Report on Stamps.

This is only the money for war stamps from my 16 pupils.

Fourteen of my pupils have \$.10 war stamp books

The five primary I have bought \$7.50 of War Stamps.

The one second grade has bought \$.50 of War Stamps.

The two third grade have bought \$2.20 War Stamps. One of these has been in school here four weeks. He was buying stamps at the other school, which was near German, Oklahoma. I don't have the record of his purchases before coming here.

We haven't any 4th graders.

The one fifth grader has purchased \$1.50 of War Stamps.

The three sixth graders have purchased \$.40 of War Stamps.

one of the sixth graders & one of the seventh graders have a \$18.75 Bond together.

The other seventh grader has purchased \$.40 of War Stamps.

The two eighth Graders have purchased \$8.90 of War Stamps.

The program for buying War Stamps wasn't started until Nov 1st 1942.

we also entered the scrap drive. \$1.44 of Scrap was gathered from the School Ground and given to the pupils by Mr. A. W. Bentley. It was scrap he had overlooked when gathering the scrap before from his farms.

Two of the pupils gather 3650 lb of scrap, but their father failed to get the Receipt. One of the boys sold 860 lb. one other sold 1090 lb. Making a total of 5600 lb. None of this was turned in on the contest because of lack of Receipts.

We are trying in every way possible to 'Do Our Part'.

We are trying to entertain the Community to make it possible to save Gas and Rubber.

we are starting our drive on old stockings.

Being a small farm community we haven't been able to do much. But each pupil is helping on the farms which is one of the best ~~thing~~ jobs they could do.

our motto - 'Do our Best'

Each pupil in our room belongs to the Red Cross.
