50¢ to enroll the room in the Junior Red
Cross November 4, 1942.

School pupils sold 3,822 pounds of
scrap iron in October 1942, with a per capita
average of 424 pounds.

Friday afternoon October 16 was set aside as
a scrap holiday. Pupils used the time to
collect and load scrap. Patrons hauled the
scrap to Glencoe for salvage pile.
3,822 pounds were collected during the scrap
drive and 1350 pounds were added in Nov.
making a total of 5,170 pounds or an average
of 517 pounds per child up to November 30, 1942.

to sell.

 4. Sold one Cat fish Caught in Creek to Negro Cotton pickers in Sept for 25¢.
 5. Sold Scrap iron in October. \$4.72
 6. Errand for Teacher bringing warrant for four months. 40¢ - 10 cents per month.
 7. Cleaning school Cellar .05¢
