On motion by Mr. Warren seconded by Mr. Glen, the recommendations of candidates for graduation were approved, and the Fresident and Secretary were instructed to approve the graduates of other schools when lists are received.

On motion by Mr. Dunlop seconded by Mr. Warren the Secretary was instructed to write Fres. Glover suggesting that payment of the claim of the War Department should be made from a local fund in his hands.

The request of Fres. E. D. Murdaugh, Chairman of the Council of Normal School Presidents, that the Council be permitted to meet at Edmond, June 10th was read and approved.

Communications were read from Mr. D. Ferrara and Fres. J. H. Bayes of the Iniversity Freparatory School at Claremore, The Secretary was instructed to alswer these communications.

Pres. Stratton D. Brocks of the University was invited to appear before the Board and make his recommendations for the State University. President Scoks made the following recommendations:

You salary of under such indeterminate tenure. If changes are made at any time in your salary or title you will be promptly notified. The right to terminate your appointment on recommendation of the President of the University, subject to approval by the Board of Education, for reasons that seem to be in the best interests of the University, is reserved. If at any time in the future it seems desirable to terminate your appointment notice will be given to you as reasonably long in advance as circumstances will permit.

Communications were read from E. B. Frank offering to purchase land at the University Preparatory School at Tonkawa. A communication was read fra Miss Trilla May Lukes, a student of the School for the Deaf at Sulphur. Communications from Lebanon University, and the Hugo Business College were read and referred to the committee on affiliation, and State High School Inspector.

The claim of the American Surety Company for \$20.95 for issuing bank of W. W. Williams, former financial clerk at the University, was read.

On motion the claim was referred to the Secretary and Mr. Warren for settlement.

The claim of Mr. A. B. Schick for rental of land at the State Home was read, and on motion by Mr. Dunlop seconded by Mr. Rowsey, was approved for \$12.50 All voted ave.

Mr. Brandenburg and Mr. Hayes entered.

A. C. Davis of Shawnee, Architect for the buildings at Fauls Valley, a;peared before the Board and explained his plans for the new buildings at the State Training School.

On motion by Mr. Glen seconded by Mr. Brandenburg, the Fresident appointed the following committees to confer with the architects relative to the plans for the buildings at the three State Institutions where such improvements are cortemplated:

The State Training School, Pauls Valley: Mr. Glen and Mr. Warren. University of Oklahoma, Norman: Mr. Rowsey and Mr. Brandenburg. The State Home, Fryor: Mr. Hayes and Mr. Dunlop.

Noved by Mr. Hayes seconded by Mr. Warren, that any unexpended balance in other available funds of the institutions be used in the general plan of improvement as presented by the architects.

The Board then took up the consideration of the adoption of books for the **Seachers'** Reading Circle for the year 1912-13.

The following agents of publishers appeared before the Board and presented the merits of their publications:

The proposed rules and regulations for the meeting of the State Board of Education as a Text Book Commission were approved, subject to the amendmenta that might be offered by the Attorney General.

Noved by Mr. Glen seconded by Mr. Brandenburg: "Resolved, that the State Soard of Education individually or acting collectively as the Text Book Commission will, under no circumstances, give audience to any attorney speaking in the interest of the adoption of any book or set of books.

Furthermore, the employment by any publisher of any attorney or special respresentative to intercede with members of the Board in the interest of any atoption of text books, apparatus, or supplies will be prejudicial to the interests of such publisher.

All voted aye.

On motion by Mr. Dunlop seconded by Mr. Brandenburg, the Secretary mainstructed to advertise for bids to supply text books, registers, records, man, charts, globes, and other apparatus for the use in all the common schools of Oklahoma.

All voted aye.

On motion by Mr. Wilson seconded by Mr. Dunlop the following resolutint was passed by the State Board of Education:

WHEREAS, Mr. J. Alexander Moore, former President of the Industrial Institute and College for Girls at Chickasha, Oklahoma, has summarily and without a hearing and without presenting the matter to the faculty of the Industrial Institute and College or the State Board of Education expelled for the remainder of the year Mary Harper, Alley Richards, Margaret Beavers, Nell Warford, and Caroline Dawson, members of the Senior Class of the Industrial Institute and College; and whereas, the said J. Alexander Moore having been deposed and refusing to recognize the authority of the said State Board of Education, it is the sense of the Board that a grave injustice has been done these young ladies: That the offense committed by them was trivial and was not of sufficient gravity to warrant such expulsion, and that the Board believes that if students are expelled under such circumstances without a hearing, that it is their duty, by the authority conferred upon them by law, to see that no injustice is done; and they, therefore, order that Mary Harrer, Alley Richards, Margaret Beavers, Nell Warford, and Caroline Dawson be graduated with due honors, and that they be given the diploma of the school, properly certified by the State Board of Education and the

President, after his election and installation, together with Clyde Hart, Anne White, and Mrs. Estill, the other members of the Senior Class.

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Motion put by Mr. Rowsey. All voted aye.
