Libraries Piloting Targeted Document Delivery Service

The University Libraries is piloting Reprints Desk, a document delivery service, March-August 2021. Here's what you need to know:

- The pilot will target Elsevier and Wiley journals, 2019-2021, for which the Libraries no longer maintain a current subscription.
- During the pilot period, faculty members will be able to request articles from Reprints Desk or traditional interlibrary loan.
- Reprints Desk requests will be mediated by interlibrary loan personnel and delivered in less than 24 hours; charge to the Libraries will be approximately \$30 per article.
- Regular interlibrary loan will still be available for these items; average delivery time for interlibrary loan is 36 hours or less with no charge per article.

The pilot data will be assessed to determine if the Libraries can operate Reprints Desk on an unmediated basis for even more rapid delivery.

Scholarly Communication Taskforce Presents to Faculty Senate



The University Libraries Committee's Scholarly Communication
Taskforce (SCTF) members presented on their report, <u>Finding the Balance: Creating an Open, Sustainable Future for OU</u>, at the March 8 Faculty Senate meeting. The report identifies actions and best practices from peer institutions that OU community members can take to have the most positive impact upon the creation of an open,

sustainable scholarly communication system at OU. Taskforce members are available to answer questions and engage in discussion on the report throughout the remainder of 2021, and request that faculty members invite them to academic department and college-
