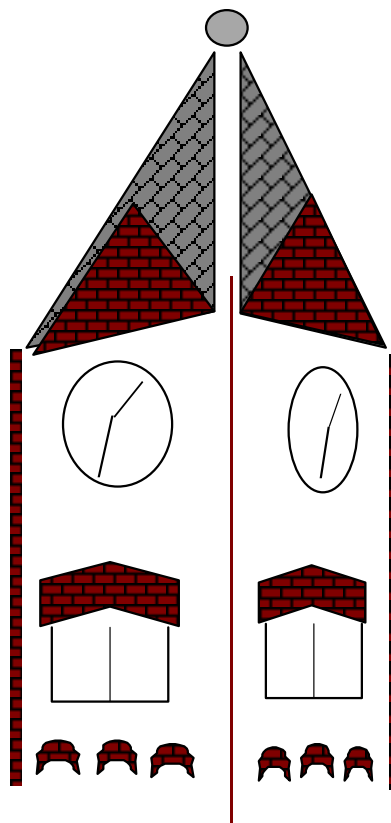

These data reflect our efforts to correct for a number of data quality issues in the student information system & provide comparable time-series data. As we have transitioned to reporting from a data warehouse, our methods have evolved. Unfortunately, this might mean a report from many years ago is no longer comparable with data reported currently on Broncho Analytics. For example, past reports on student majors were based on the student's "primary major" whereas current major reports are not limited in this way.

INTRODUCTION

This document is intended to serve managers in their decision making processes. There has been an effort to use data that is consistent from one semester to the same semester the next year. Where possible, trend information is provided.

FTE numbers may vary slightly because of automatic rounding by the computer. Student credit hours are sorted two ways: by student classification (for FTE calculations) or by course level (for production by department). The data sections for each college do not include students with undeclared majors or with invalid major codes.

This demographic book will vary from earlier ones due to the conversion to the Banner system. Graduate and Post-Graduate students are both included in the classification "Graduate." This is a technical issue in Banner. However, a possible solution to this issue has been identified. Therefore, it is possible with the Spring 2003 enrollments that these classifications may be separated.

Due to the manner in which data was pulled for the summer term, the statistics for First-Time Freshmen, First-Time Transfers, and First-Time Graduates were not reliable enough to include. These usually occurred in a footnote on the second page of each section. This situation is resolvable for future terms.

There are several reports in the University section relating to student residency that were not included for this term. The student's permanent residency was not consistently captured in Banner. This situation is resolvable for future terms; Fall 2002 is not one of them.

The pages addressing day versus evening students (usually the fourth page of each section) will not be produced for the summer term. While doable, the process is extremely manual. Institutional Research would like further feedback on this page prior to the publication of the fall demographics.

The College of Arts, Media, and Design, initiated in January 2001, began enrolling students in the Fall 2001 semester. The creation of CAMD, and the resulting reorganization of the College of Education and the College of Liberal Arts, causes a shift in the distribution of students between these colleges.

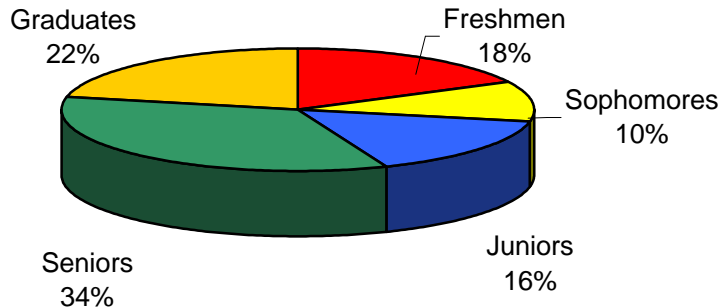
Due to the block scheduling, which allows some classes to have a later enrollment period, the summer semester is the least consistent of the three semesters in terms of preliminary enrollment numbers. The data in this book is accurate as of June 5, 2002. End of semester figures (which vary slightly from these) are transmitted to the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for Unitized Data Reporting and for input into the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS). This serves as a major database for higher education statistics.

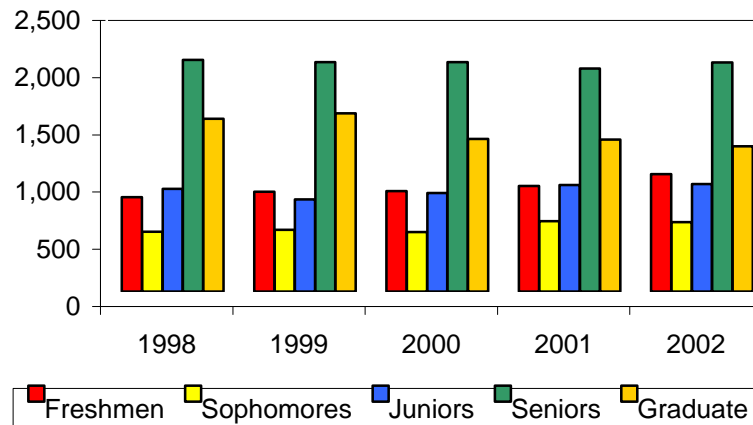
Percentage of Total Headcount

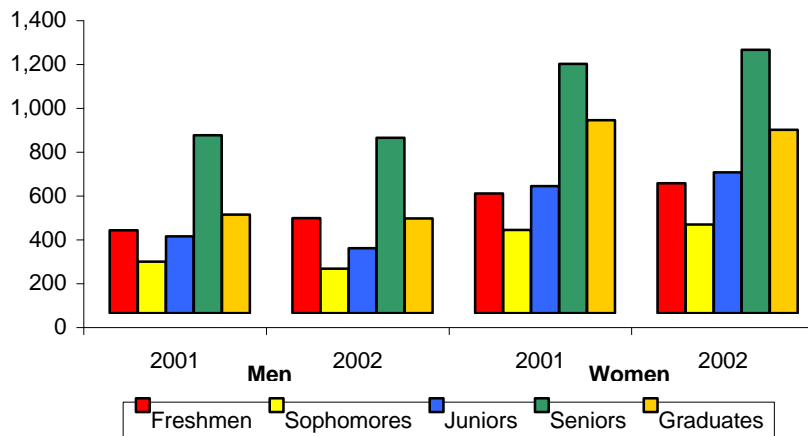

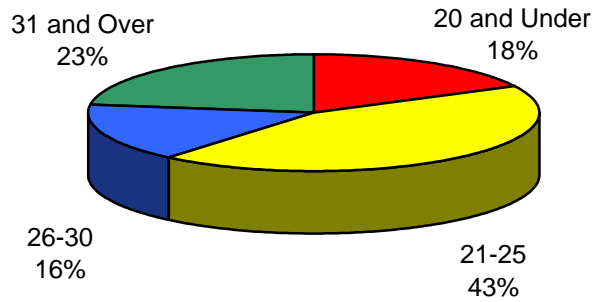
Two Year Male/Female Comparison

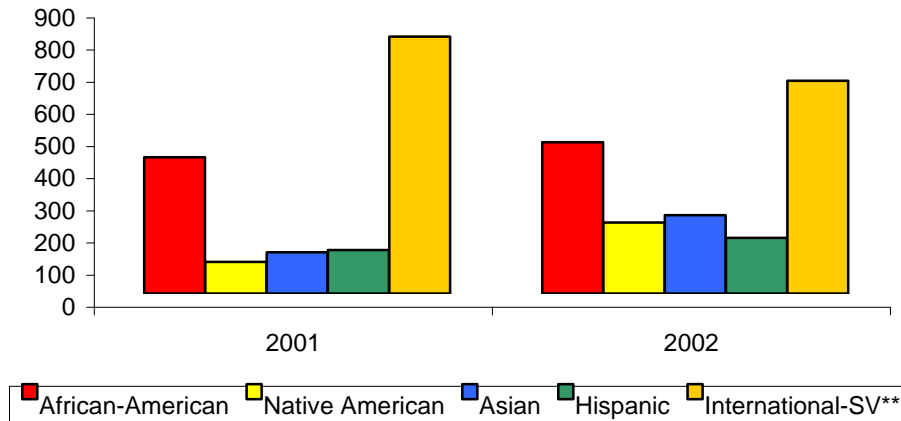

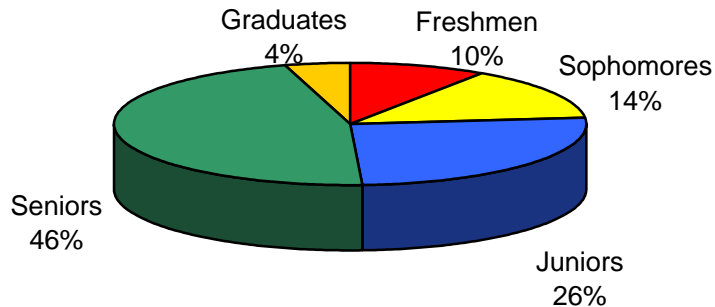

Percentage of Total Headcount

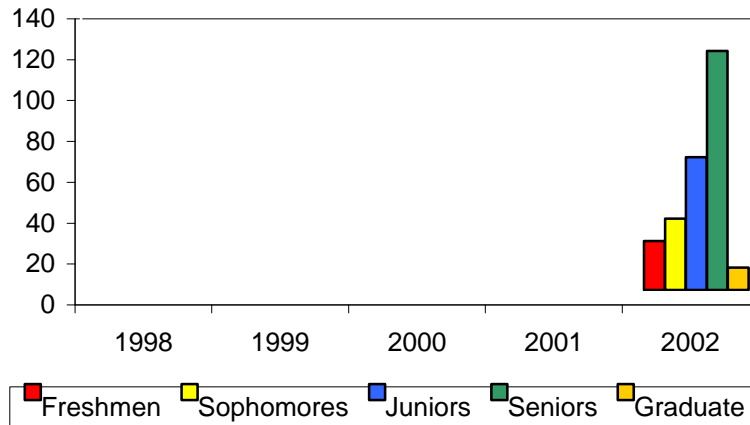

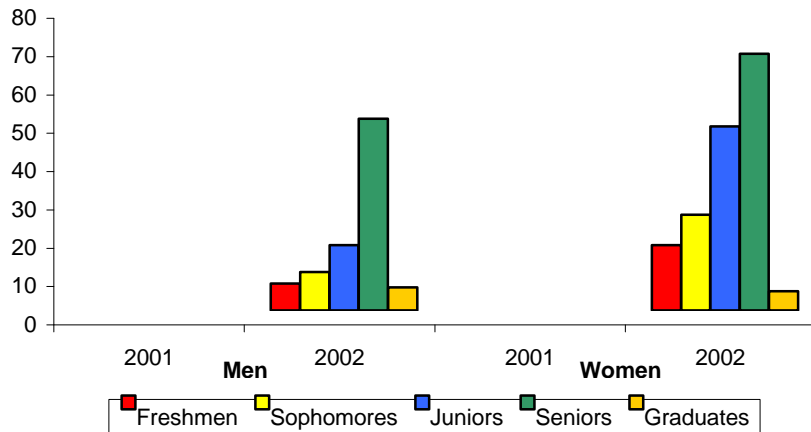

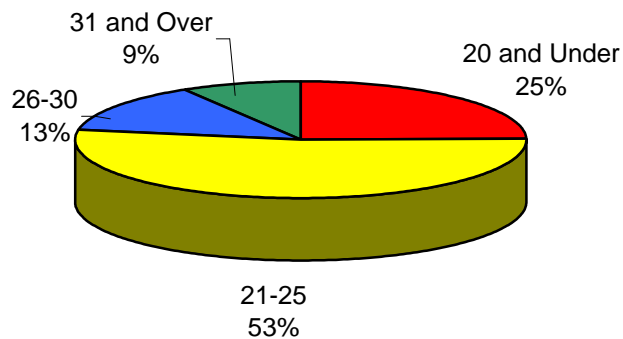
Two Year Male/Female Comparison

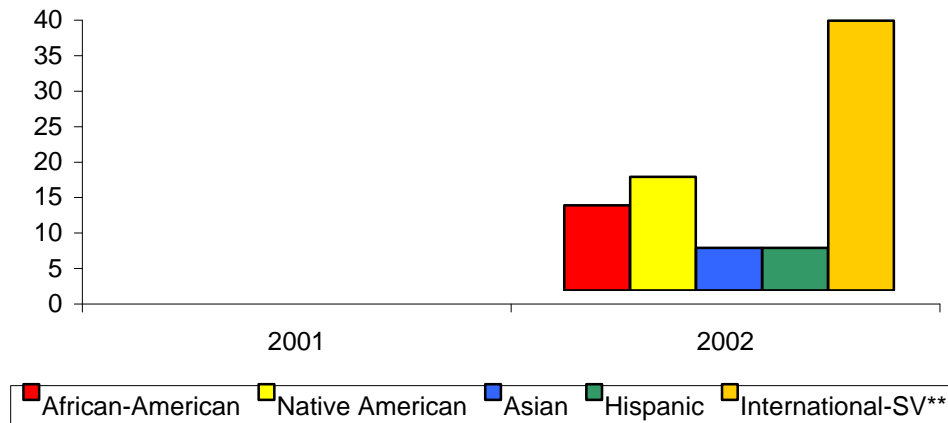

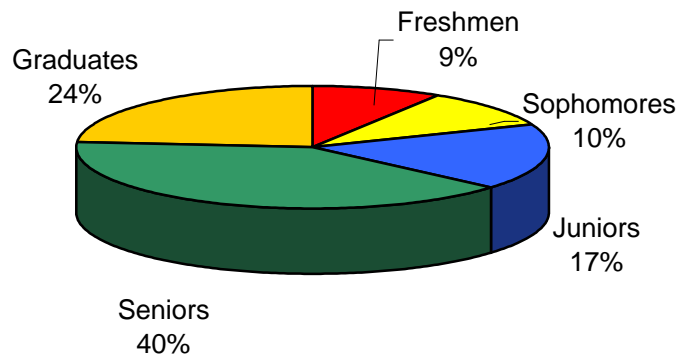

Percentage of Total Headcount

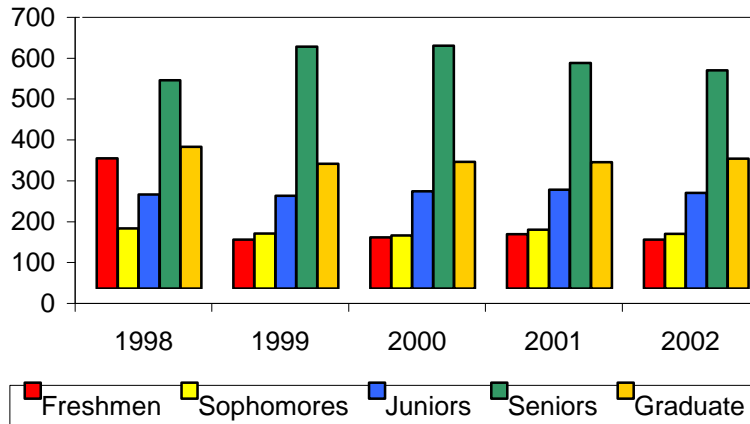

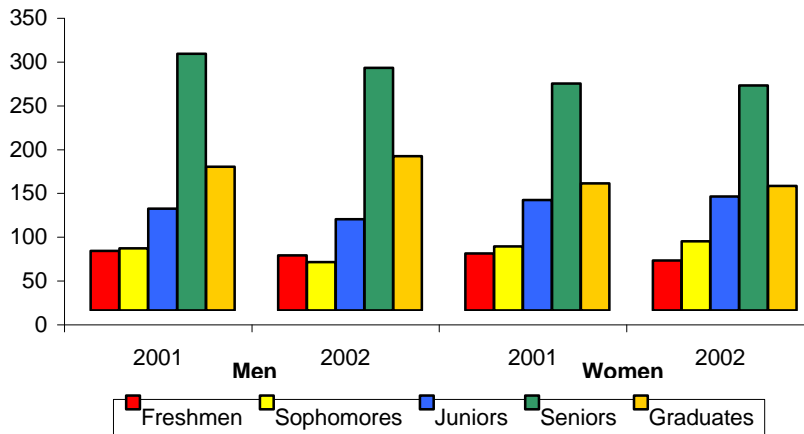

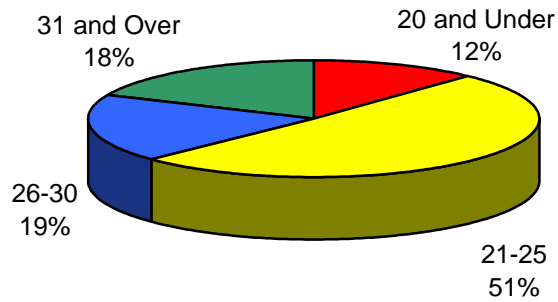
Two Year Male/Female Comparison

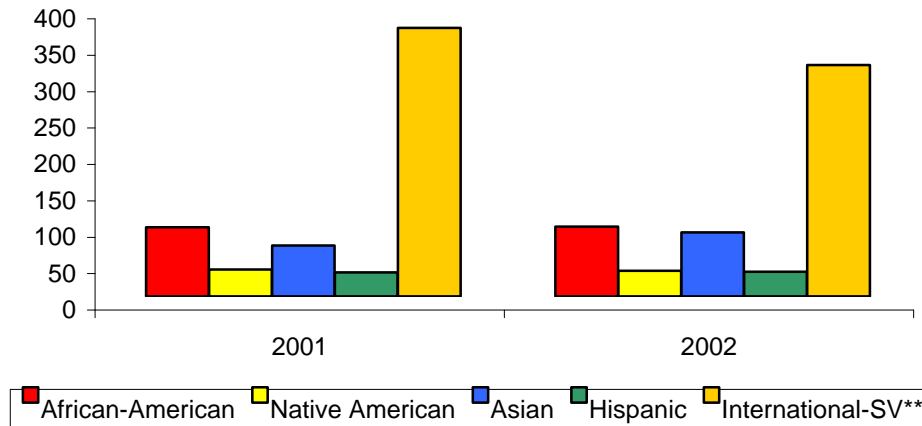

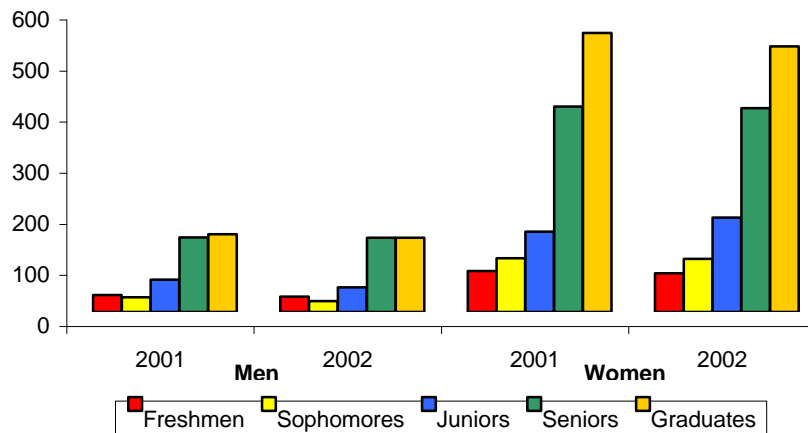

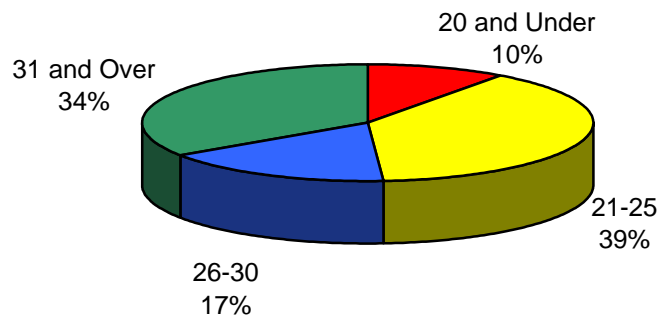

Percentage of Total Headcount

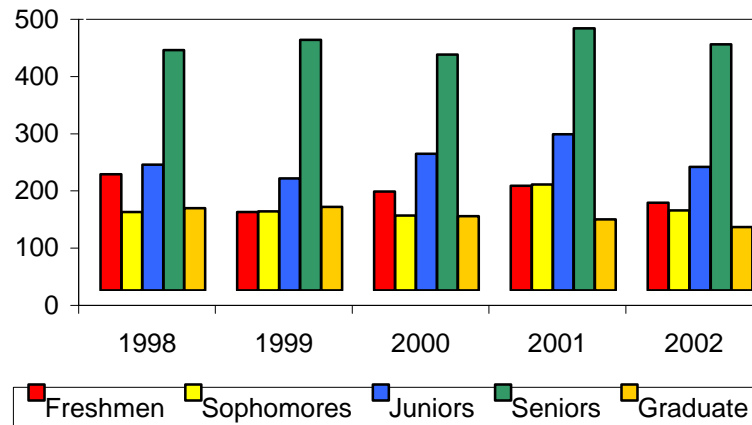

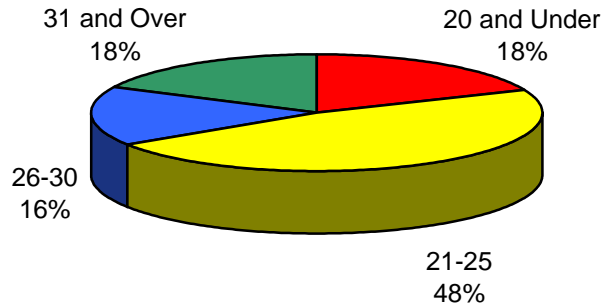

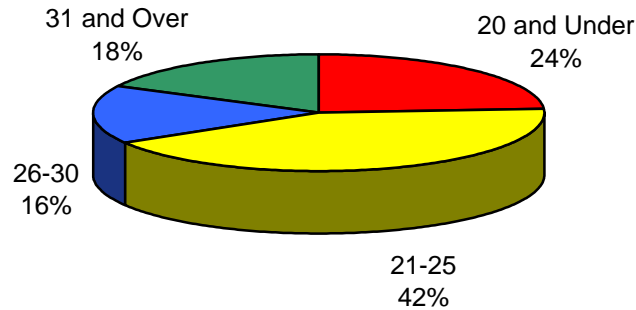

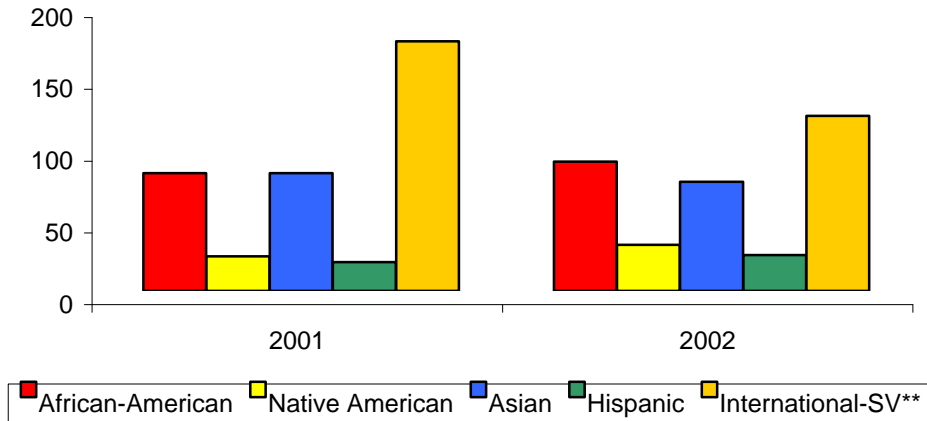

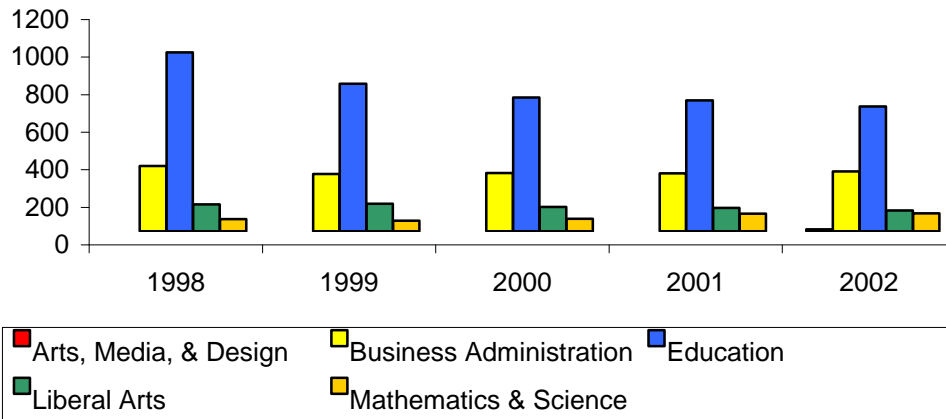
Percentage of Total Headcount

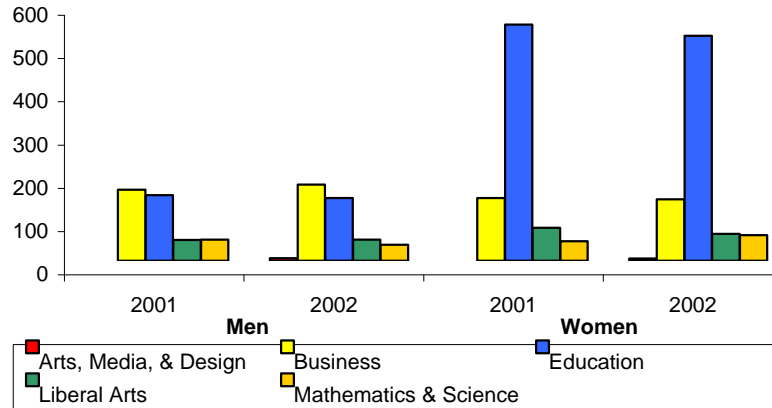

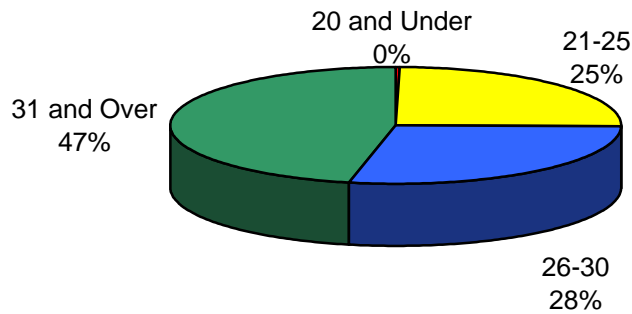
