The State Board of Education met at its office in the Mercantile Building Monday morning, May 26th at nine o'clock. The members present were Messrs. Wilson, Duncan, Duff, Hester, Potterf, and Wikoff. Dr. Fite was absent.

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION Tuesday Morning, May 27, 1913.

The Board was called to order at 9:35 o'clock. All members present.

Pres. Stratton D. Brooks appeared before the Board and presented the following recommendations:

- (1) That the name of the School of Teaching be changed to that of School of Education, to take effect September 1, 1913.
- (2) That a School of Commerce and Industry be established as a subordinate division within the College of Arts and Sciences to begin September 1, 1913, the admission requirements to be two years of college work and the subjects offered in the college of Arts and Sciences by the faculty with the approval of the President of the University.
- (3) That a School of Journalism be established as a subordinate division with the College of Arts and Sciences to begin September 1, 1913, the admission requirements to be two years of college work and the subjects of instruction to be selected from the subjects offered in the Dollege of Arts and Sciences by the faculty with the approval of the President of the University.
- (4) That the salaries paid in the School of Fine arts be based upon the amount and character of work done exclusive of individual leasons and that all fees for individual lessons be collected by the financial clerk acting as the agent for the respective teachers and be paid to the teachers entitled thereto, payment to be made at the end of each menth of the amount earned during that month.

(5) That the plan of payment in Recommendation No. 4 above be applied to the school year 1912-13, and that the direct salaries of the teachers specified below be fixed at the amounts paid prior to April 1, 1913, and that there be paid before the close of the fiscal year from fees collected for individual lessons the amounts severally specified below, being in each case the amount remaining due under the present terms of appointment.
