

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION?
Wednesday Afternoon, June 21st, 1911.

The State Board of Education was called to order by the President at 2:35 P. M., June 21st, 1911. All members were present except Mr. Hayes.

President Glover appeared before the Board and recommended the following faculty for the State Preparatory School at Tonkawa.

On motion by Mr. Glen, seconded by Mr. Brandenburg, the recommendation of President Glover was accepted and the faculty elected.
Five voted aye, Mr. Dunlop voted no.

On motion by Mr. Brandenburg, seconded by Mr. Rowsey, President Page was authorized to select men for the two places left vacant in his faculty and recommend them to the Board for its approval. He was also given authority to recommend the necessary subordinate employees for that institution. All voted aye.

President Grumbine of the Northwestern State Normal appeared before the Board and recommended four members on his faculty and one janitor, as follows:

On motion by Mrs. Scott, seconded by Mr. Rowsey, the members were taken up separately.

The name of Miss Crumley was voted upon for the position of Domestic Science. Two voted aye, one voted no. The President declared Miss Crumley elected.

On motion by Mr. Brandenburg seconded by Mr. Rowsey, Mr. Spalding was elected teacher of Manual Training. All voted aye.

The name of W. H. Wood was considered for Director of Training School.

On motion by Mr. Scott, seconded by Mr. Brandenburg, it was agreed that inasmuch as Mr. Wood had been recommended by the President, and charges had been raised against him, he should be given an opportunity to come before the Board to answer these charges.

All voted aye.

On motion by Mr. Brandenburg, seconded by Mr. Rowsey, the Chairman was instructed to appoint a Committee to investigate the record of W. H. Wood while he was connected with the Central State Normal School at Edmond.

All voted aye.

The name of Miss Woodward was then voted upon for the position as Teacher of Piano. Three voted aye, three voted no. Miss Woodward not having received enough votes failed to be elected.

The name of Mr. Valentine was then considered for Janitor.

On motion by Mr. Scott, seconded by Mr. Brandenburg, Mr. Valentine was elected Janitor by acclamation.

Superintendent A. A. Stewart then appeared before the Board and recommended his faculty for the School for the Deaf at Sulphur.

On motion by Mr. Scott, seconded by Mr. Glen, the recommendations of Mr. A. A. Stewart were accepted, providing salaries to be fixed by the Salary Committee, with the exception that the salary of the Physician was reduced to \$50.00 per month and the position of Secretary and Steward were combined at a salary of \$75.00 per month, and the Superintendent was instructed to find and recommend some suitable person for this position. All voted aye.
