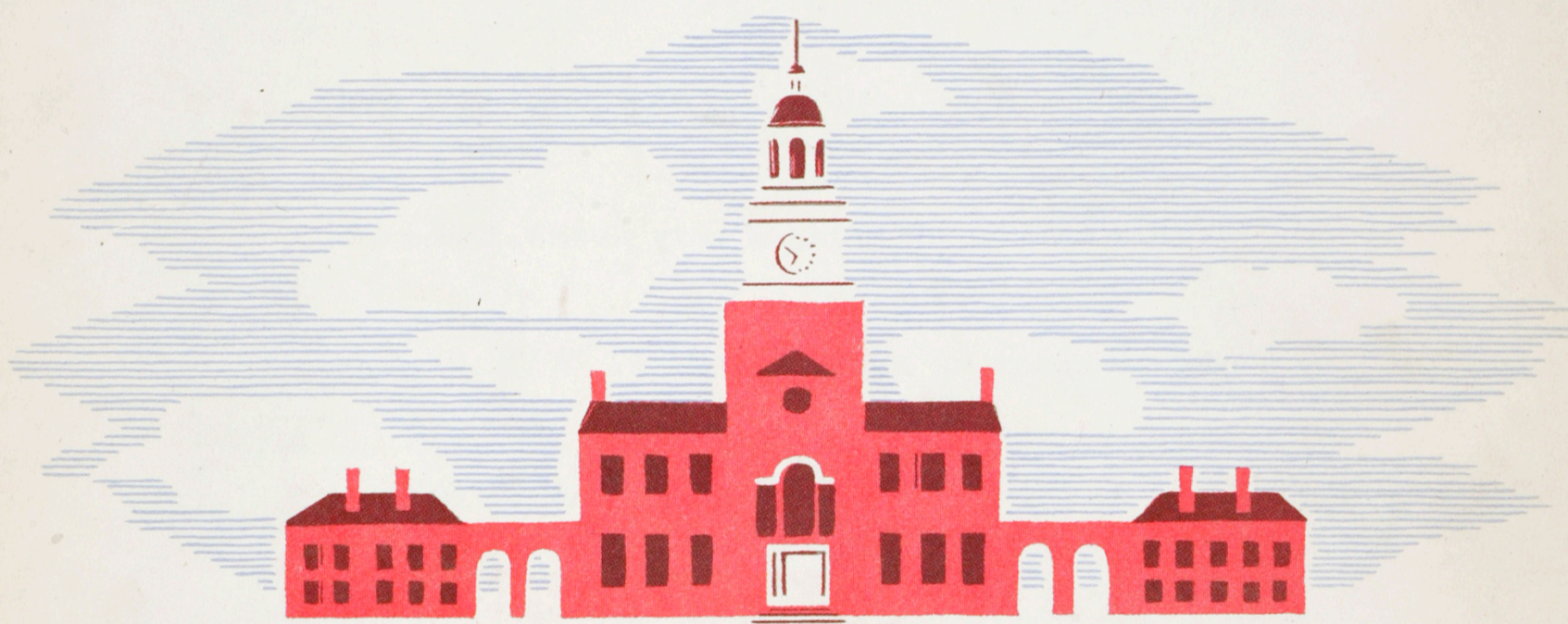

Riverside School Leading in Scrap

Trucks Will be Out Wednesday

Riverside school children seemed to be leading in the scrap drive contest, according to figures released Tuesday afternoon by Superintendent of Schools Harry Huston.

The six companies of the Riverside regiment had brought in three tons of scrap in addition one and one-half ton of paper.

Other buildings averaged a ton to the building, Huston said.

Wednesday is truck day, but the trucks will make only those places where large piles of scrap have been located.

No street or door-to-door canvass will be made.

Any person, however, having large quantities of scrap may call school authorities at the building they wish to have credit and the material will be picked up by a truck.

Smaller amounts will be picked up personally by students and pupils.

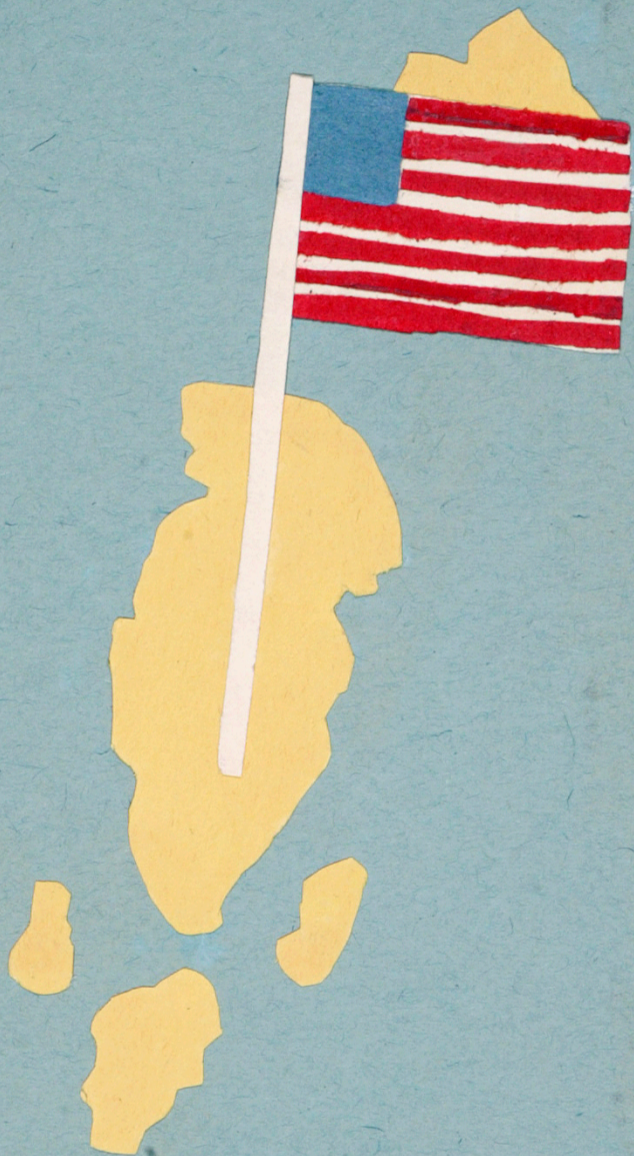

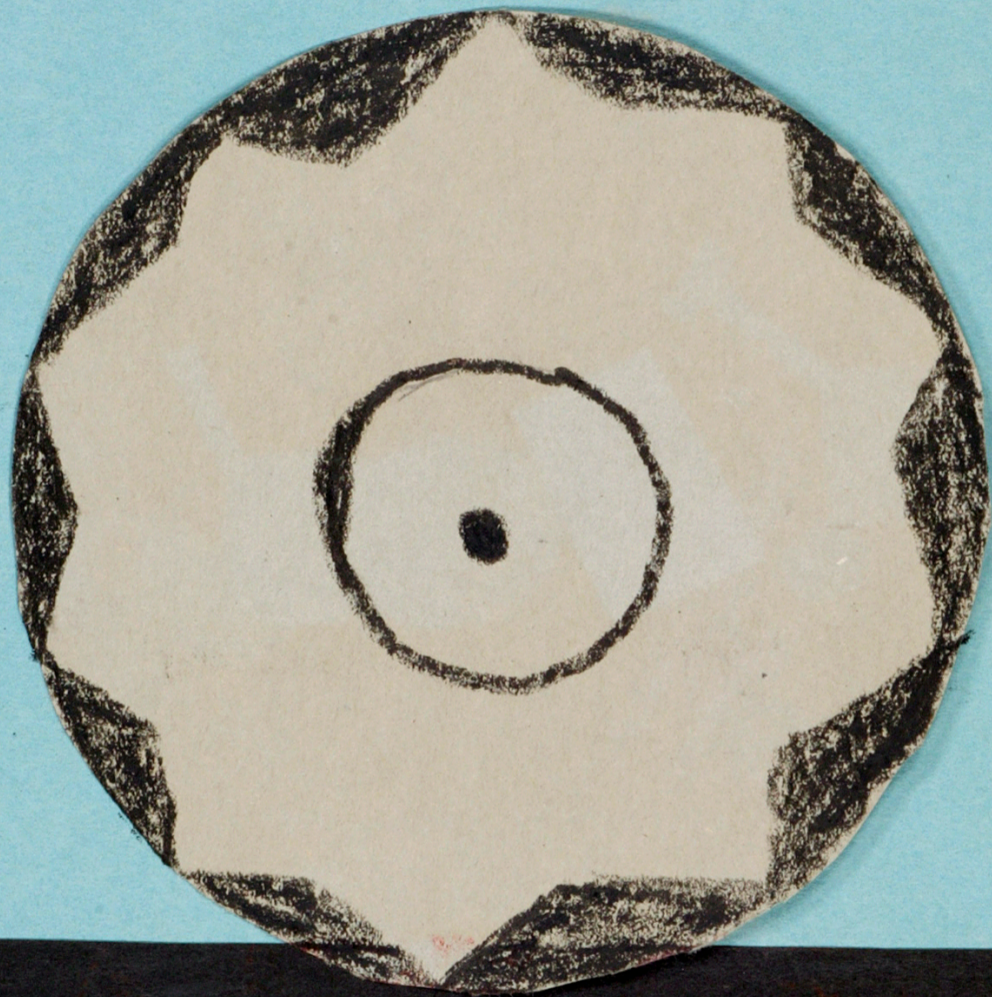

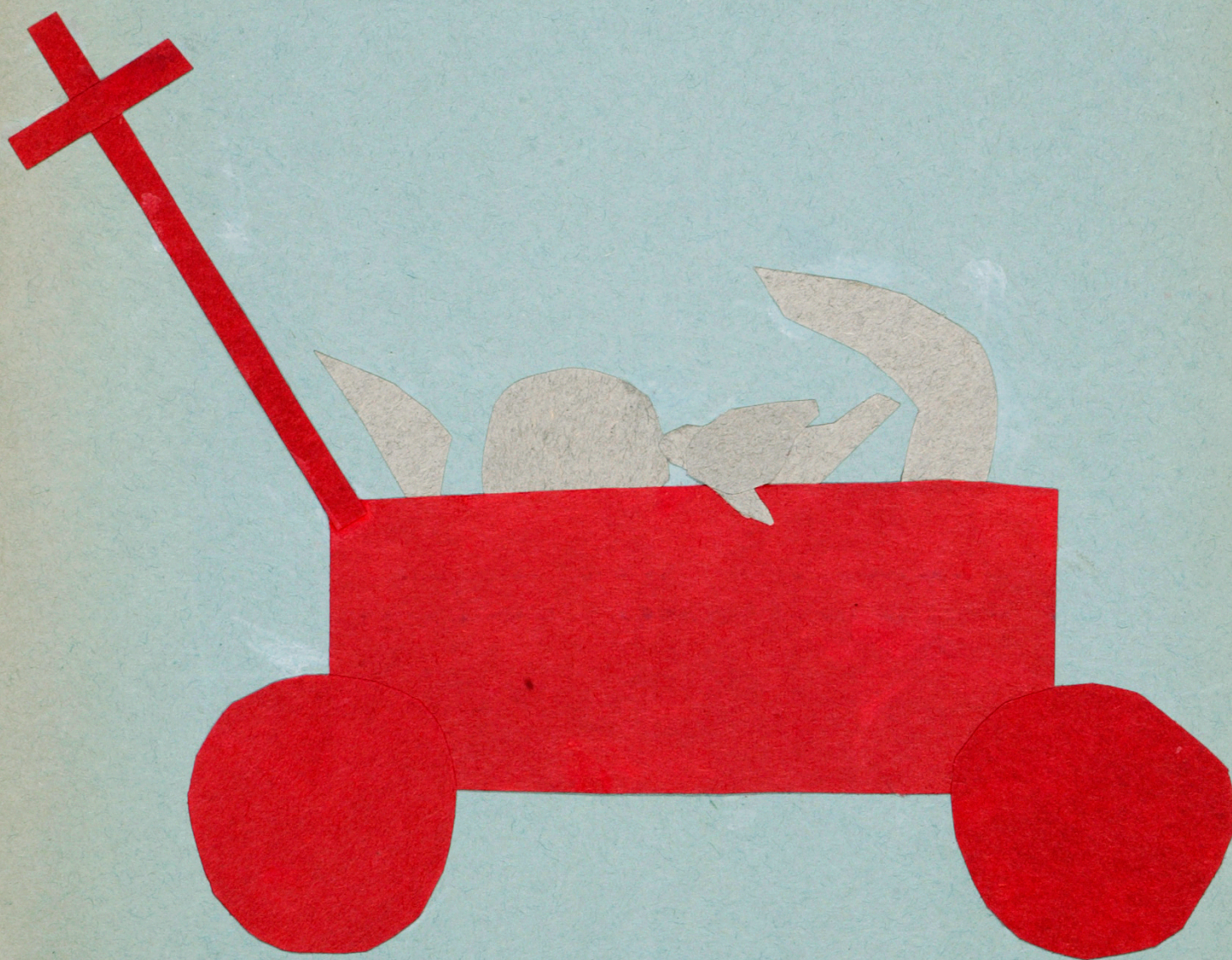
