Jesse Schwader bought twenty-five \$0.10 stamps.

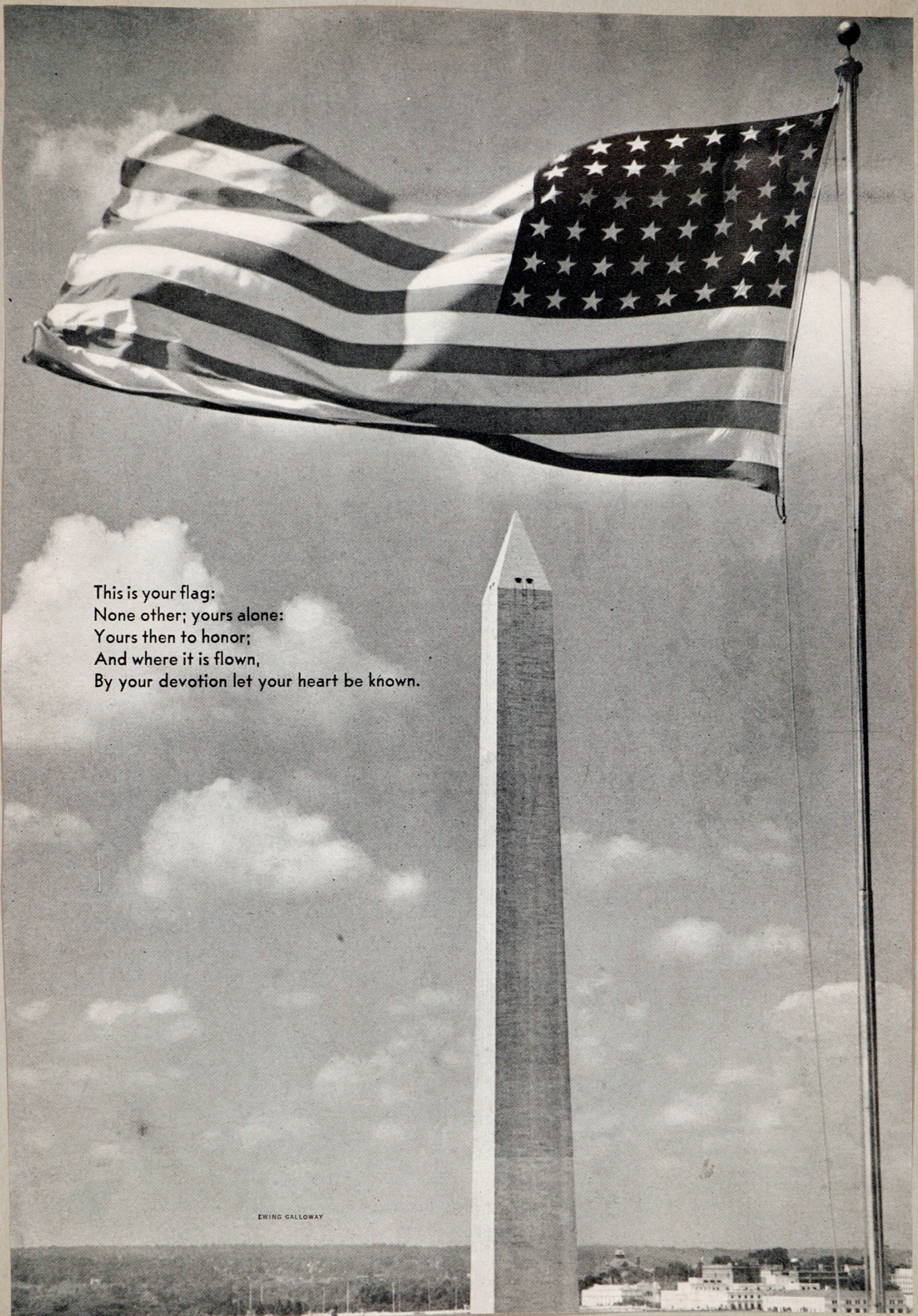
He went for a scrap drive, and took lots of iron to the Beaver County Scrap Salvage Depot. He took some rubber too, but not very much.

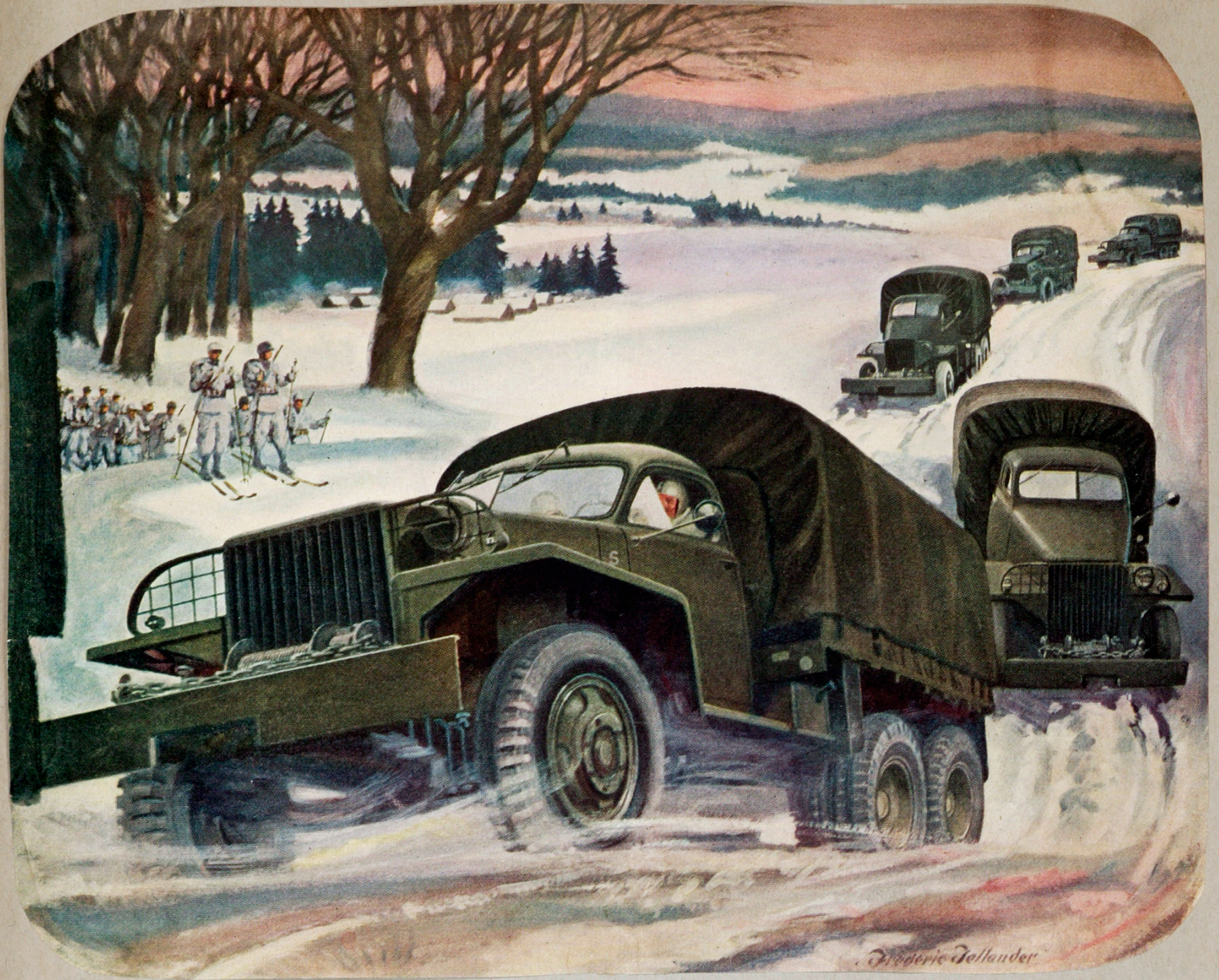

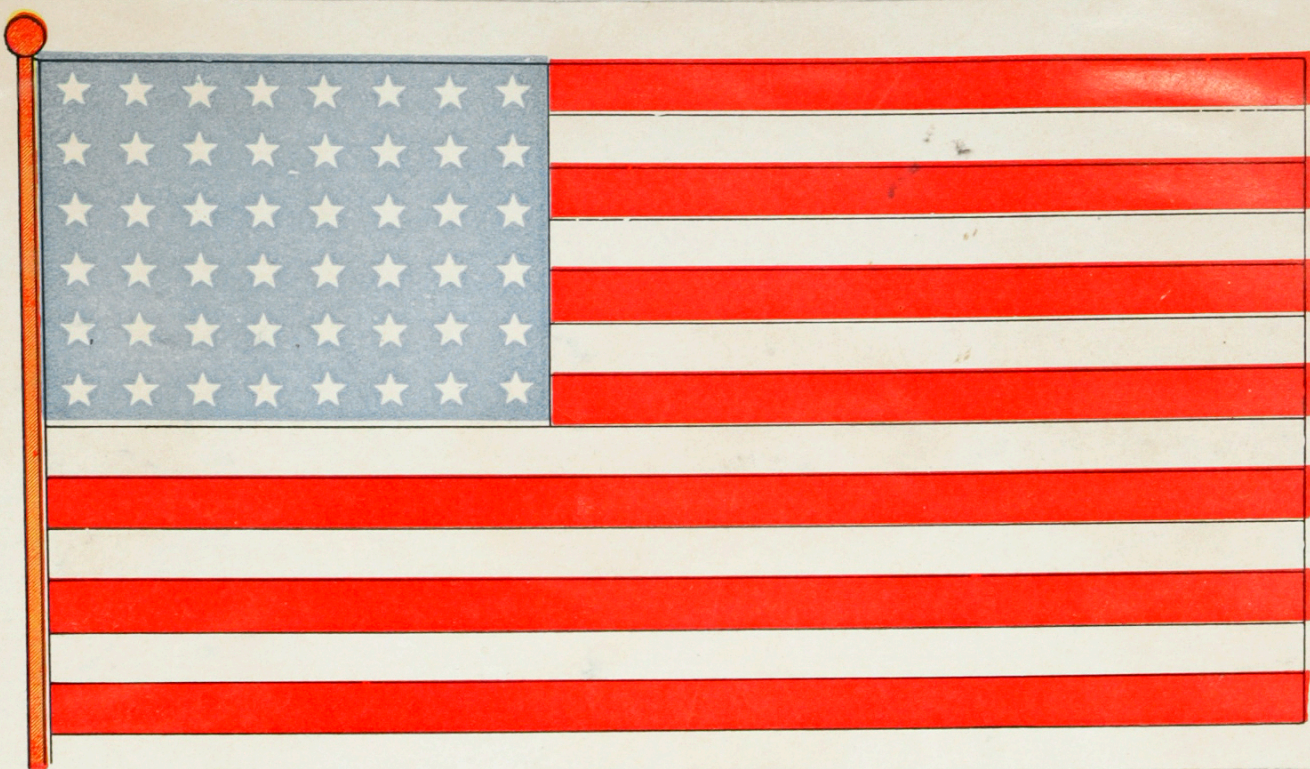

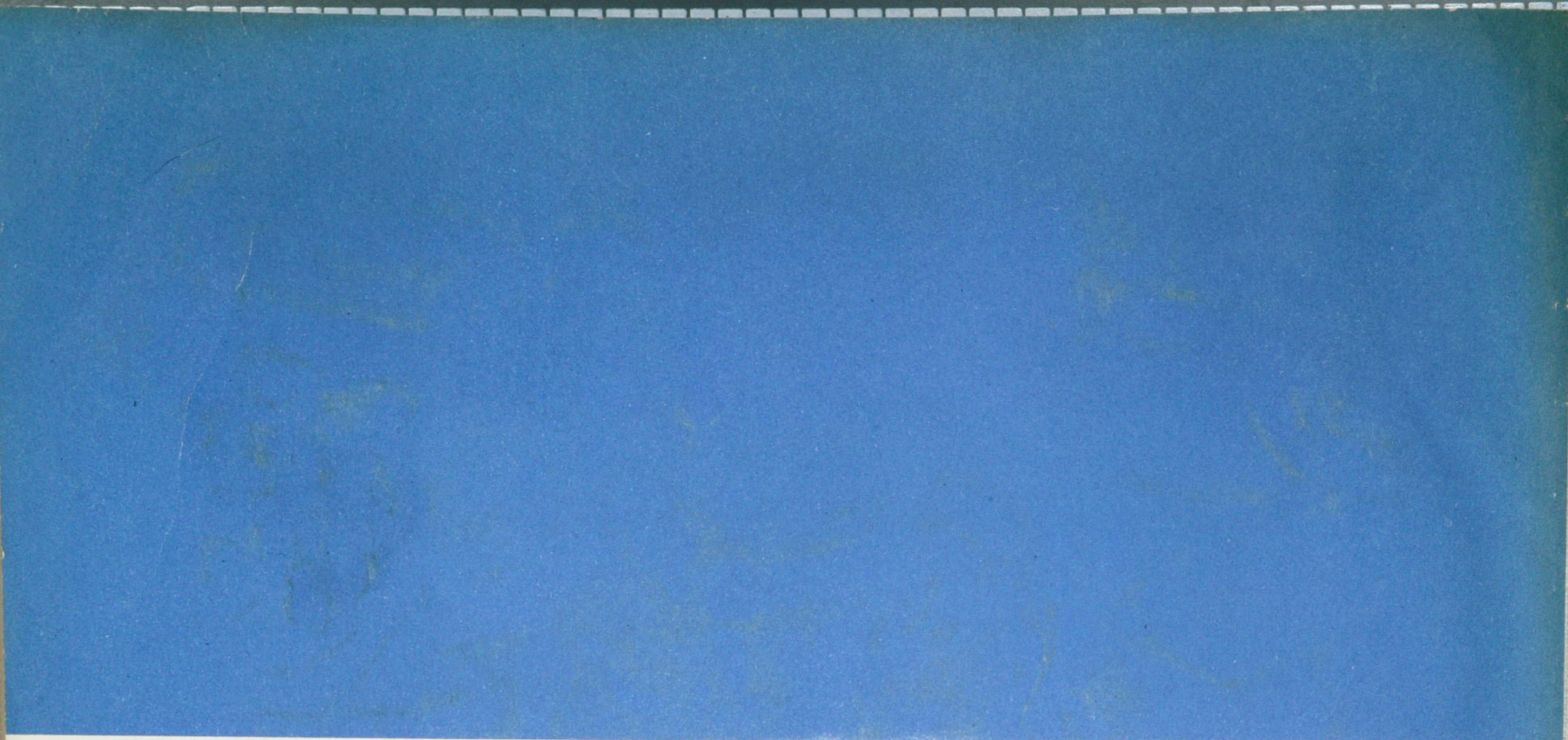
