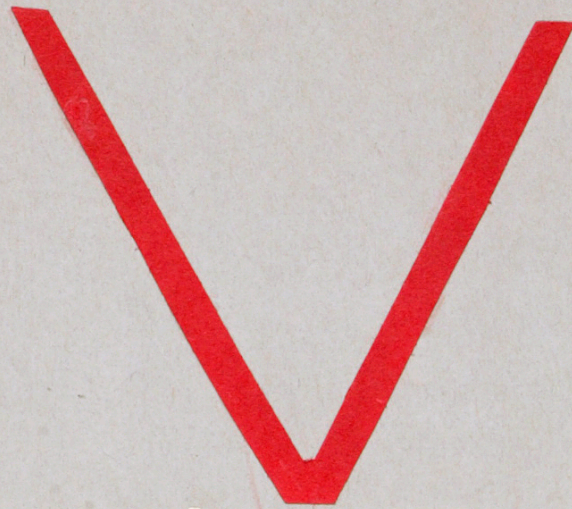

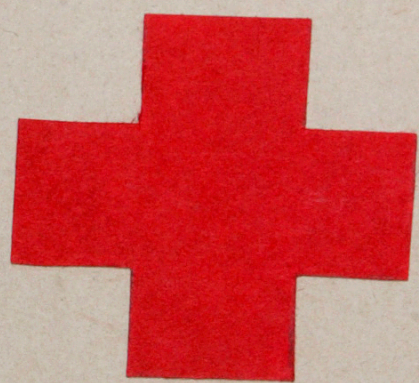

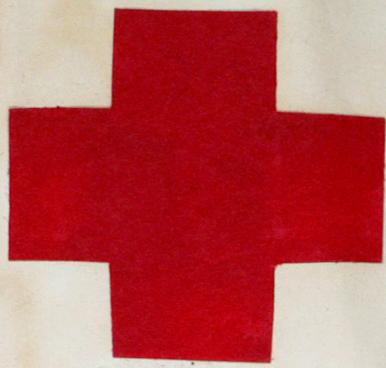

Red Cross Carnival

The Carnival was held November 20, 1942. In which all profit was turned over to the Red Cross.

The decorations were red, white and blue.

There was a number of interesting games and sideshows to be seen. Games were: Bingo, where an assortment of interesting prizes were given. There were three shelves of prizes. The first game a person won, the prize was taken from the first shelf. If you won two or three games, the first prize won was traded in for prizes from second and third shelves. A fishing pool was also run. The prizes were put in the bottom of a tub, and they were fished out with fishing poles. An "Old County Store" was an interesting event, the

prizes were numbered, each one with a different number. Numbers were also put in a jar. You drew a number and you would get the prize with the same number. The usual penny toss was also run.

Sideshowes to be seen were the following: "For Women Only", "For Men Only", "The First Wearing Apparel of Man", and "See the Ground Hog and Bat". There was also a moving picture "The First Thanksgiving". The scenes were drawn by the school. A few of the scenes were: "The Landing of the Pilgrims", "Building of the Log Cabins", "Colonists and Indian War", "The Planting of the Crops", "Reaping the Harvest" and the "First Thanksgiving".

Chances on a turkey were sold. The turkey was put in a crate that everyone might see him. A blanket was given for the prize of guessing on

beans. Everyone was very interested in these two happenings.

Madam Akava "Knows All, Tells All", was the fortune teller.

A Defense Stamp Walk was held instead of the usual cake walk. Twenty-five cent Defense Stamps were given to the winner of the Defense Stamp Walk.

Pictures were taken during the evening. The pictures were very amusing, a monkey was the picture. If a couple had their picture taken, two monkeys together were given them.

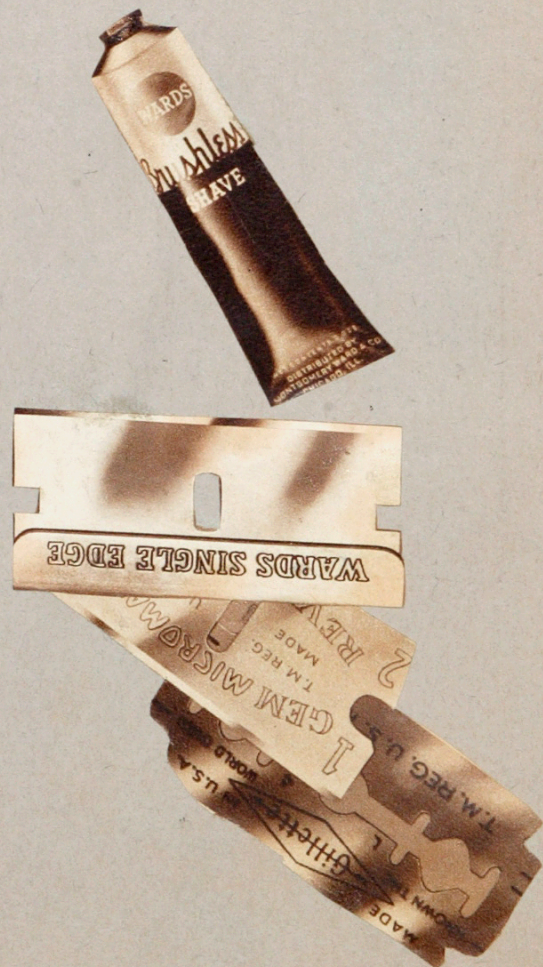
Delicious refreshments of hamburgers, pie, doughnuts and coffee were served by some of the women of the district.

Profit of the carnival was thirty-six dollars and forty cents (\$36.40). This was turned over to the Junior Red Cross.

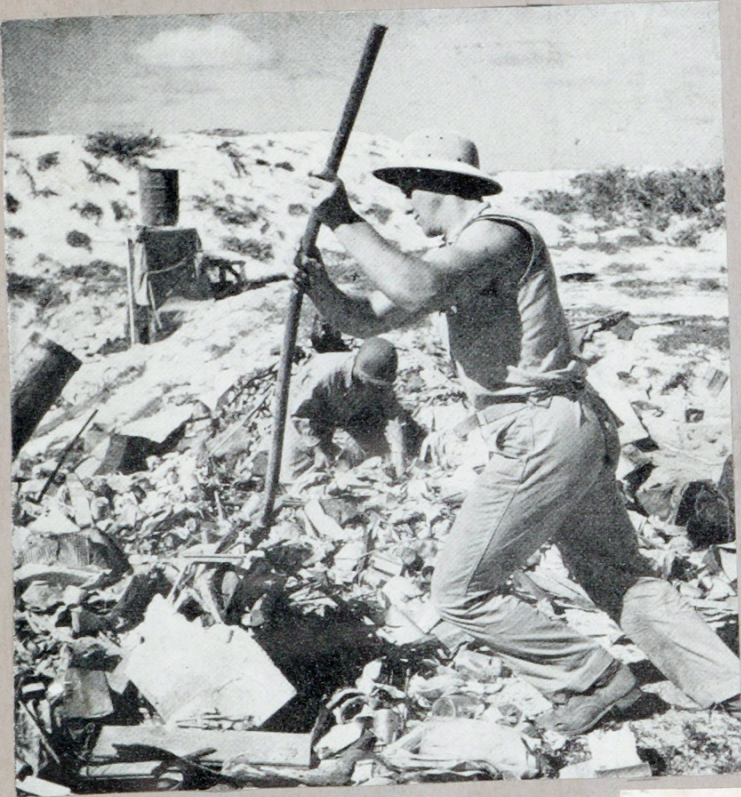
