The resignation of H H McPherson as Instructor in Mechanical and Electrical Engineering to take effect Sept 1-1906, was submitted to the Regents by the Secretary and upon motion duly seconded and carried said resignation was accepted to take effect Sept 1-1906 as specified, and President Boyd was directed to make recommendation of a suitable person for election to the vacancy.

Upon recommendation of Prest Boyd Prof Herman L. Spa was elected to the Chair of German Language and Literature for one year at a salary of 1300.00 commencing Sept 1-1906 with understanding that if his services prove satisfactory to the University and he is retained for second year his salary for second year shall be 1500.00 and if retained for third year he shall receive regular Professors salary.

Upon motion of Regent Douglass $\frac{1}{2}$ President Boyd and the Secty were appointed as a committee to purchase a tent or canopy for the use of the University in holding its Baccalaureate and Commencement exercises on the campus.

Upon recommendation of the President and Faculty of the University the Regents conferred the Degree of Pharmaceutical Chemist up (sic) the following students who had completed courses in Pharmacy viz
