Gardening can be a pleasure when one knows that the varieties of vegetables planted will succeed under the average Oklahoma conditions. This circular gives a standard list of vegetables adapted to Oklahoma. This list should meet the need of the average gardener, and is also adapted for commercial planters.

It is a good garden practice to buy your seed well in advance of planting time, before the seed supply of choice varieties is exhausted.

The success of gardening depends on application of good garden practices. Fertile soil, well prepared, is the first requirement.
