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President Bizzell submitted for consideration a recommendation by Dr. A. B. Adams, Dean of the School of Business, to organize a Bureau of Business Research to be incorporated and administered through a Board of Trustees. The tentative articles of incorporation and by-laws were also submitted. After some discussion it was voted to approve the plan as outlined.

President Bizzell submitted the following recommendation approved by the Administrative Council on the organization of the five and a half day class schedule:

"We, your committee appointed to report on a plan of scheduling classes on a five and a half day week, recommend that such a plan be adopted for freshman and sophomore classes in Arts and Sciences, to meet the present class room situation, and that we work toward a general scheme covering a five and a half day week.

We recommend to the Arts and Sciences faculty that their schedule for freshmen and sophomore classes be expanded to include a division of the classes having three lecture periods each week into two groups, one given Monday, Wednesday and Friday and one given Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, so far as may be necessary to meet the room situation, five hour classes and two hour classes be scheduled in the afternoon.

We feel that the other schools and colleges offering freshman and sophomore work are already conforming to the plan of scheduling work on Saturday mornings, but that these schools and colleges will be expected to expand their schedules to include more work under the general plan of a five and a half day schedule.

The following resolution was adopted:

"The Administrative Council of the University of Oklahoma is hereby directed to formulate in detail a five and one-half day class program for the University of Oklahoma, making the classroom space conform as nearly as possible to the schedule, which is the primary objective; that this schedule include all schools and colleges comprising the University.

The Board recognizes that it is not a simple matter to fully develop the program, but it is the position of this Board that the primary consideration is the program itself, and the Board expects the Administrative Council, to speedily work out an efficient system.

President Bizzell submitted a recommendation from the Administrative Council concerning the late enrolment fee which provides that the penalty for late enrolment be changed from a fee of \$2 to a scale of fees ranging from \$2 for the first day and increasing \$1 for each additional day, to a maximum fee of \$5; also that the fee for changes in enrolment be changed from \$1 to \$2.

APPROVED.

The following regulation with regard to payment of non-residence fees was approved:

"Tuition is free in all divisions of the University to students who are residents of the State of Oklahoma. Students who are non-residents of the state are required to pay a tuition fee of \$25, for each semester and \$12.50 for the summer session in all schools and colleges except in the School of Medicine, where the non-resident tuition is \$100.00 for each semester.

The burden of registering under proper residence is placed upon the student, and it is the duty of each student at registration, if there be any possible question of his right to legal residence in Oklahoma, under the rules of the Regents, to raise the question with the registration officer and have such question passed upon and settled by the proper authority of the University.

No person shall be considered a resident of Oklahoma for the purpose of registering in the University unless he is a citizen of the United States who has been a bona fide resident of the State for the twelve months next preceding the date of his original registration in the University. The residence of minors shall follow that of the legal guardian but in case a resident of Oklahoma is appointed guardian of a non-resident minor, the legal residence of such minor for the purpose of this rule shall not be considered established in Oklahoma

until the expiration of twelve months after such appointment. The residence of wives shall follow that of the husband. In the case of students whose parents move to Oklahoma and become bona fide residents of the State, such students shall be considered residents of the State.

"No person shall be deemed to have gained or lost a residence in this State while a student in the University."

President Bizzell presented a petition from the management of the "Sooner" University annual, that a fee of \$5 be collected from each student at the time of enrolment to cover the cost of the annual. This request being made on the results of a student election at which time the majority of the votes cast were in favor of such a fee.

It was the sense of the Board that the publishing of the annual was very desirable and that it was worthy of the hearty support of the student body, but that the fee should be made optional. The President was authorized to instruct the financial clerk to place this fee with the regular fees to be collected at the time of registration but that it is to be indicated as an optional fee.

On motion adjourned.
