At the January P. T. A. Meeting we entertained with a

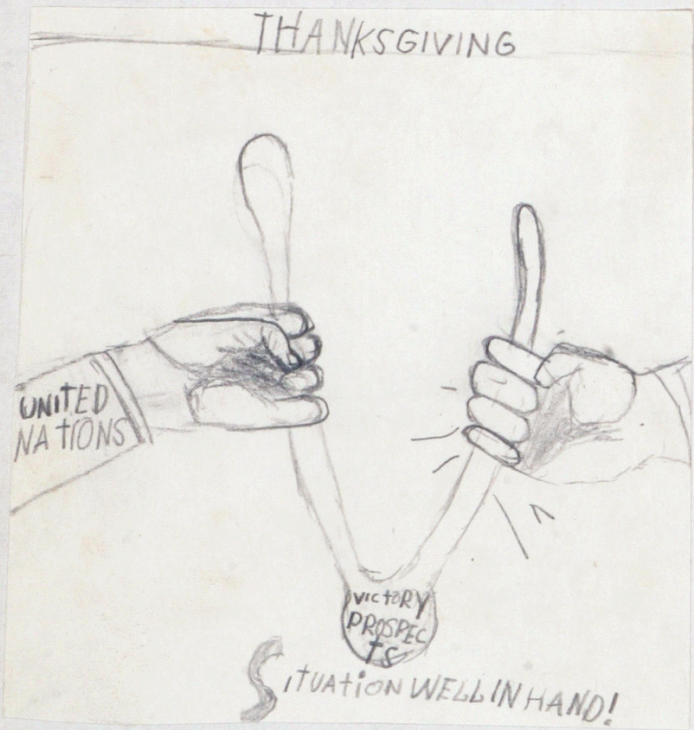
Musical Program consisting of Patriotic songs we have learned.

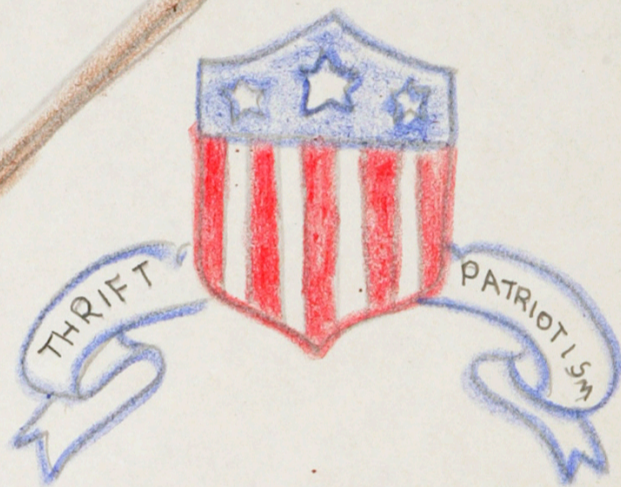

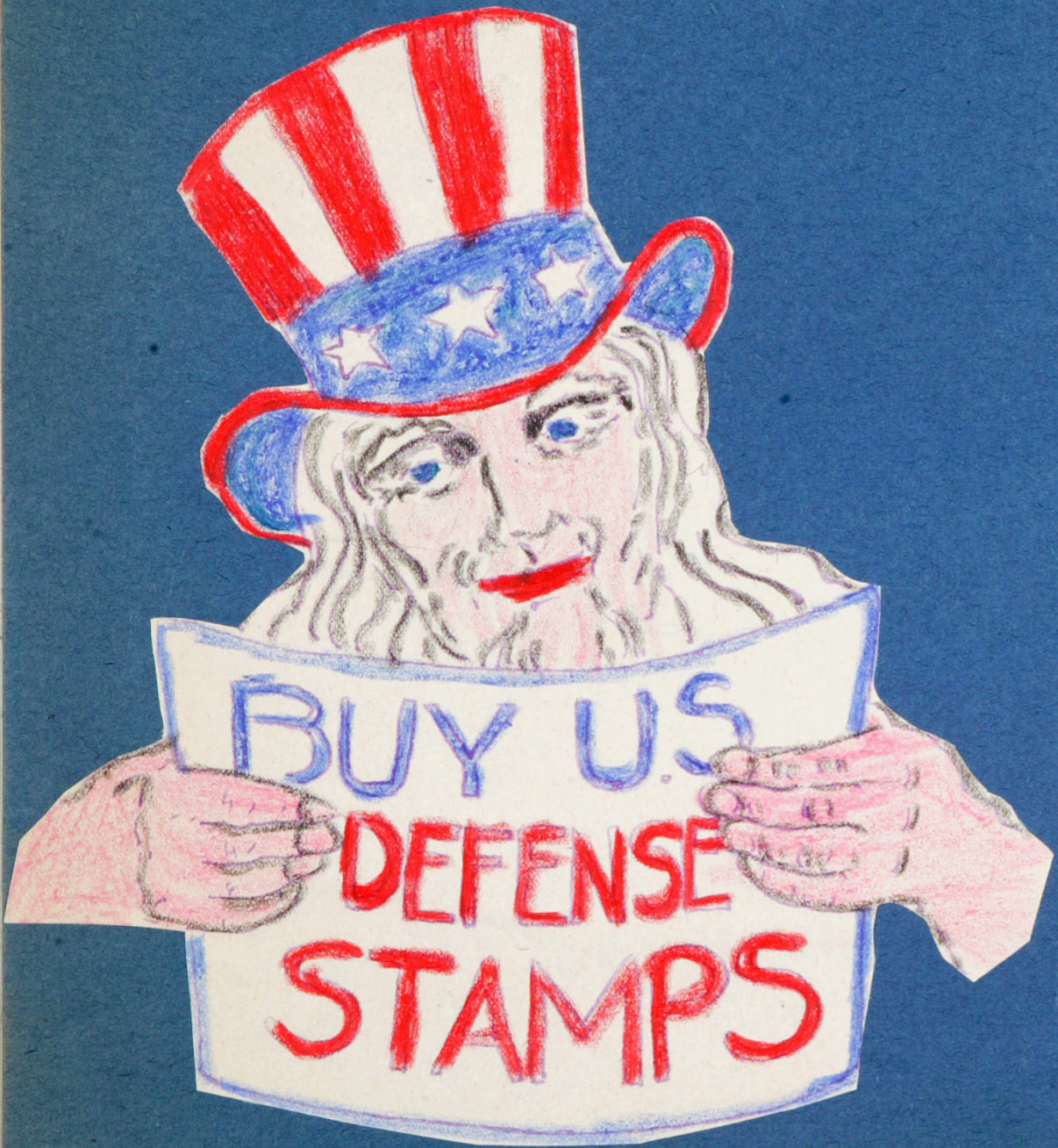
