# MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA THURSDAY, JANUARY 9, 1969 - 10:30 A.M.

A regular meeting of the Board of Regents of the University of Oklahoma was held in the office of the President of the University, Norman, on Thursday, January 9, 1969, beginning at 10:30 a.m.

# IV. Reorganization, Establishment, Discontinuing of Departments

#### a. Law Center

In a letter dated November 26, 1968, Dr. E. T. Dunlap, Chancellor, reported the following action of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education:

"The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education in meeting on November 26, 1968, approved the plans of the University of Oklahoma Board of Regents to proceed with development of the statement of functions and programs to be implemented through the new Law Center at the University to become effective July 1, 1969.

The State Regents will look forward to receiving from you in due time recommendations of the University regarding the detailed functions and educational programs to be represented in an expansion of the functions and programs of the Law School which will be carried out in the new Law Center.

Also, I should like to inform you that the State Regents accepted the recommendation of the University Regents that the budget of the Law Center for 1969-70 remain an integral part of the University budget and that the separate budget agency proposal not be considered further at this time."

President Hollomon said this was reported for the information of the Regents and requires no action.

The architects' estimate of the cost was \$29,000. Funds for the project are included in the monies available for construction of the Basic Science Building.
