TRANSFER ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- Students with 0-30 hours must have a minimum 1.7 Cumulative GPA
- Students with 31 hours or more must have a minimum 2.0 Cumulative GPA
- All transfer students with less than 24 credit hours must also meet high school admission requirements listed above
- Out-of-state transfer students must have a minimum 2.0 GPA
