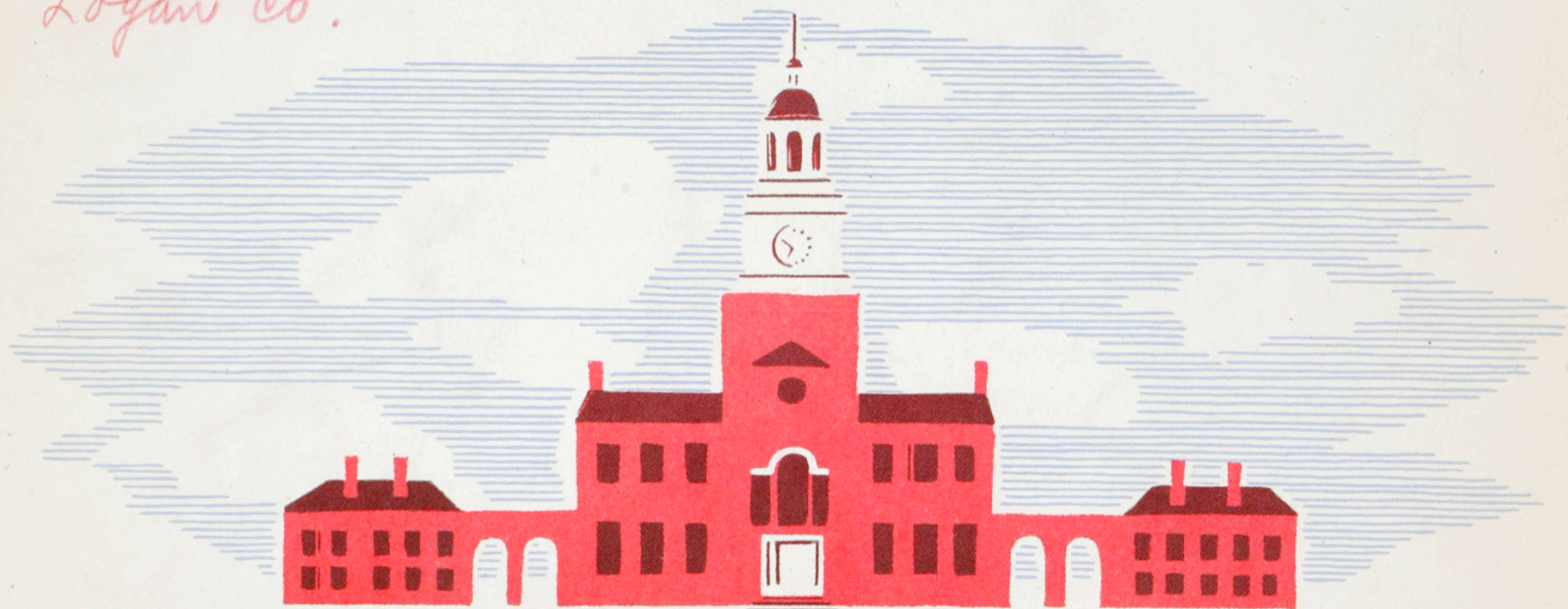

Clara Barton

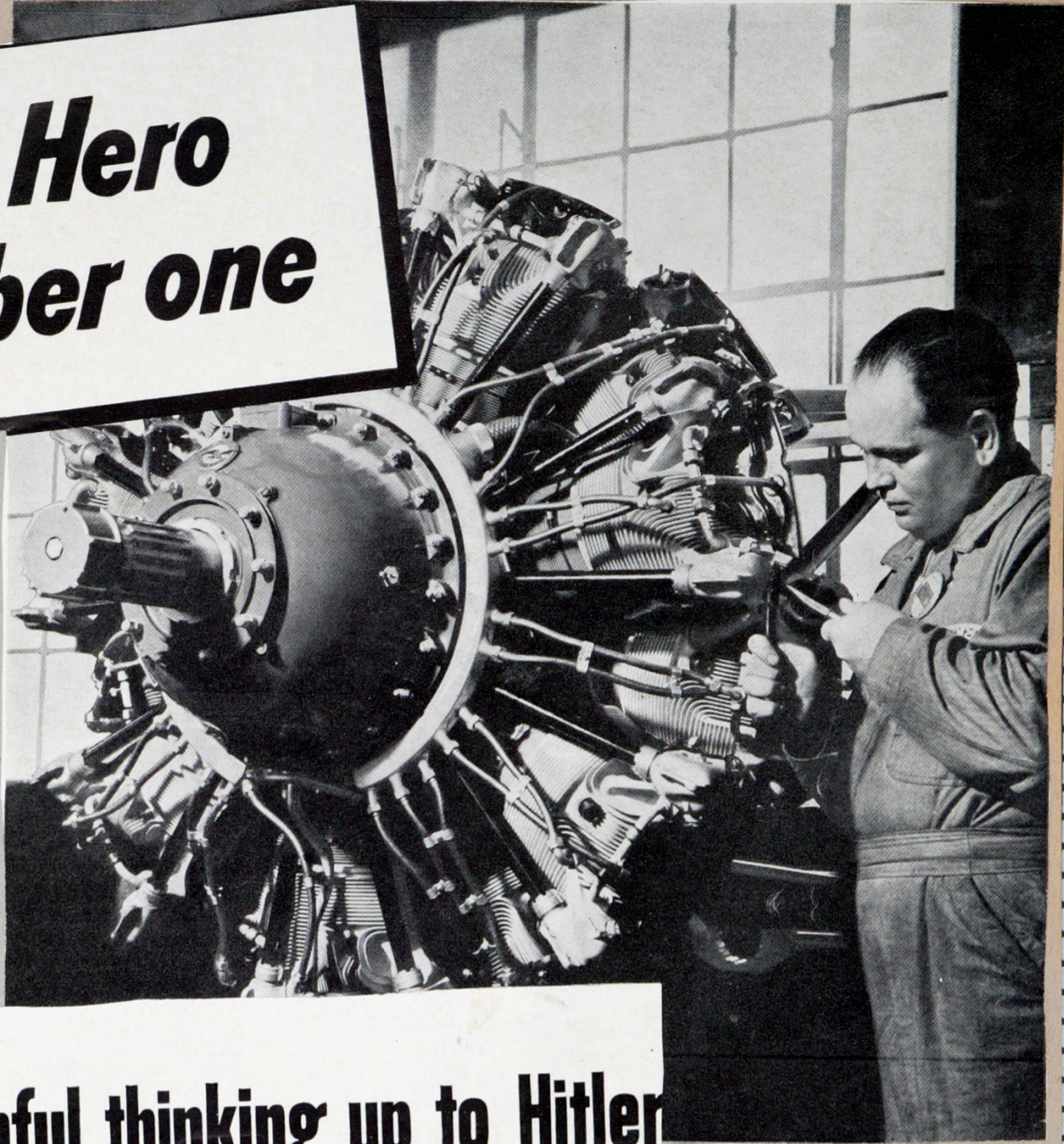
The life of Clara Barton was filled with adventure. She traveled all over the world feeding those who had nothing to eat and caring for those who were sick and wounded.

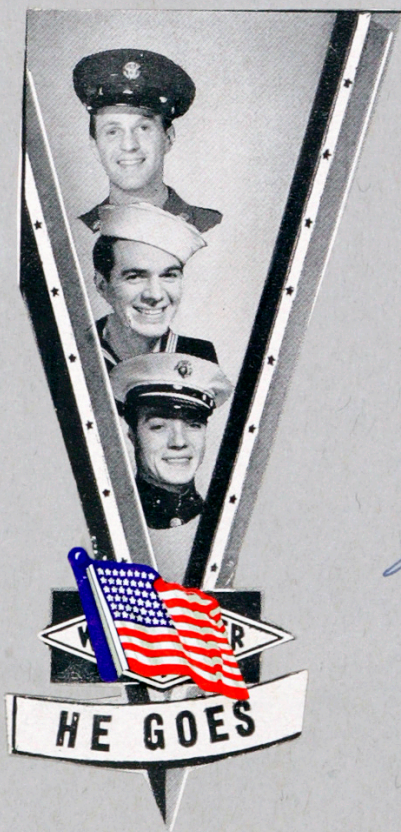

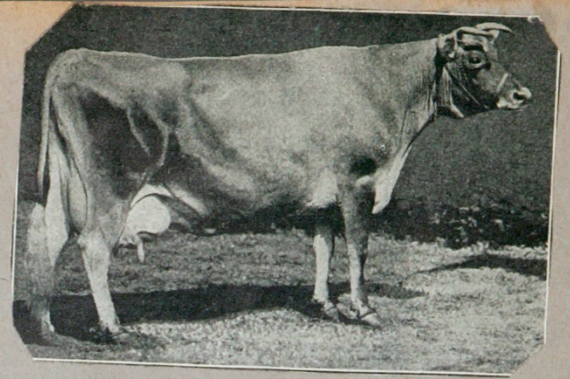
