BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA

A meeting of the Board of Regents was held on Tuesday, April 20, 1926, at 2;00 p. m., in the office of the president of the University of Oklahoma, Norman. Oklahoma.

There were present the following members of the Board of Regents: Chairman A. A. McDonald, presiding; Buttram; Schwoerke, Rogers; Carlock and Busby.

The minutes of the meeting held on February 4, 1926, were approved as printed.

The election of officers of the Board for the ensuing year was the next order of business. The name of Judge A. A. McDonald, of Hugo, was placed in nomination for Chairman of the Board and he was unanimously elected by acclamation. The name of Frank Buttram was placed in nomination for Vice-Chairman of the Board and he was unanimously elected by acclamation. The name of Emil R. Kraettli was placed in nomination for Secretary of the Board and he was unanimously elected by acclamation.

At the meeting of the Board on February 4, 1926, the question of religious education in the University was discussed. President Bizzell was directed to go into the matter further with the Administrative Council and the representatives of the denominations and make a report at a later meeting of the Board. The following report was submitted by President Bizzell and approved by the Board.

*Based upon the sentiment expressed in the Board meeting, which is concurred in by my associates here at the university, I submit the following recommendations:

- 1. That on and after the beginning of the scholastic year, 1926-27, the present plan of offering courses in Religious Education on the campus in connection with the School of Education be discontinued.
- 2. That all religious denominations be invited to offer appropriate courses of a non-sectarian character in the Y. M. C. A. building immediately north of the campus.
- 5. That the faculties of the university be authorized to prescribe conditions, set up standards, and determine the amount of credit that may be given for courses in Religious Education offered under the auspices of the several denominations and religious parties.*

APPROVED.

President Bizzell reported that the resident enrolment in the University for the first and second semesters of this year had reached a total of 4,714, making an increase of 427 over the same period for last year. He also reported

that the total receipts from non-resident fees for the current year amount to \$7,750.

The question of requiring all students in the University to pay the infirmary fee was discussed. It was voted to amend the regulation providing that the payment of the fee for students whose residence is in Norman be optional to make it compulsory for all students in the University to pay the fee.

President Bizzell discussed the election of the Dean of the Graduate School and reported that he was not yet ready to make a recommendation but that he hoped to be able to do so at the meeting in June.

"It was voted that no building on the University campus shall be used by any outside individual or organization for the purpose of raising funds for an outside cause and that the further use of any building or buildings be left at the discretion of the president of the University.

The President made the suggestion that the new Class Room Building be named "Liberal Arts Building". This was approved by the Board.
