The Junior Red Cross.

The Coalgate Grant School enrolled in the Junior Red Cross with a hundred per cent membership for the years of 1941-'42.

All rooms of this particular school re-enrolled when the membership drive was made again in the fall of 1942.

The members of the Junior Red Cross have been busily engaged in working out the projects which were assigned by the Central office in St. Louis, Missouri.

These articles, which are made by the boys and girls of the American Junior Red Cross organizations, are to be used in veterans' hospitals.

"The Junior Red Cross occupies a significant place in the war work which is being carried on by our Great Nation and the members are striving to assume their share of responsibility in providing comfort to our men in service".

The above fact is emphasized when we check the work being done as follows:

- 1) The boys and girls knitting an Afghan

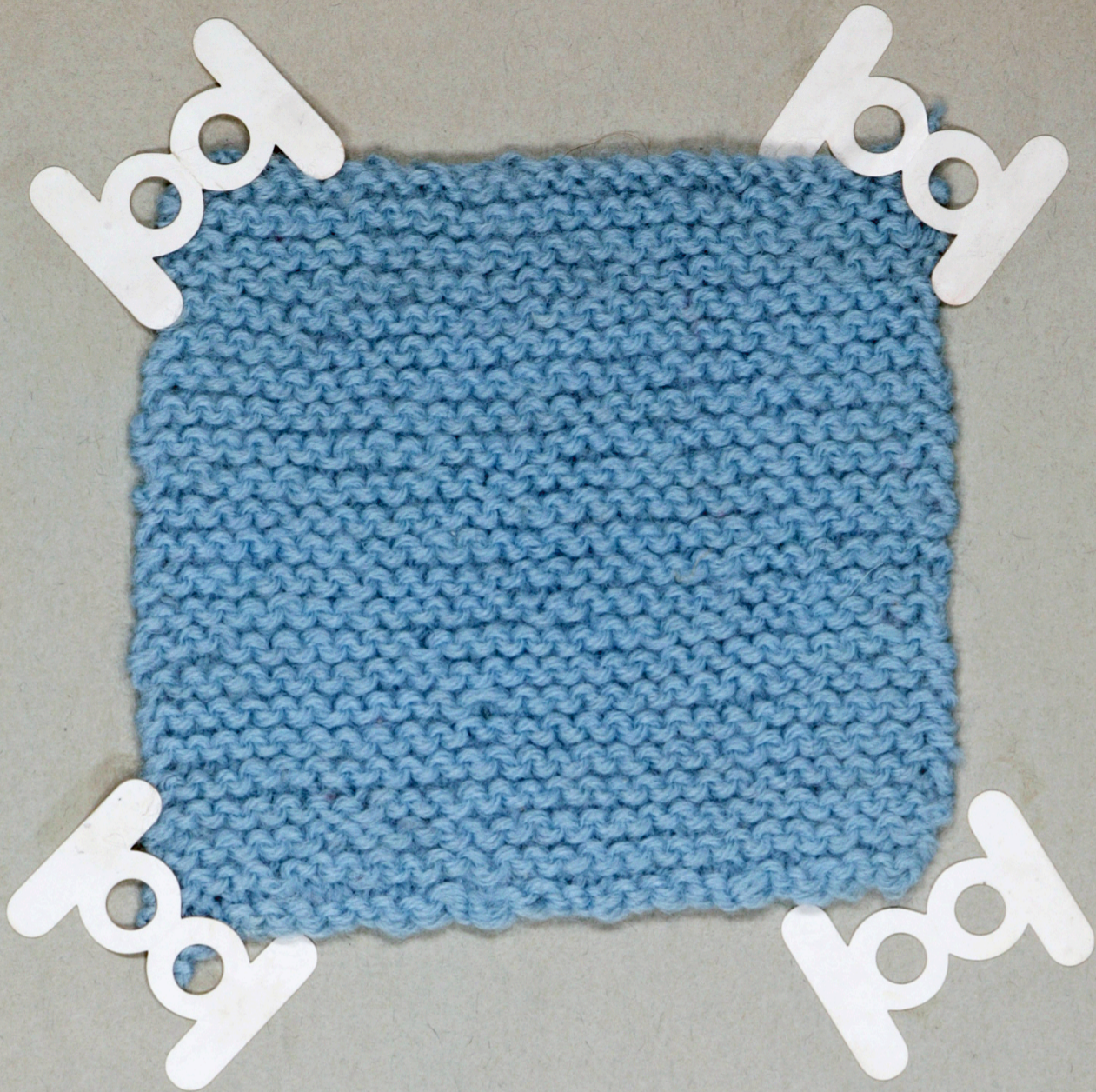
- from material purchased by themselves.
2. Scrap books made up of cartoons, jokes, stories, etc.
 3. Cross-word puzzles and their solutions mounted on Manila paper.
 4. The making of bean bags and bean boards to be used as a means of recreation for the men recuperating.
 5. The making of table favors, place cards and tray covers for the month of February. These were shipped to the "Enid Flying School" at Enid, Oklahoma.

The following illustrate some of the work which has been mentioned above.

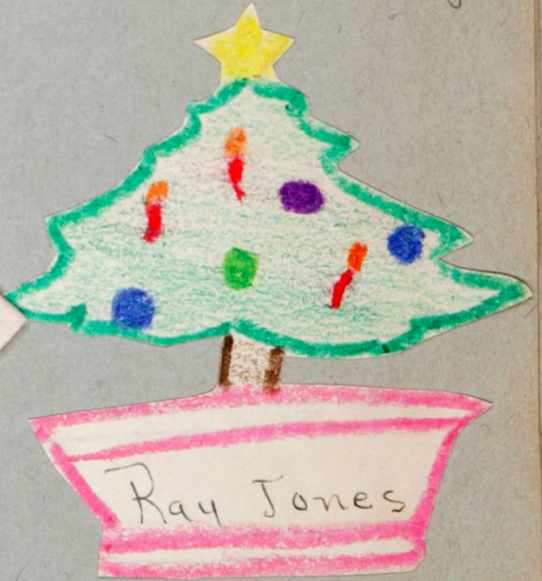
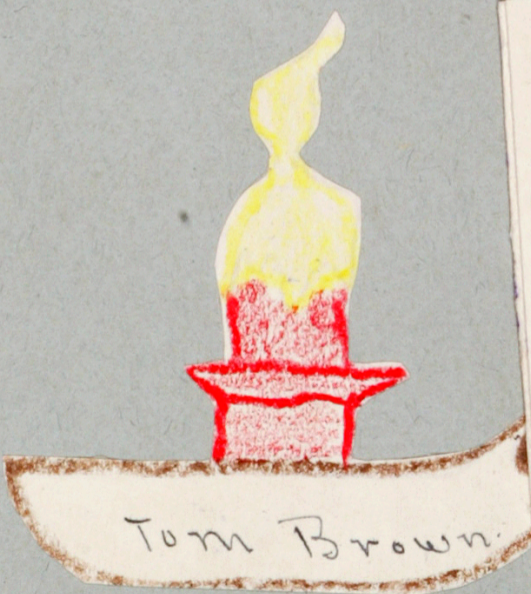
1. An Afghan made by blocks 6" square and the finished article measuring 4' x 6'.

This article has been knitted from bright hues of yarn and will have a crocheted edge of black around it.

Shipment will be made to the destination assigned by the Central office.

Place cards - These aid in developing original ideas by the children.

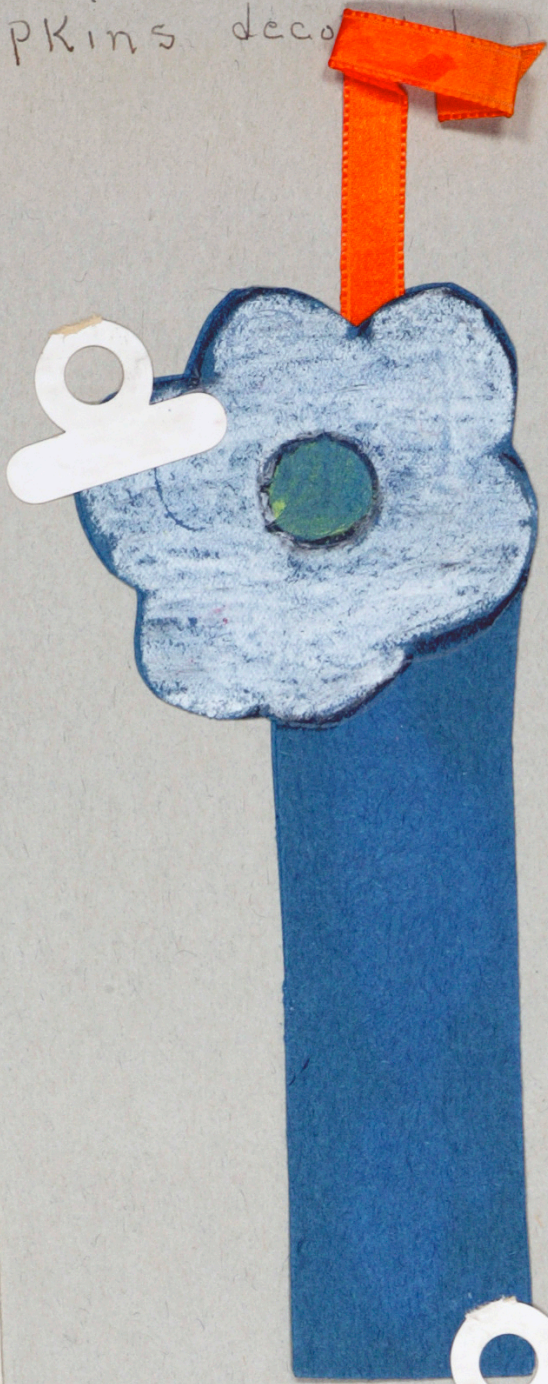

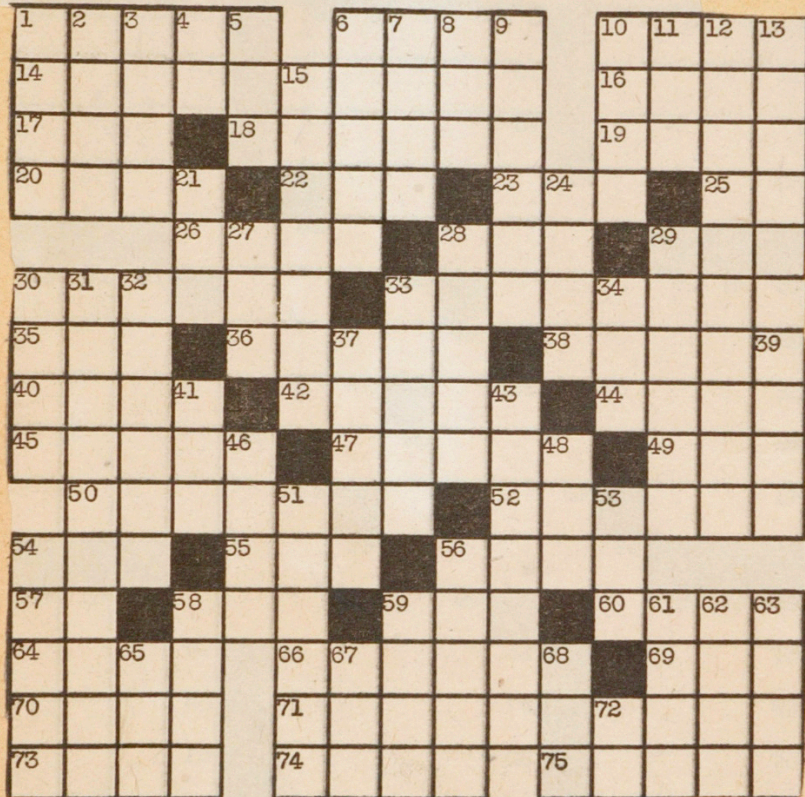
