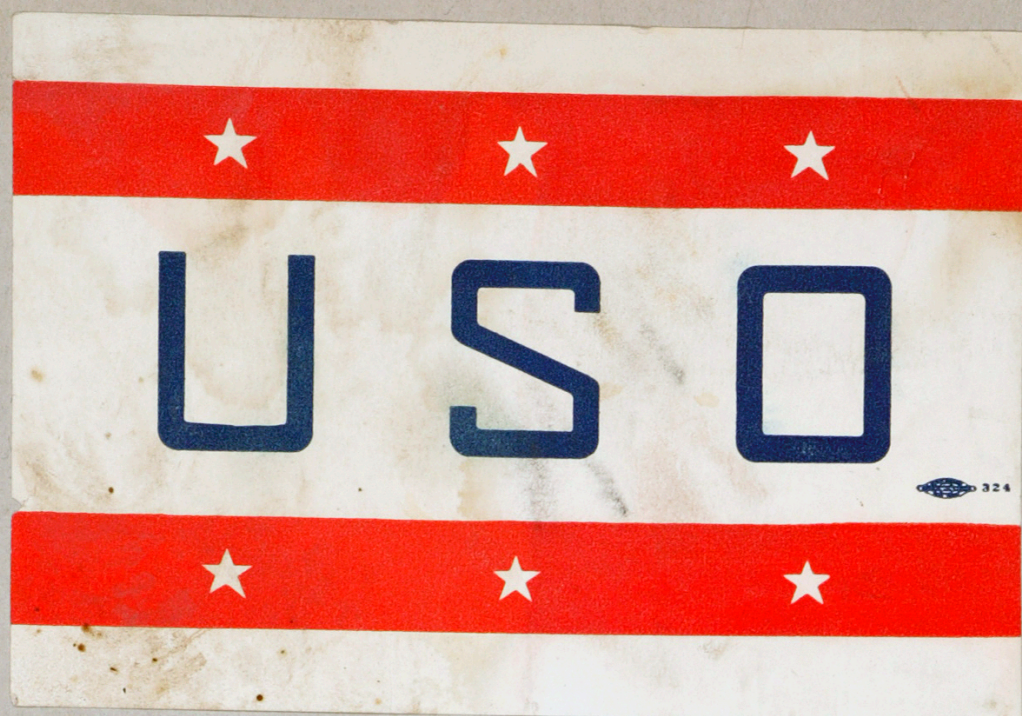

money to help buy things for boys in camp.

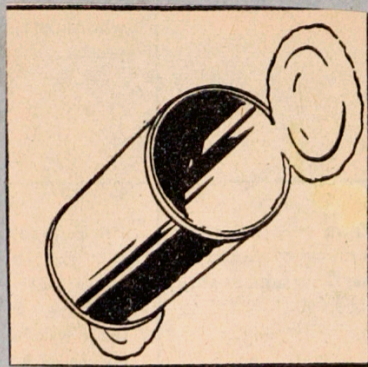

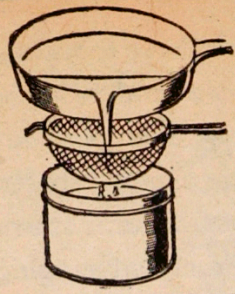

with them.





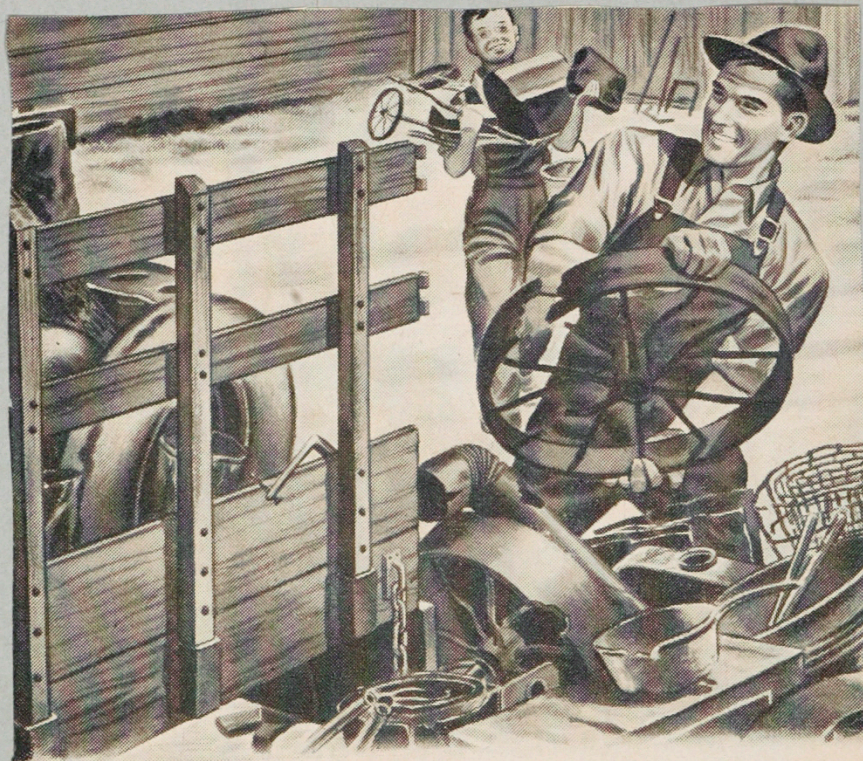
Waste Fats

are being saved to help out in our explosives.

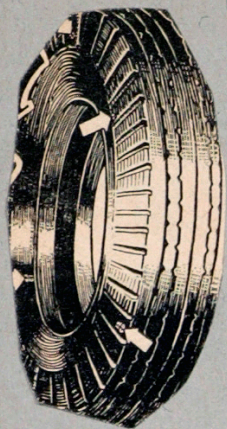
It is taken to town whenever any mother gets a pound or so & left at the meat market, so it will be handy for the Gov. to collect.

SCRAP

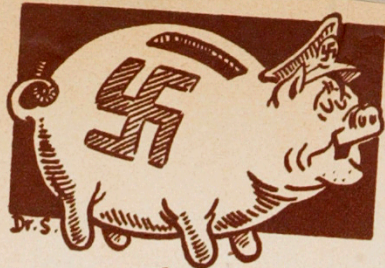
The boys of ginks of Dist. # 3
