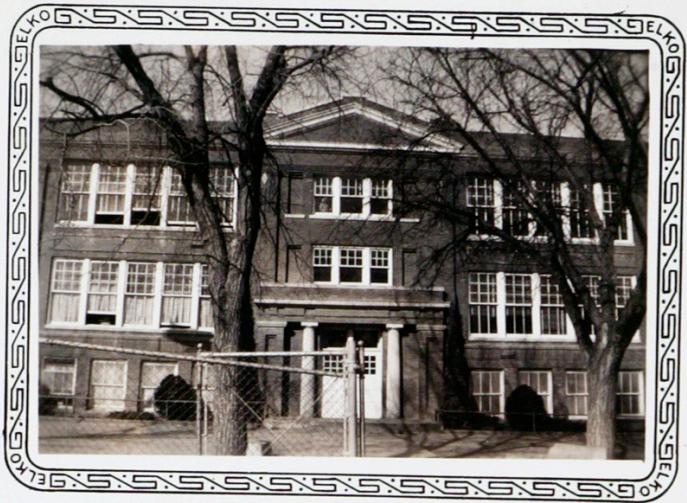

"Scrap Drive"

The pupils of Glenwood School took a very active part in the scrap drive. Most of the scrap was brought to the school by the children then delivered to the dealer. They raised about eighty dollars (\$80.00) that was turned over to the Glenwood Parent Teachers' organization.

Others sold their own scrap and bought defense stamps with the money. All pupils and teachers worked very enthusiastically throughout the campaign. Everyone was glad to be able to participate and help out as much as they possibly could.

"Defense Stamps"

Most all the pupils of our school are buying regularly of defense stamps. Some of the pupils buy them at different places down in town of which we have no record. The pupils and teachers together have purchased \$619.50 of stamps and bonds the first part of this year.

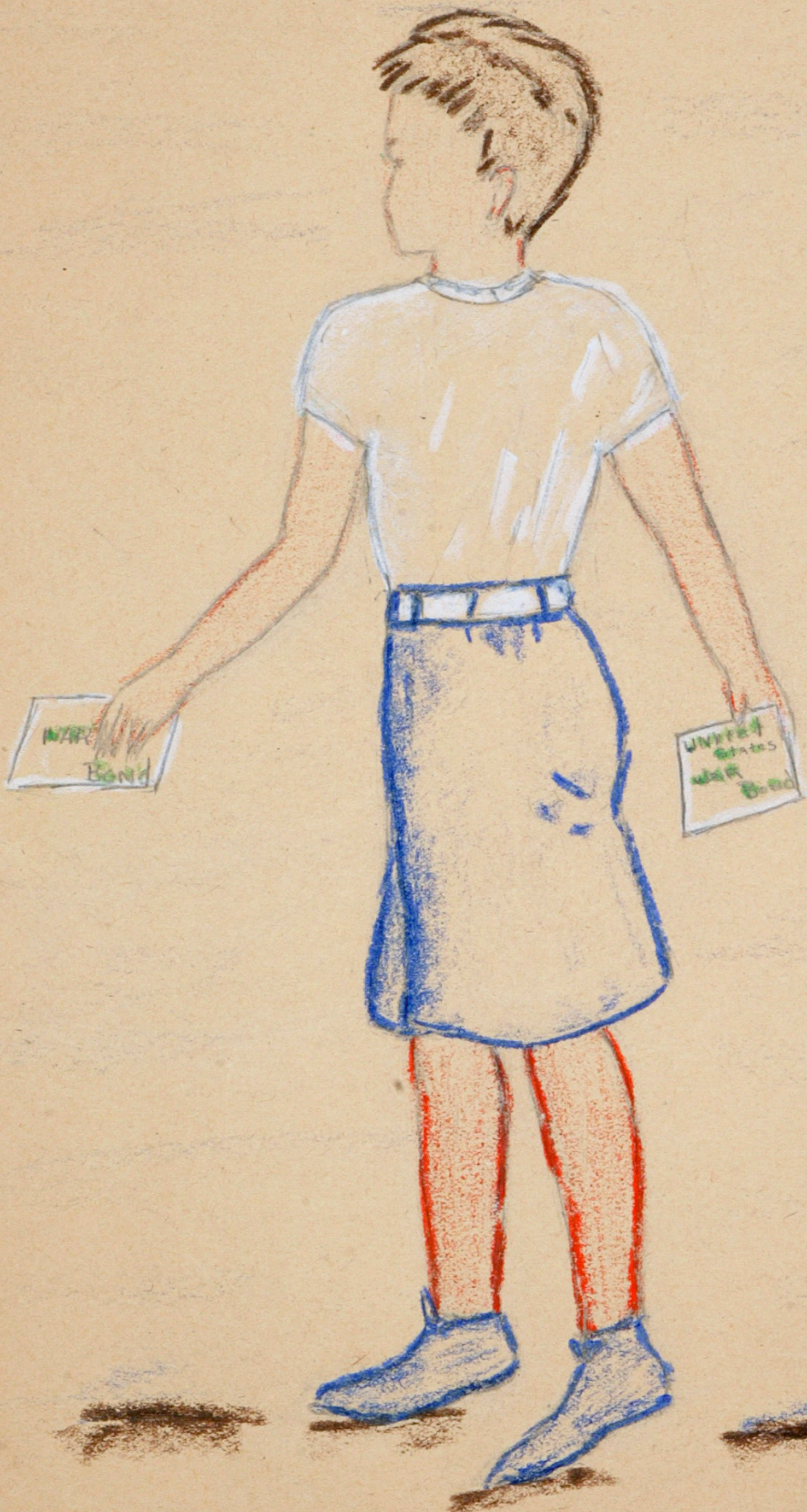

The above boys and girls buy defense stamps regularly at school.

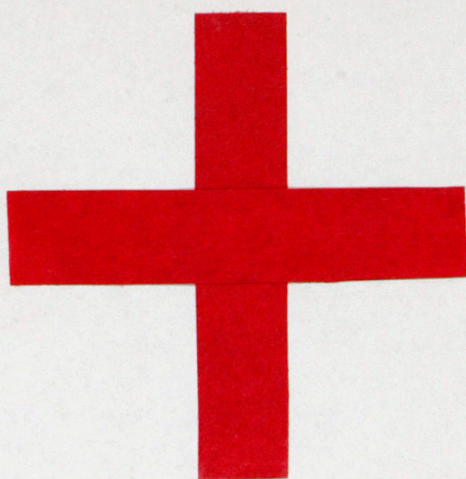


The above boys and girls have bought one or more bonds.

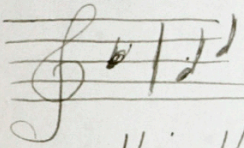

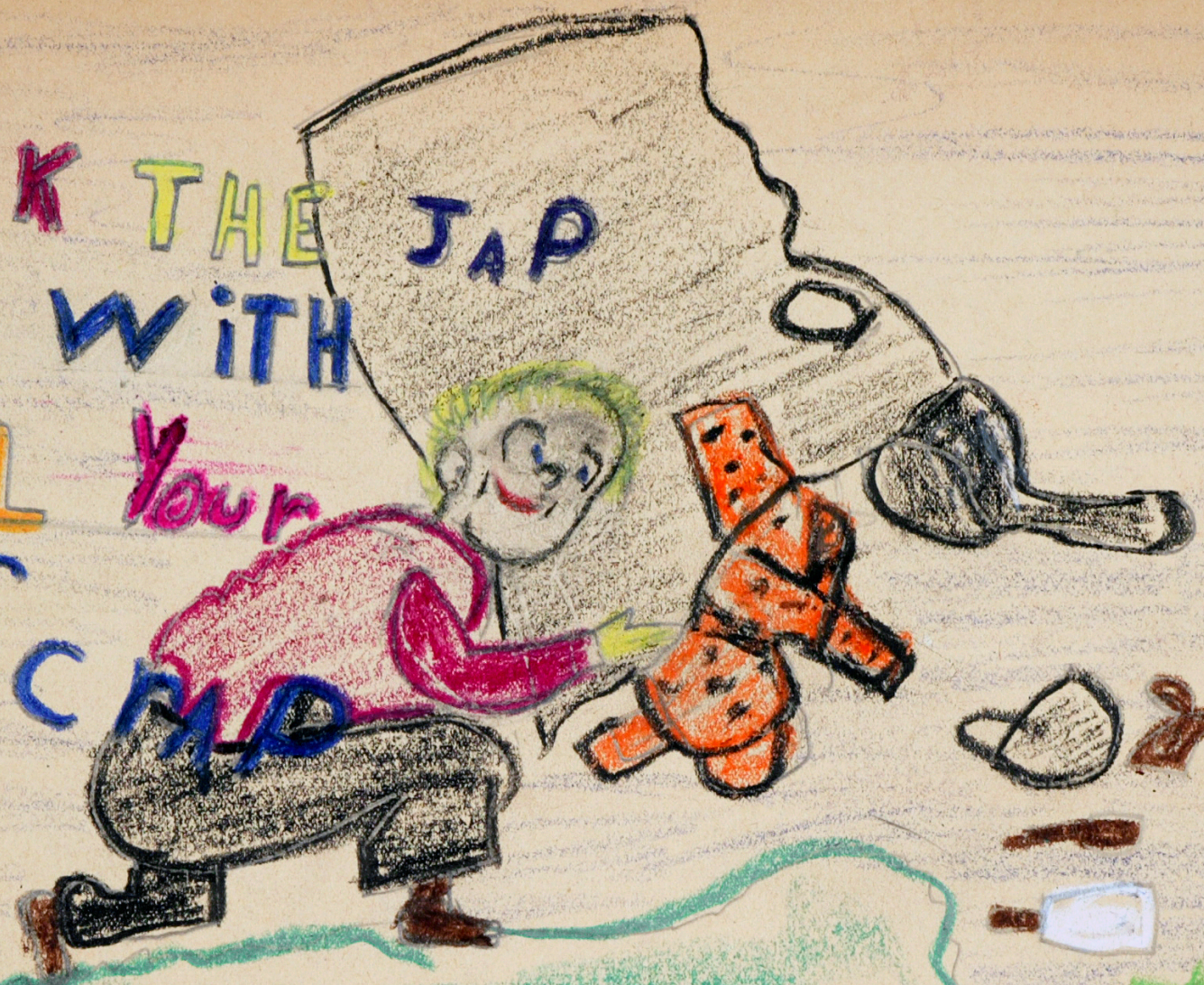
