4 PAY FOR SCHOOL!

Complete the admission process by Feb. 1, 2022, to be considered for scholarships at Central. Qualified incoming freshmen, who apply on time and meet the eligibility requirements, will be awarded a scholarship automatically of up to \$2,000 per year, in addition to other scholarships awarded through the application process. Submit your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to discover your complete financial aid package at Central. 2022-23 FAFSA applications are available starting Oct. 1, 2021. Visit studentaid.gov to get started.

Application, application fee, official high school transcript and any other documents required for admission must be received by Feb. 1 2022, for incoming freshmen and June 1, 2022, for transfer students to be eligible for qualifying scholarships.



Freshman Admission Requirements

20 Composite ACT score or 1030 combined SAT score on the Reading and Writing Section and Math Section

OR

2.7 Overall non-weighted GPA and ranking in the upper 50% of your graduating class

OR

2.7 Overall GPA in the 15 unit high school core curriculum

Test Optional Admission

ACT or SAT scores currently are not required for admission for incoming freshmen but may be submitted for admission and scholarship purposes. Students who are homeschooled or attend an unaccredited high school are only admissible by submitting an ACT or SAT score.

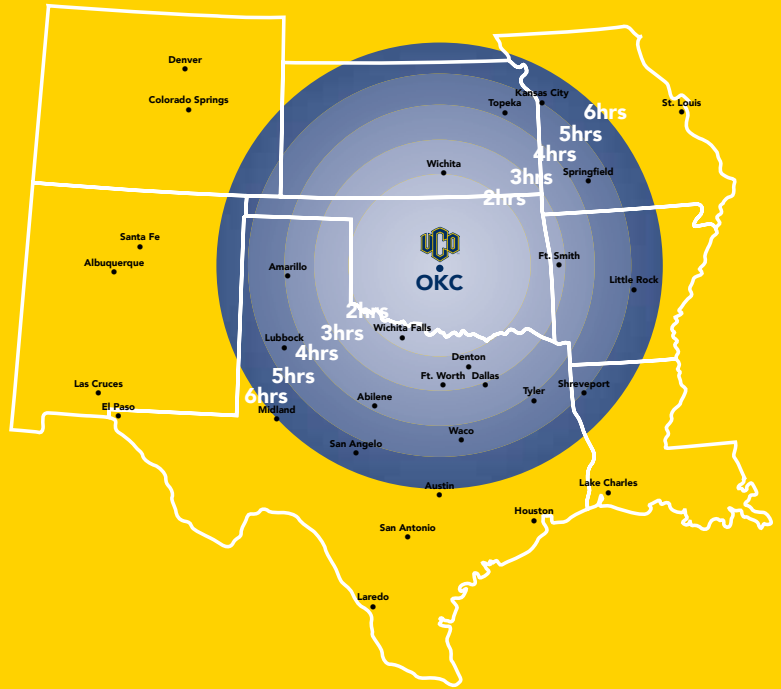
