnett (R-Dallas). Both of these bills dealt with mandatory testing of health care workers. We defeated House Bill 238, sponsored by Rep. Ovard (R-Dallas), which would have criminalized persons suspected of exposing fire fighters and police officers to the AIDS virus

But most importantly, we defeated House Bill 702, sponsored by Rep. Ron Wilson (D-Houston). This bill would have caused HIV positive doctors and dentists to lose their licenses. It would have made it possible for doctors and dentists to refuse to treat HIV positive

patients, which in turn, would have led to a shortage of doctors to treat those living with HIV. This bill would have also opened the door for other oppressive legislation and more mandatory testing.

The defeat of House Bill (HB) 702 was a big task, and we, as a community, must congratulate ourselves for our organization, political acumen and perseverance. Consider what we had against us. Some of the state's major lobbies supported this bill. Ron Wilson, the bill's sponsor, is one of the most powerful politicians at the capitol and other politicians besides Wilson were pushing for the passage of this bill. Also, you may recall the press attention that mandatory testing of health care workers has received in the past months. Two Florida dentists and several hospitals have been in the news because of health care related HIV transmission of HIV. One of the networks did an opinion poll and stated that over 80% of all Americans support mandatory testing. The

odds were definitely against us.

Fortunately, Lieutenant Governor Bob Bullock supported us in our battle against HB702. Even when the bill was on the intent calendar, ready to be called, Lieutenant Governor Bob Bullock stood steadfastly by, in the face of tremendous political pressure, and supported our community by refusing to call the bill for a hearing on the senate floor. Something that we must understand as a community is that the support of someone like Bob Bullock does not exist in a political vacuum. All of you who worked in his campaign, educated him about lesbian and gay issues and who donated money to his campaign deserve thanks. When the passage of HB

calls and telegrams of those who had worked so hard in the Bullock cam-

702 seemed almost inevitable, the phone

paign really paid off.

As for the good bills that the LGRL introduced, we are disappointed that none of them passed. It has always been difficult for the lesbian and gay community to pass positive legislation. This session has been particularly difficult because of a conservative backlash caused by the election of Ann Richards, Bob Bullock and Rep. Glen Maxey. (Maxey is the first openly gay person to be elected to the Texas Legislature.) We may see some changes next session. Rep. Maxey's presence in the House is a constant educational experience for legislators. Because of the homophobic remarks against Maxey, legislators are witnessing first hand discrimination, against a gay person who is also their peer. Those who care about other forms of discrimination, but perhaps never understood homophobia, are beginning to stand up for gay and lesbian issues. By next session, I predict that we will have several new supporters of gay and lesbian issues in the Texas House.

The Texas Legislature meets every two years, however, the Governor plans to call several special sessions in the interim. The first of these special sessions will be in July to discuss the state budget. Our issue in this first special session will be funding for high risk insurance pools benefitting persons living with HIV. Also, I plan to push for a state resolution asking the Center for Disease Control to redefine AIDS so that women, who have different opportunistic infections than men, will receive the same benefits that men receive.

Again, I would like to congratulate the gay and lesbian community for a job well done. All of you who worked so hard for the Richards and/or the Bullock campaign — your time, your money and most importantly, your vote really paid off this session.





# Murder By Tradition

We will start this month with the latest in Katherine V. Forrest's Kate Delafield mystery series.

Murder By Tradition centers around the death of Teddie Crawford, a restaurant owner and caterer. Teddie is found dead from multiple stab wounds in the kitchen of his restaurant. The suspect in the murder claims that Teddie made homosexual advances towards him and threatened him with knife if he didn't comply. Kate isn't convinced.

With every step in the investigation, Kate is more convinced that Teddie was killed deliberately.

No one in the Police department is especially interested in pursuing a case that involves a dead gay man, so Kate is left to investigate on her own.

During the trial, Kate is threatened with exposure of her sexual orientation by the defense attorney, a one time friend of Kate's dead lover.

Kate's current love is more and more frustrated with Kate's reclusiveness during the course of the case.

Murder By Tradition is a continuance of Katherine V. Forrest's excellence in lesbian literature. The plot is riveting and the characters, as usual, are expertly drawn. This books differs from past efforts, in that much of the focus is on the trial process and not totally on the investigative work. The mystery is in how the murder happened, not who did it.

One truly endearing facet of Kate Delafield, LAPD homicide detective, that sets her apart from other detectives in lesbian mysteries is her closetedness. In real life, we can't all be "out" to everyone who crosses our path and Kate's reticence about admitting her lesbianism on the job makes her seem much more real.

This, like all of Ms. Forrest's work, should be on everyone's must read list.

Next, we'll look at <u>Benediction</u> by Diane Salvatore. Grace is a junior at Immaculate Blessing Academy for Girls in Queens, New York. The story opens with Grace and her best friend Anne at a spiritual retreat for their class. Anne is driving Grace up the wall with all her talk about "how far" she will go with her boyfriend. Before too long, something happens that makes them both forget talk of boys for awhile. They overhear two seniors, Linda and Joan, arguing about the state of their love affair.

They are caught listening at the door and the two seniors explain that they were only practicing for a play with Linda playing the male role. Anne buys the explanation, but Grace isn't so sure. The incident stays in the back of her mind when they return to the school. When the next school year begins, Grace

meets Meg, and her entire life is turned upside down. Grace's home life and her relationship with Anne begin to feel the strain as she becomes more and more involved with Meg. While things with Meg get more heated, Grace's boyfriend, Glen, begins to place more and

more sexual pressure on her.


Benediction is easily the best "coming out" novel I have ever read. The writing is beautiful, giving the story a gauzy feel — like a distant memory coming back into focus.

Even if you never attended Catholic school, I'm sure that you, like me, will find elements of your own story in Benediction. Grace's profound sense of discovery (and fright at her 'differentness') in her relationships with both Meg and Glen should be familiar to most members of the lesbian community,

This is the first novel of Diane Salvatore, and I hope there will be many more to come. Benediction is destined to be a classic and I strongly suggest that everyone read it.




