Each time pupils of the First and Second Grades hear an airplane they whisper a Hail Mary for a safe landing.

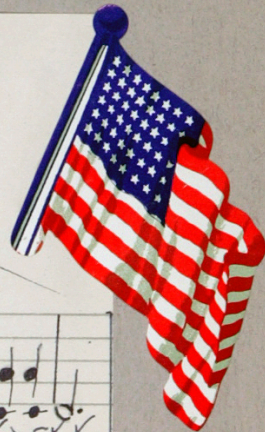
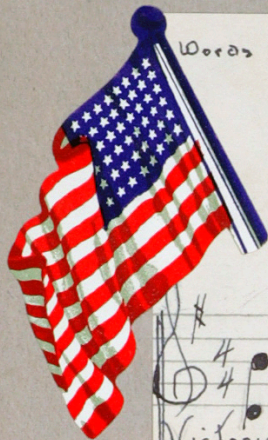

Victory for our Country, Victory o'er our foes, Sweet Liberty on land and sea For our own United States

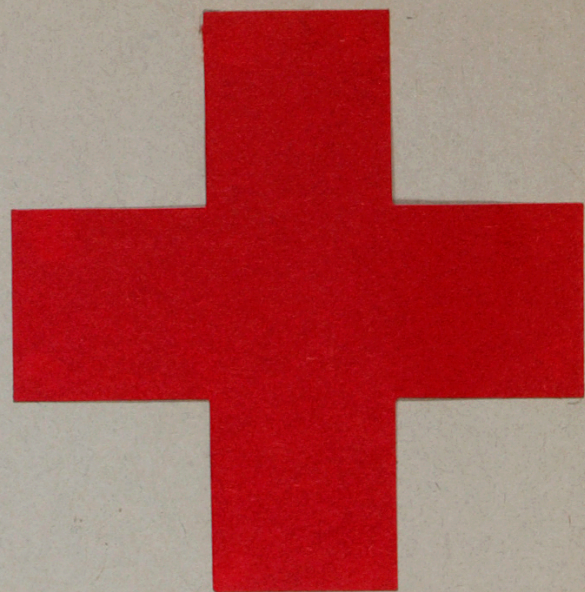
