A spacial meeting of the Board of Regents of the University of Chlunoma sass called by tins President of the board at 11:00 acis on Thursday, April 30, 1953 for a hearing requested by Roy G. Lytta, of the $13 w$ find Keaton, Walls, Johnson ia Lytic, of Oklahoma City, representing Mcclure Concessions, Incs, to chacuss further the matter of turing over the concessions at football sames and other oocaatons to the Department of Athletics. This action was takin on rscomoncation of President Cross at the April 9, 1953 mexting.

The following numbers of tho Board were present: Regent T. R. Benedum, President, presiding: Reagents Short, Morgan, Foster, Little, McBride, Cuisse.

Mr. Jake MuCliva and Mr. John Laughing repreeoraine MaCiurg Coacassicna, Inc. were present. Also C. E. (Sud) uitunson, Director of Athletics and Xonnsth Farms, Business Manager.

The Chair ailed that Mr. HeCluro make arch utat,umates as ide ion aired, whereupon he equlainsd tins oprarstions curing the past years. Hs stated they had axtemptai to gins the best possible sezariea and at prises commensurate with those charged generally throughout the country. He static ales that they paid the Athlete Department $30 \%$ of the gross anis pius pi, 000 last year on a cneopear contract, but that he had assumed thy cen:tract would be axtanded. Salesmen are psid 16 dg of sales. They have sad full cooperation on the part of Kemrelih Farms. Fie asked that the Regents rescind its action at the previous noting and that they be given a longtime contract.

Costs, prices, and serbians were discussed, followtre whish masses. Mcclure and laughing retired from the meeting.

Mr. Wilkinson was aged to uxpreas his opinion on the matter. He stated he was akepticin in the beginning and stated he did rot. know if the Department of Athletics could operation the concessions asceasatully. At the Undrersitios os Nebraska and Minnescita, where the concesalona are operated, the facilities are used by other organizations, and on 8 niramenths basis. He stated Kenneth Ferris has made a thorough study of the matter and is in a better position to explain the situation.

C. It is the deaire of this doparement to employ University ataff andor faculty mambers aa awailable for work in superyisory pobitiens.
D. Sales parsonnel and some atands persomel will be requested and interviawed vary socm in an affort to secure as many as possible baiore school is out for the summer. Prior to reporting back to Nozman in Soptamber, all personnel nill be contacted as to availability in the fall. They will be notilicd when to report for instruction, miticin will be offered by means of lecture and risual aids pricr to the first game.
F. It is the desire of nou Concessions" fo obtain exclusive rights for all campus activitian and events which, by the nature of thoir size, would justify the establiahing of temporary stands and hiring of some parsonmel for the purpose of selifing beverages and food.

Prosident Cross was anked, in the light of diacusaions, if ing would rant to change his reccmendation, to which he repiled in the negas tivis.

Regent Grijso stated: rife are just as ready now as we will be nest yearis.

The qusstion was callod for on the subsititute notion by Regeat McBrids.

On the rete on the rotion the following roted AYE: Regents Short and McBilde. Toting 70: Regenti Horgan, Fonter; Littls. Regrnt Grisao statsd ha wruli "pass". Regent Benedim exprossed himeolf in favor of the McEridis motion, but declared the motion losto

A yote was taken on tha Morgan motion to resifinm tize previous action to turn the concessions orer to the Athlotic Departmant, witin the followirg resuit:

Voiling AYE: Horgan, Fioster, Lititio. Grisso not joting.
Voting NO: Ragents Short and MeBride. Regent Benedum expressed himself as againgt tho motion, but deciared the motion passod.

Fresident Cioss discussed some of the developments with refersnce to the action of Noith Cantral Anscoiation in connection with the marding of beholarships to athlates following conferences with tine Presidents of the Big Seven and Big Ten institutions, and others, and asked for instrucm tions from the liagants in the cyant a reascnabia solution to the athlatic problem cannot be norked out with the forth Control issccistion. He recom mended that the Unizersity of Oflahoma be authorized to join with the other comparable large institutions in withciraning from the North Central Associam tion and organizing a new eyetam of accreditation. He stated a meeting is to be held in tie near future and he asked that he be authonized to say at that meating the üniversity will withiras frem the North Central Acsociation and join with the othsr institutions in organiaing the now scorediting group.

Regent lititia moved, and it was unanimously voted, to approve the President 's recomiendation.

Thwe boing no furthar business the masting was adjourned at 12850 p.m.
