Why does the Library need a digital initiatives plan?



Current Digital Collections



A collection of scrapbooks from 1942-1943, which were made by Oklahoma school children to document their schools' metal scrap drives in aid of World War II armory and ammunition. Includes short school histories, compositions and drawings by students, and newspaper clippings.



BRONZE BOOK ARCHIVE

The Bronze Book is the yearbook for the University of Central Oklahoma, first published in 1909 as the Browser Towser. There was a four year gap until the Bronze Book became a regular publication in 1913 until 2003 when the last edition was printed.

DESIGN ANNUAL ARCHIVE

Design Annual, is a UCO campus publication by the School of Design at University of Central Oklahoma (formerly the Department of Design). Published since the 2014-2015 academic year, it is a compilation of works created by students and faculty that demonstrate their award-winning talent.

DIMENSIONS MAGAZINE ARCHIVE

Dimensions was a monthly lesbian lifestyle magazine published from 1986-1996 based out of Lubbock, TX.

Physical copies are held at the library located within UCO's Women's Research Center and BGLTQ+ Student Center.

The Herland Newsletter Archive is one of the collections offered by Herland Sister Resources, which has been serving the women's community since 1983.

The newsletter started out as the Herland Newsletter before quickly changing names to Herland Sister Resources

and finally becoming Herland Voice in 1989.

OKLAHOMA FASHION MUSEUM COLLECTION

Garments and accessories from prominent women who were members of the OKC Fashion Group, a regional division of The Fashion Group International, Inc. Items in the collection range from the late 1800s to 1970s. In 1989, the OKC Fashion Group disbanded and donated items to UCO for use by fashion marketing, costume design, drama, art, and history students.

OKLAHOMA TOWNSITE CASE FILES

This ongoing project includes 100,000 records from legal proceedings following the historic land openings, beginning in 1889.

View townsite maps, hearing transcripts, deeds, land office records, photographs, receipts, city council meeting minutes, letters, ledgers, and depositions only available in this unique collection.



UCO seeks to engage students in transformative learning in six core areas: Discipline Knowledge; Global and Cultural Competencies; Health and Wellness; Leadership; Research, Creative and Scholarly Activities; and Service Learning and Civic Engagement.

The Student Transformative Learning Record (STLR) Initiative Archive includes documents on setting up a STLR program, including presentations, rubrics, staffing, research, etc.

Original research done by UCO students of the Jackson College of Graduate Studies which has been put forth as requirement for earning a Masters or Doctoral degree. Currently, UCO Masters' Theses published December 2007 through present day are available.


Development of Policy Suite

Digital Collections Development Policy

- Defines the scope of the Library's digital collections
- Defines the frameworks used for selection, evaluation, and collection intake
- Defines various sub-policies, such as copyright and take-down
- Defines content repositories currently utilized for the Library's digital collections

Digitized or Digital Scholarly born-digital output by the resources that **Collections Central** support Scope community transformative **learning** Special collections or publications **Preservation of** relating to the rare or unique history of the materials university and regional interests

Selection Framework & Rubric

DIWG collaborates to identify, approve, and select resources to be added to the digital collections. Working group members provide **initial assessment** of resources based on the following criteria:

- 1. Relevance to Digital Collections Scope
- 2. Added Research Value
- 3. Historical Value
- 4. Uniqueness
- 5. Demand


If initial assessment is successful, the following criteria then are applied to determine priority for both a time frame for digitizing collections and including digital collections in one of our repositories:

- 1. Condition
- Completeness
- 3. Legal Implications (Copyright, etc.)
- 4. Existing Physical Access
- Existing Digital Access
- 6. Cataloged in Library Service Platform
- File Type (born-digital only)
- 8. Digitized Condition (born-digital only)

Copyright & Take-Down Policies



Copyright

No resources may be added to any of the Library's digital repositories without providing documentation of one of the following:

- 1. Written permission from the creator(s) (preferred);
- 2. Written confirmation that resource is in public domain or uses an appropriate Creative Commons license; or
- 3. Detailed evidence of due diligence made in good faith to identify copyright owner without success.

Take Down Policy

Chambers Library endeavors to ensure all digital resources ingested and made accessible have the appropriate copyright permissions. Individuals or organizations who feel that their copyright may be infringed can contact diwg@uco.edu for resolution.



ArcaSearch	A commercial platform used to search important university publications. Access is available to anyone.	Access	Archival Collection
ShareDrive	Files may be stored on UCO-Lib with access limited to university employees.	Preservation	Restricted Collections
Library Website	Specific collections from Archives & Special Collections are available to the general public, but access may be limited or restricted for some resources.	Access	Open Access or Restricted
SHAREOK	An open-access joint institutional repository between Oklahoma academic libraries. Access is available to anyone.	Preservation /Access	Open Access Collections
Kaltura (Streaming)	A task force for determining a replacement is underway. Access may be limited to members of the Central community for some resources.	Access	Open Access or Restricted

Development of SHAREOK Collection Policy

SHAREOK: Scope



- Materials are submitted by UCO-affiliated creators and are of a scholarly, creative, and/or research-related nature.
- All UCO-affiliated creators' works produced before, during, and after their time at UCO will be accepted, with a preference given to works unavailable in other repositories.

UCO-affiliated creators are...

Faculty, staff, retired faculty or staff, emeritus faculty, graduate students, undergraduate students, academic departments, campus organizations, campus shared governance bodies, etc.



SHAREOK: License Agreement



All submissions to SHAREOK must be accompanied by a signed copy (/copies if multiple creators) of the *Author/Copyright Owner Agreement for Inclusion of Materials in UCO Chambers Library's Online Repositories*. This document can be found at https://libguides.uco.edu/diwg/license
