Bill of Emer & Amend 2391.75 was ordered paid from the local Chemical Fund of the University office this being for supplies to maintain stock in said Dept.

The Secretary placed before the Regents the resignation of Prof Ernest T Bynum as Professor of the German language in the University, to become effective on July 1-1906.

Upon motion duly seconded and carried Prof Bynum's resignation was accepted to take effect July 1-1906 in accordance with his request, and President Boyd was directed to recommend to the Regents as soon as practicable a suitable person for election to the chair made vacant by said resignation.

Upon recommendation of D R Boyd President of the University, the applications for leave of absence for one year each from Sept 1-1906, without pay, were granted

to the following named members of the Faculty, for purposes of study to further qualify themselves as instructors in the University.

To Prof D C Hall, Director of Physical Culture to attend Rush Medical College

- " Prof Roy Hadsell, Registrar and Instructor in English, to take graduate work in Harvard University.
- ' Prof E C Woodruff, Instructor in Geology, to study in some Eastern College not yet determined upon,

and President Boyd was directed to recommend soon as convenient suitable persons to carry on the work in the several departments during their absence.

President Boyd was also directed to secure a suitable speaker to address the meeting of High School Superintendents to be held at the University on Friday evening Apl 27-1905.

President Boyd submitted to the Regents the recommendations of the University Librarian for the purchase of a bindery plant for the University Library and same was directed to lie on the table till a subsequent meeting.

The Secretary submitted to the Board Bond of Roy Hadsell as Registrar & Bookkeeper of the University executed in the sum of Five thousand Dollars by the American Surety Company of New York, and upon motion duly seconded and carried same was approved.

The Regents then unanimously adopted a resolution inviting Theodore Roosevelt, President of the United States, to deliver the annual address at the Commencement Exercise to be held at the University in June 1907, and Governor Frank Frantz and President D R Boyd were appointed as a committee to present the invitation to the President.

Upon motion the Secretary of the Board of Regents was authorized to visit Washington DC for the purpose of assisting in securing the enactment of a law granting to the University Sec 36 in Township 9 N of R 3 West, for campus purposes, should his presence there be deemed necessary by the delegate in Congress from Oklahoma, who now has a bill pending in the House of Representatives providing for the granting of said land for the purpose mentioned.
