Upon motion the President action in the above matter was approved.

Upon motion an addition to Medical Building was authorized constructed by the University Carpenter at an estimated cost of \$600.00, same being recommended by President Boyd.

Upon motion President D R Boyd and Dr G W Sutton President Bd of Regents were authorized to attend the National Conference of Trustees of American Colleges and Universities to be held at Urbana Ills. commencing on Oct 17-1905. Regent R E Wood was also elected Alternate to attend said meeting in event Dr. Sutton was unable to attend.

The Secty laid before the Regents letter received from Dr E T Bynum, of the Department of French and German, presenting his views upon the matter of the action of the Regents at the June meeting in not raising his salary to 1800.00 per annum to rank with salaries of the Heads of the other University Departments, basing his claim for such advances upon a verbal contract to that effect with President D R Boyd.

After considering the matter thoroughly, the Regents decided that it was impossible for various reasons to reconsider at this time their action in the matter of fixing salaries for the year, much to their regret in this particular case, and the Secretary was directed to advise Dr. Bynum to said effect and to assure him that it was the sense of the Board that should he remain in the service of the University after the present school year his salary would be fixed at 1800.00 per annum in accordance with his desire to be placed on an equal footing with the other Professors in the matter of salary.

Upon motion Regents Wood and Larsh were appointed committee to audit accts of Registrar in Presidents Office.
