WINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION Thursday Norning, October 31, 1912.

The State Board of Education met in its rooms in the Mercantile Building at 8:25 o'clock, Thursday morning, October 31st, according to the notice issued October 28th.

The members present were Mr. Wilson, Mr. Dunlop, Mr. Hayes, and Mr. Glen. The members absent were Mr. Cain, Mr. Warren, Mr. Brandenburg.

The matter of the cancellation of the State Life Certificate of J. A. Oakes, Salina, Oklahoma, was taken up.

Mr. Wilson: I will state the case: the charges against J. A. Oakes are that eight years ago he was sentenced to serve a term in the penitentiary for the crime of seduction; the case can be found in the records. He came down here about four years ago and, without any investigation, was granted a certificate to teach in the State of Oklahoma for life. Since then charges of improper conduct have been preferred against him. I have simply annulled the certificate pending the action of the Board. I have talked the matter over with Mr. Cameron and Attorney General Charles West, and they both say that if they had known the character of this man, the certificate should never have been granted.

Mr. Glen: I make a motion that upon the recommendation of Attorney General West, the certificate held by J. A. Oakes of Salina, Oklahoma Mayes County, be cancelled.

Mr. Hayes: Second the motion. All voted aye.

Mr. Wilson: A few days ago, I received a requisition from Mr. Murdaugh asking us to buy fifty dollars worth of potted flowers. I wrote to him that with a Botanist and Agriculturist in that institution, I thought they could grow all the flowers they needed. Do you agree with me in my actions?

Mr. Glen: What you have done is right.

Mr. Wilson: Now, in regard to the biennial report; Mr. Huffman has spent practically six weeks of his time preparing his part of the biennial report. He is to get the reports of the various institutions, then present them to the Board. Mr. Huffman and Mr. Landrum have both been working together. I want to know the desire of the Board in this matter.

Moved by Mr. Hayes, seconded by Mr. Dunlop that the biannial report, after examination, be approved and ordered printed.

Mr. Wilson: In regard to Mr. Gill's appointment, I have explained that to the members of the Board.

Moved by Mr. Glen, seconded by Mr. Hayes, that the appointment of Mr. W. E. Gill as President of the Northeastern State Normal School at Tahlequah, which has been made by the President of the State Board of Education pending the meeting of the said Board, be and is hereby approved.

All voted aye.

Mr. Dunlop offered the following resolution:

Whereas, W. E. Rowsey, C. C. Weith, and David I. Johnston are claiming the right to act as members of the State Board of Education under the pretended appointments attempted to be made by the Governor of the State on October 5, 1912, and as successors of Robert Dunlop, Scott Glen and O. Frank Hayes, members of said Board, duly appointed by the Governor of the State of Oklahoma on the 8th day of April, 1911; and,

Whereas, the said Robert Dunlop, Scott Glen and O. Frank Hayes are de jure members of the State Board of Education under the said appointments, and the said W. E. Rowsey, C. C. Weith, and David I. Johnston have no right as members of the State Board of Education under said pretended appointment;

Therefore, Resolved, that the said Robert Bunlop, Scott Glen, and O. Frank Hayes assert their right to the possession of said offices now held and enjoyed by them and will continue to act as members of said State Board of Education and to perform the duties thereof.

Resolved Further, that the said W. E. Rowsey, C. C. Weith, and David I. Johnston are hereby directed not in any way to interfere with the possession of said Dunlop, Glen and Hayes, and that a copy of this resolution be mailed to each of said persons claiming under said appointments.

Moved by Mr. Dunlop seconded by Mr. Hayes, that the above resolution be adopted.

All voted aye.

The following resolution was read:

Whereas, the duties of the Board of Regents of the State University under the act of the Legislature of the state creating this Board of Education, devolves upon the State Board of Education; and

Whereas, the records and proceedings of said Board of Regents have never been turned over to the State Board of Education, after repeated demands:

Now, therefore, resolved that in order to give to the State Board of Education all necessary information relating to said state institution and the action of the Board of Regents in reference thereto prior to the creation of this Board, that the Board of Regents be, and they are hereby requested to turn over and deliver to the Superintendent of Fublic Instruction as Chairman of the State Board of Education, and for its use, the records of said Board of Regents belonging to said State University.

Which resolution was considered and discussed and on being put to vote was unanimously adopted.

The Board adjourned to Pauls Valley to investigate the charges made by Kate Barnard, Commissioner of Charities and Corrections.
