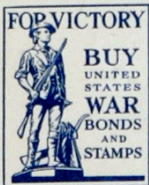

Mrs Witt is the girls coach.

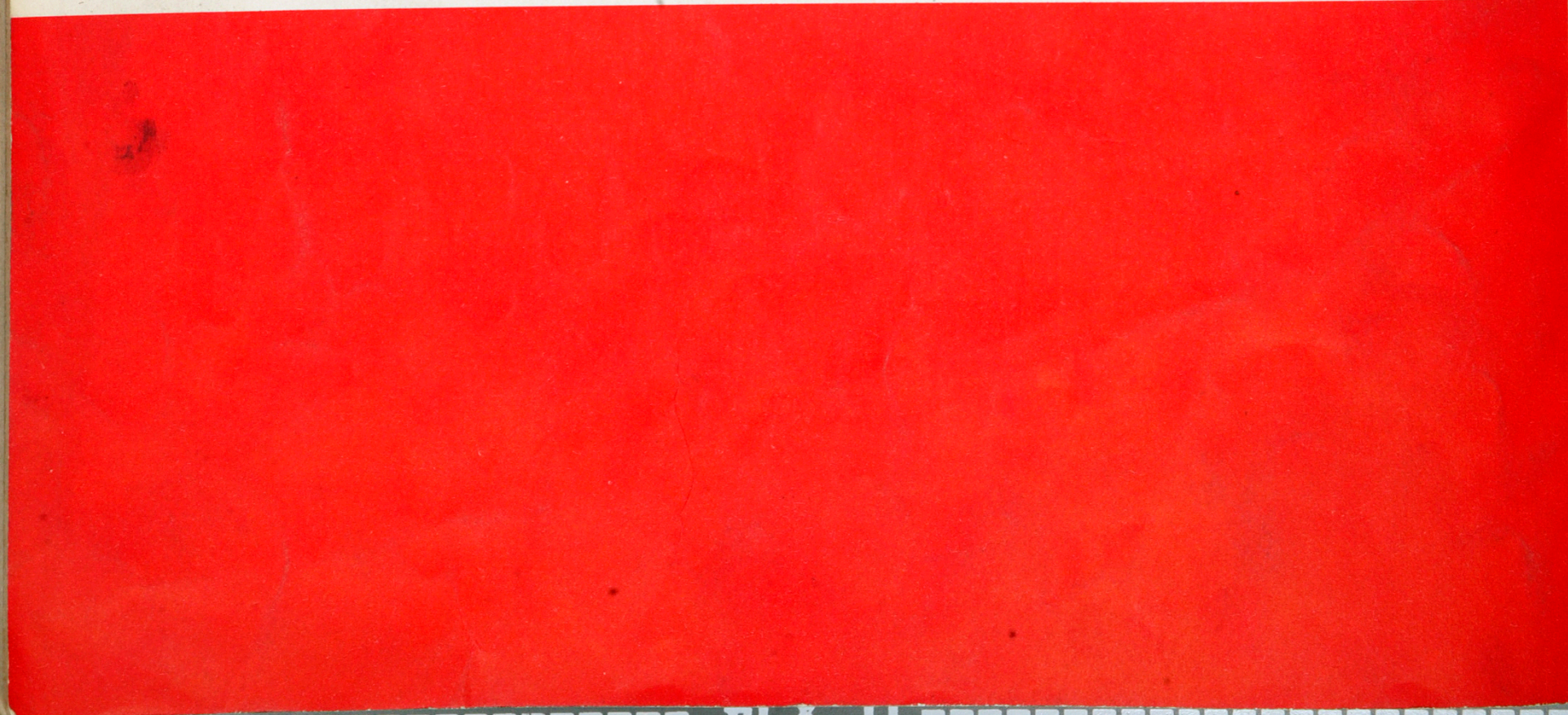
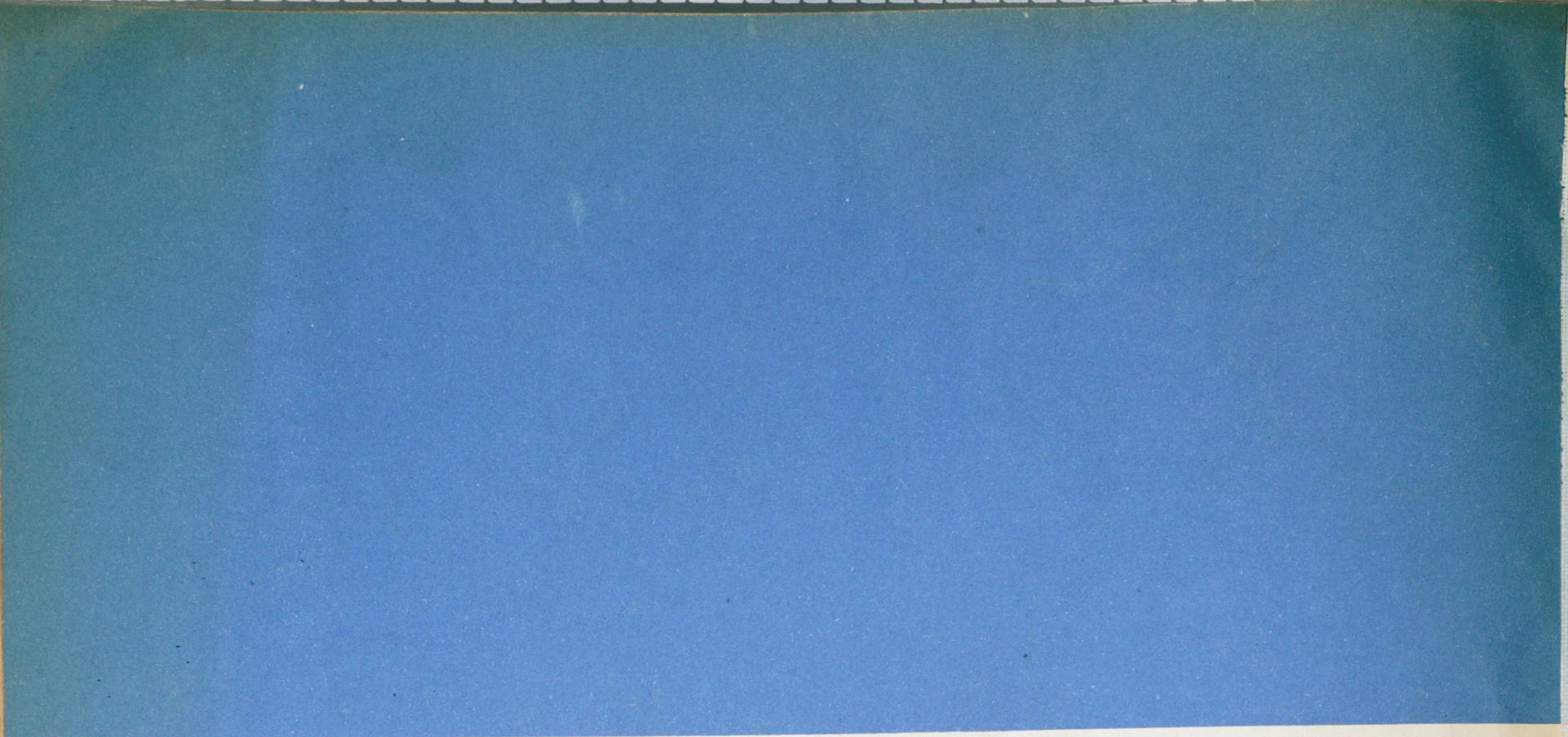
