
Open Educational Resources (OER) are teaching, learning, and research materials intentionally created and licensed to be freely accessed, shared, retained, and in many cases, modified and re-shared at no additional cost to the end user.



Many scholars and researchers view use of OER as a way to increase access to meaningful learning opportunities and democratize the knowledge creation process. Use of OER can also facilitate use of innovative pedagogies. In my Intro to Creative Writing class as well as my Composition classes, I was able to use alternative sources to prevent my students from having to pay \$60 for a textbook that was going out of print, and it was a really awesome opportunity to incorporate tools like Hypothes.is to facilitate community among my students both online and face to face, which I will talk about more later on if you'd like to join my panel!



Creation and use of OER is a collaborative, iterative process. A great way to begin is to locate OER which have already been created and are in use at other institutions. The Open Textbook Library, OER Commons, OpenStax and PressbooksEdu are great places to start. Come back later, if you like, and use the QR code on this page to find your way to those and other platforms. In today's presentation we will experiment specifically with locating OER published using PressbooksEdu



The Oklahoma State University Libraries and OpenOKState provide an instance of PressbooksEdu to support the use, modification and creation of OER. Use the QR code or navigate to open.library.okstate.edu to see a bit of what is happening with OpenOKState. The PressbooksEdu creation and publication platform is built on WordPress, which means works published there are easily customizable and simple to share out. The platform exports resources in several file types which can be used across a variety of devices. The PressbooksEdu OER community is also very strong and active, which is great if you feel like you are tramping through the woods on your own. You can find others to help you know where you are going.
