Warning to Data Users

Broncho Analytics provides data users with the most current institutional data available from the Office of Institutional Research. These data reflect our efforts to correct for a number of data quality issues in the student information system & provide comparable time-series data. As we have transitioned to reporting from a data warehouse, our methods have evolved. Unfortunately, this might mean a report from many years ago is no longer comparable with data reported currently on Broncho Analytics. For example, past reports on student majors were based on the student's "primary major" whereas current major reports are not limited in this way.

Data users are encouraged to consult the Office of Institutional Research when comparing data from past editions of the Factbook and Demobook to current reports on <u>Broncho Analytics</u>.

INTRODUCTION

A draft version of the University of Central Oklahoma Factbook will be available online at www.ucok.edu/ir. As the various reports that compose the Factbook are completed, they will be added to the website. This approach will allow access to the data months before the final document is published. As this is a growing document, page numbers will be assigned only as the actual page number can be determined.

The University of Central Oklahoma Factbook is designed to serve multiple functions. It is intended to provide "most everything" you want to know about UCO at the institutional level, and to provide detailed information useful for academic program review at the academic departmental level. It is anticipated that the information provided will help decision-makers, grant writers, and those needing general institutional information for accreditation purposes. Given that breadth of intent, it is obvious that there will be gaps in the information. Hopefully, factbook users will provide feedback and identify areas for inclusion in the future (though all questions will not be answerable within the parameters of this factbook). 


It was easy in 1891 to describe the Territorial Normal School's students. Enrollment was "about 25", though a picture of the first class shows only 20, 13 women and 7 men. They were all commuters as there were no dorms. Out-of-state and international students were unheard of in an era of horse and wagon. Yet the vision of a community and its leaders gave birth to the Normal School which has developed into a university where diversity of the student population is one of its greatest strengths.

The history of the University's student population provides a clear snapshot of the institution's growth and the world in which it grew. A glance at the graph of student headcount shows the rapid growth of the institution after 1950. The greatest percentage increase, however, was actually during the first decade. There were anticipated growth spurts at the end of World Wars I and II. When Oklahoma needed to educate and retrain for a rapidly changing world, Central was there.




Oklahoma became a State in 1907, and the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education came into existence in 1941. In the early years of the Institution student headcount was annualized but since about 1910 it reflects Fall figures. There have been six name changes since UCO was founded, and the following chart represents the status of the institution at the time of those changes, as well as of the current year.











Organizational Chart - Academic Affairs (Administrative) August 2006




Organizational Chart - Administration August 2006




Organizational Chart - Student Affairs August 2006







Administrative Costs Percentage, FY 2007



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

DEFINITIONS

<u>Academic Probation</u> - Any student whose retention GPA falls below the retention requirements for a semester. Students enrolled in 30 hours or less must maintain a 1.7 cumulative GPA. Students enrolled in more than 30 hours must maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA.

<u>Academic Suspension</u> - Any student who was on academic probation the previous semester who fails to raise his or her retention GPA to the required retention GPA level or to achieve a 2.00 semester GPA in regularly graded course work, not including activity or performance courses.

<u>Budget Functional Classifications</u> – All universities and colleges budget expenditures in accordance with the standards defined by the National Association of College and University Business Officers (NACUBO). Functional classifications are as follows:

- <u>Instruction</u> includes expenditures for all activities that are a direct part of the instructional programs. Includes general academic programs as well as vocational-technical programs and community or continuing education.
- Research includes the creation, the organization, and the application of knowledge. Does not include federal or externally funded research. That item is included in the sponsored budget, Educational and General, Part II.

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- Public Service includes activities to make an institution's unique resources and capabilities available as a response to a community need or a solution to a community problem. Includes the agriculture cooperative extension services at both OSU and Langston, as well as any public broadcasting activities supported with E&G funds.
- Academic Support activities that support directly one or more of the three primary functions. Library budgets are a major component of this category.
- Student Services activities carried out with the objective of contributing to the emotional and physical well being of the institution's students, as well as to their intellectual, cultural, and social development outside the context of the institution's formal instruction program. Includes counseling and career guidance, financial aid services, student records, and student health services.
- <u>Institutional Support</u> includes expenditures for: 1) central executive-level management and long-range institutional planning, such as the governing board, planning and programming, and legal services; 2) fiscal operations; 3) space management; 4) personnel services and records; 5) purchasing, security, storerooms; 6) faculty and staff support services not operated as auxiliary enterprises; and 7) activities concerned with community and alumni relations, including development and fund raising.
- <u>Physical Plant Operations</u> consists of those expenditures related to operating educational facilities and grounds, including maintenance, utilities, fire protection, property insurance and similar items.
- Scholarships and Fellowships are grants to students.
- <u>Data Processing Academic Support</u> includes computer services that provide direct support for one or more of the institution's primary academic programs.
- <u>Data Processing Institutional Support</u> includes computer and data processing services that provide support for institutionwide administrative functions.

<u>Financial Aid, Grants</u> - includes Pell, SEOG, & State and Local Grants, as well as fee waivers.

Financial Aid, Loans - includes Perkins, Federal, & Institutional Loans.

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Financial Aid, Scholarships - includes State and all other scholarships.

<u>Financial Aid, Student Employment</u> - includes Federal Work Study and Institutional Student Employment.

<u>FTE, Student</u> - calculated for Fall semester by dividing the total number of **undergraduate** credit hours produced by 15 and the total number of **graduate** credit hours by 12.

<u>FTE, Annualized</u> - OSRHE produces this figure by adding the total number of undergraduate credit hours produced during Summer, Fall, & Spring semesters and dividing by 30, and dividing the total number of graduate credit hours produced by 24.

<u>Graduate Student</u> - A student who has been formally admitted to the Graduate College and is enrolled in a Graduate Program.

Mean Age - Average age of a population.

Mode Age - The age which occurs most often in a population.

<u>Post-Baccalaureate Student</u> - An undergraduate student with a bachelor's degree who is taking courses for personal interest or is working on a teacher certificate.

Residual ACT Testing - ACT testing offered at UCO every week. The tests are not taken on a National Test Date. The exams are scored locally, and while they are reported to ACT, the scores are to be used only for admission to UCO.

<u>Scholarships, Endowed</u> - Scholarships paid with an interest amount resulting from the investment of the principle gift. The principle is always invested.

<u>Scholarships, Pass Through</u> - Scholarships paid to the University, which in turn pays the recipient the scholarship.

<u>Scholarships, Spendable</u> - Scholarships usually used for special purposes at the discretion of the Foundation.

NOTES

Because of human error, some students may have an invalid major code which cannot be assigned to a particular college or program.

Preliminary Enrollment Reports are run as of a census date established by the OSRHE. The preliminary data will vary from end-of-semester final data.

All numbers in the Factbook represent Fall figures, unless otherwise noted.
