Mr. Asp offered the following resolution as to leave of absence of Professor Joseph F. Paxton, which on motion was adopted:

"Resolved, That Professor F. Paxton, Professor of Greek and Latin, be granted leave of absence from his duties for the coming school year, 1900, and 1901, upon condition that a competent instructor satisfactory to Prof. Paxton and President Boyd can be secured, and that the amount, if any, saved in salary thereby, be applied to the purchase of books and other material needed for the department of Greek and Latin of this University."

Motion was made that additional instructors be employed as follows, at the following salaries:

Instructor in Pedagogy who shall act as Principal of the Preparatory Department at a salary not to exceed \$1200.00 per annum.

Instructor in French and German, not to exceed \$1000.00 per annum.

Instructor in Anatomy and Director of Physical Culture, not to exceed \$1000.00 per annum.

Instructor in Geology not to exceed \$400.00 per annum.

Tutor in Spanish, at a salary of \$30.00 per month for ten months, \$300.00.

Motion Carried.

Motion was made that the Librarian and Assistant Librarian be employed at \$600.00 per annum; Janitor at \$480.00 per annum; Secretary to the President and Registrar at \$360.00 per annum; Dispensing clerk in Pharmacy Department at a salary of \$15.00 per month for nine months, \$135.00. Two Tutors for nine months at \$15.00 per month each, total \$270.00. Motion carried.
