BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA

A special meeting of the Board of Regents was held Wednesday, March 8, 1933, at 7:30 p. m., Room 619, Skirvin Hotel, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

Members present: Regents Hatchett, Tolbert, Barry, Looney, Rosser. In the absence of Regent Bomman, Vice-president Hatchett presided.

The reading of the minutes of the meeting held on February 23, 1933, was dispensed with.

Conforming to instructions at the February 23rd meeting, President Bizzell submitted a revised schedule of salaries for members of the faculty and employees of the University at Norman, and the Medical School at Oklahoma City. He reported that the administration at the hospitals had arranged to transfer the proportionate amount to the Revolving Fund without reducing salaries.

The motion was made, seconded, and passed, that the same schedule of reductions in salaries be applied in the University Hospital, and the Crippled Childrens Hospital as at the University at Norman, and the Medical School at Oklahoma City.

President Bizzell submitted two proposals for salary reductions for the months of March, April, May and June of 1933. The first proposal provided for reductions as follows:

5% on all amounts up to and including \$2,200.00
10% on the next \$500.00
15% on the next \$800.00
20% on amount above \$3,500.00

The second proposal provided for reductions as follows:

Salaries from \$500.00 to \$700.00 per month 10% Salaries from \$400.00 to \$500.00 per month 9% Salaries from \$335.00 to \$400.00 per month 8% Salaries from \$250.00 to \$333.33 per month 7% Salaries under \$250.00 per month, 5%

He reported that the net difference in the amount saved under either proposal was less than \$100.00; and the total saving in reduced salaries for the period, \$32,873.00.

He submitted also the following statement showing appropriations and the amounts to revert to the State Treasury at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1933.

Following a discussion of the two proposals it was voted to adopt proposal No. 1, known as the "sliding scale percentage method", to be applied on all salaries for March, April, May, and June 1933, and paid on a monthly basis.

The motion was made, seconded, and carried, that the budget for the University for the remainder of the fiscal year be approved after salaries have been adjusted according to the schedule adopted.

President Bizzell recommended the following schedule of salaries for the teachers in the summer session, June and July 1933, and that the maximum expenditure for the summer school be fixed at \$40,000.00.

The President's recommendation was approved.

The President submitted for consideration the question of conducting summer classes in the Medical School at Oklahoma City. He explained the methods in which classes had been financed in the past. He recommended that owing to the

lack of funds no classes be conducted during the summer of 1933. The recommendae tion was approved.

President Bizzell discussed the difficulties in some of the student boarding houses in Norman on account of the bank moratorium. He stated that credit would be extended by merchants to fraternity and sorority houses with esetablished credit, but that some of the boarding houses were having difficulty in securing supplies since students are unable to tender cash for board and room charges, and that in all probability some of these houses would be forced to close leaving students without cash in a very distressing situation. President Bizzell requested authority to use money from the Revolving Fund to purchase supplies in feeding students at the University Cafeteria. He stated that in most cases students have regular allowances from home, but would be unable to cash checks.

A motion was made, and seconded, that President Bizzell be permitted to use not to exceed \$2,500.00 from the Revolving Fund for the above purpose, with the understanding that applications be strictly scrutinized and that meal tickets be issued on collateral to be approved by President Bizzell. Also, that only those students making satisfactory progress in their school work be considered for assistance.

A vote was had on the motion with the following result: Regents Hatchett, Barry, and Looney voting yes; Rosser and Tolbert, no. The motion was declared adopted.
