## WINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION Wednesday Evening, April 1, 1914.

The State Board of Education convened at eight o'clock p. m. in the parlor of the Les-Huckins Hotel. Members present: Messrs. Wilson, Wikoff, Duff, Duncan, Fite, Hester and Potterf.

Pres. Stratton D. Brooks of the State University presented the fellowing recommendations:

1 - (109) State Board of Education, Oklahoma City, Okla. Dear Sirs:

I recommend that Prof. William Peter Haseman attend, at the expense of the University, the meeting of the American Physical Society, on April 24th and 25th at the Bureau of Standards in Washington, D. C., for the purpose of examining and reporting with reference to the desirability and the cost of establishing in the University a bureau of standards. Approved.

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2-(110) I recommend that Prof. Theodore Hampton Brewer, Director of the School of Journalism, attend at the expense of the University, the National Newspaper Conference held at Lawrence, Kansas, May 11-14, 1914. Approved.

3-(11) I recommend that the title of Guy Yandall Williams be changed from that of Associate Professor of Chemistry to that of Professor of Physical Chemistry, to take effect September 1, 1914, and that he be placed upon the schedule for professors not heads of departments, at a salary of \$1900.00, and be regularly advanced in accordance with the schedule. Approved.

4 -(112) I recommend that the following changes in title be made to take effect September 1, 1914:

> Rey Temple House, from Professor of Germanic Languages and Literature to Professor of German; Howard Storm Browne, from Assistant Professor of Pharmacy to Assistant Professor of Nateria Medica. Approved.

5 -(113) I recommend that the monthly salary of the following teachers be fixed for July and For August, at the amount specified in each case, and that their respective salaries, beginning with September 1914, be fixed in accordance with the regular schedule as heretofore established: James Shannon Buchanan \$291.66
