
All voted aye.

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION,
Thursday Morning, July 27th, 1911.

The Board was called to order at 10:30 A. M. Thursday, July 27th. Those present were Mr. Glen, Mr. Dunlop, Mr. Brandenburg, Mr. Scott, and Mr. Wilson.

President Lynn Glover of the Tonkawa Preparatory School appeared before the Board and made the following recommendations for his faculty at Tonkawa.

On motion by Mr. Scott, seconded by Mr. Dunlop, the recommendation of President Glover was accepted with the exception of the Head of the Department of English.

All voted aye.

On motion by Mr. Brandenburg, seconded by Mr. Glen, Mr. Rippey was elected to the Department of English, the President to determine whether Mr. Rippey or Mr. Greenfield should be Head.

Four votes were cast for this motion. Mr. Scott cast his vote for Mr. L. J. Barton.

On motion by Mr. Brandenburg, seconded by Mr. Glen, the matter of heating the building of the Tonkawa Preparatory School, of fixing the roof for the same institution, and the adjustment of the steam pipe be referred to the Committee on Buildings and Grounds to be treated by them as seems proper and with the Board of Affairs to take what action is necessary.

On motion by Mr. Glen, seconded by Mr. Brandenburg, the report of President Glover in regard to furniture for the State Preparatory School at Tonkawa was approved and President Glover was given authority to make requisition therefor.

All voted aye.



On motion by Mr. Glen, seconded by Mr. Brandenburg, Mrs. Emma Miller of Weatherford was elected to the position of Critic Teacher in the Southwestern State Normal School upon the recommendation of President Griffith.

All voted aye.

On motion by Mr. Scott, seconded by Mr. Brandenburg, the several Normal School Presidents were authorized to employ such janitors as are necessary for the work, and report to this Board at their earliest convenience.

All voted aye.

On motion by Mr. Scott, seconded by Mr. Brandenburg, the matter of improvements in and about the grounds of the Southwestern State Normal School was referred to the Committee on Buildings and Grounds with authority to make the necessary improvements.

Two voted aye, one voted no.

On motion by Mr. Brandenburg, seconded by Mr. Scott, the report of the Committee on Course of Study for the Normal Schools was accepted.

All voted aye.

On motion by Mr. Brandenburg, seconded by Mr. Glen, Presidents Grumbine, Wilbur, and Griffith, together with the Chairman and Secretary of this Board, were instructed to prepare an outline of the course of study for the State Normals and have them printed.

On motion by Mr. Glen, seconded by Mr. Scott, the matter of devising a uniform system of grading was referred to the sub-committee on course of study -- Presidents Grumbine, Wilbur, and Griffith.
All voted aye.

On motion by Mr. Glen, seconded by Mr. Scott, it was determined that all furniture and other articles made by the Manual Training Departments of the various schools should belong to the school, unless the students pay for the material used therein.
All voted aye.

On motion by Mr. Scott, seconded by Mr. Glen, the fees for instruction in piano music in the State Normal Schools were fixed at 50¢ per lesson, for either twelve or twenty-four lessons per term.
All voted aye.

On motion by Mr. Glen, seconded by Mr. Brandenburg, it was determined that the fees received in the department of piano in the various State Normal Schools be applied on the salaries of the piano teachers, as far as such fees go.
All voted aye.

President Grumbine recommended the following faculty:

On motion by Mr. Glen, seconded by Mr. Scott, Mr. Yeardley was elected Teacher of Manual Training at the Northwestern State Normal School at a salary of \$1200.00 per year.

On motion by Mr. Scott, seconded by Mr. Glen, the consideration of Miss Pyle and Miss Bussey was deferred until the meeting at 9:00 P. M.
