

BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA

The annual meeting of the Board of Regents of the University of Oklahoma was held in the office of the President of the University at 9:00 a. m., on Monday, March 31, 1930.

The following members were present: Frank Buttram, Chairman; Regents John Rogers, John Carlock, J. C. Looney, Mrs. Addie Lee Lowther, Geo. L. Bowman.

The minutes of the meeting held on Saturday, November 23, 1929, were approved as read.

This being the annual meeting of the Board the election of officers of the Board for the ensuing year was held. The motion of Regent Carlock, that the present officers - Frank Buttram, Chairman; John Rogers, Vice-chairman, Emil R. Kraetli, Secretary - be re-elected, was passed.

President Bizzell made a report with reference to remission of fees in the College of Fine Arts. FELLOWSHIPS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

A number of departments employ college graduates for service on a part-time basis. Graduate assistantships are open to all graduate students, whether candidates for the master's degree or the doctor's degree. Stipends vary according to the nature of the work and the training and experience of the applicant. The highest rate is \$100.00 for each credit-hour of teaching or equivalent service and is paid only when the nature of the work is similar to that of instructors. Usually these appointments are awarded to students who have already rendered a year of successful service as graduate assistants, although they may be awarded to first year students with exceptional records of training and experience. Many appointments are at the rate of \$600.00 or \$700.00 for half-time teaching or equivalent service, the exact stipend depending upon the amount of work. In some cases the work of graduate assistants is of a routine nature and does not demand so much training and experience. In such cases a somewhat lower rate is paid, the yearly stipend varying from \$250.00 to \$500.00.

Usually students holding half-time appointments will find it desirable to spend two years in meeting the requirements for the master's degree. It is possible for a well prepared student teaching three to five hours or the equivalent, to meet the requirements for the degree in one year and a summer session. Those who have made exceptional records during the first year and are especially interested in research should apply for a research fellowship for the second year.

Graduate assistants are excused from the payment of tuition and fees in the major department. The major department, if it chooses, may charge for the cost of materials used. Information with regard to appointments as graduate assistants may be obtained directly from the head of the department in which the student expects to major.

President Bizzell presented for consideration the question of the appointment of Dr. David R. Boyd, as President Emeritus of the University of Oklahoma. It was voted unanimously to appoint Dr. David R. Boyd as President Emeritus of the University of Oklahoma, as of this date - March 31, 1930.

President Bizzell reported that David Logan, of Okmulgee, as agent for L. C. Lichty, had made a compromise proposition to pay \$750.00 toward the obligation of \$1,500 of Mr. Lichty on account of his failure to return to the University following a year's leave of absence under the regulations governing sabbatical leaves. It was voted to accept \$750.00 to satisfy this financial obligation.

President Bizzell reported that the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation, New York, had made a grant of \$3,000.00 to Professor W. S. Campbell

to assist him in his researches with a view to writing a life of Sitting Bull, and that the Foundation had suggested that the University of Oklahoma supplement this grant considering the large amount of travelling that will be necessary.

It was voted to give Professor Campbell a leave of absence from September 1, 1930 to September 1, 1931, and to supplement the grant of the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation by \$1,000.00, and that he be required to give a bond guaranteeing his return to the University following the expiration of said leave of absence.

President Bizzell reported that surety bonds for employees in the University of Oklahoma at Norman, the University Hospital and Crippled Children's hospital at Oklahoma had been renewed in accordance with instructions from the Board.

* President Bizzell presented financial statements showing the condition of the various funds in all departments of the University, including also the hospitals at Oklahoma City. These statements were ordered filed.

President Bizzell presented a financial statement from the University Hospital and Crippled Children's Hospital, showing the amounts due from the various counties for county charity patients. Also the blank that is being used for commitments to the hospital. Dr. Langston requested that a new blank be prepared and that the patients be accepted from only those counties that had either paid their accounts, or that were making a sufficient tax levy for that purpose.

It was the sense of the Board that every effort should be made to collect these delinquent accounts, and that Dr. Langston request the Attorney General to prepare new forms for use in making commitments. The Board assured its full cooperation.

At the request of Dr. LeRoy Long, Dean of the Medical School, and Dr. Wann Langston, Administrative Officer of the Medical School, President Bizzell recommended that candidates for admission to the Medical School be required to make a deposit in the amount of \$25.00, immediately upon notification of their acceptance as a student in said Medical School, and that no refunds on deposits be made except for unavoidable circumstances, and on recommendation of the Dean or Administrative Officer of the Medical School. The recommendation was approved.

President Bizzell reported the death of Dr. J. S. Buchanan, Professor of History, Vice-president of the University of Oklahoma, on Thursday, March 20, 1930.

The following resolution was unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, on March 20, 1930, Dr. J. S. Buchanan, Vice-president of the University, died at his home in this city, and

WHEREAS, Dr. Buchanan served the University continuously for thirty-five years in various capacities, including that of Professor of History, Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, Vice-president and President, and

WHEREAS, in the death of Dr. Buchanan, the University has lost a valued member of its staff, and Oklahoma a patriotic, public-spirited citizen,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the Board of Regents express their personal loss in the passing of Dr. Buchanan, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the family of the deceased, that a copy be spread upon the minutes as a part of the proceedings of this Board meeting, and that a copy be given to the press.

President Bizzell stated that he was planning to spend his vacation in Europe. It was the sense of the Board that Dr. Bizzell begin his vacation immediately following the close of the school year in June and that he should not return until approximately September 1. President Bizzell expressed appreciation to the Board on this action.

The following resolution was drawn and unanimously adopted:

"WHEREAS, Judge Samuel W. Hayes has tendered his resignation as a member of the Board of Regents to the Governor, and

WHEREAS, during the time Judge Hayes has been a member of the Board he has proved to be a wise counselor and capable adviser on university policies,


THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Regents, in regular session, express our sincere regret that Judge Hayes, on account of other duties, has found it necessary to retire from the Board, and that this Board express to Judge Hayes our best wishes for his health and happiness.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be spread upon the minutes of the Board and a copy be sent to Judge Hayes.

President Bizzell discussed the feasibility of constructing an out-patient building at the University Hospital, the funds for this construction to come from the accumulated balances in the hospital revolving fund. He stated that the matter had been discussed with the Attorney General and that he had expressed himself as being favorable. It was the sense of the Board that since the construction of such a building had not been specifically authorized by the legislature, the use of the revolving fund for this purpose might lead to complications, and the president was instructed to notify Dr. Langston not to proceed with the project.

President Bizzell submitted the reports of the State Examiner on the Dormitory Sinking Fund, the Infirmary Sinking Fund, the Oklahoma Geological Survey, University of Oklahoma, covering the period from July 1, 1929 to December 31, 1929. These reports being favorable, they were ordered filed.

On motion adjourned.
