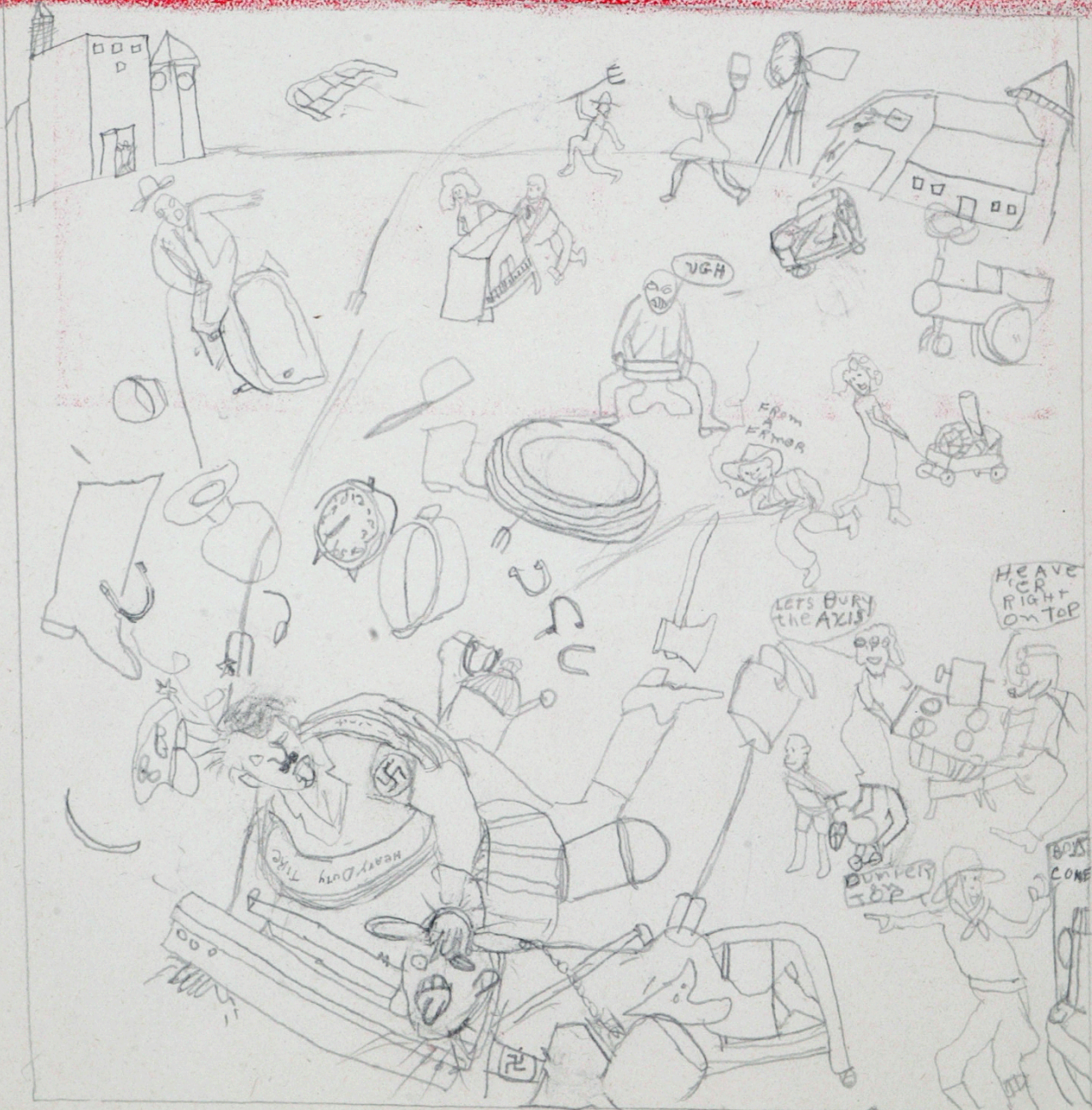

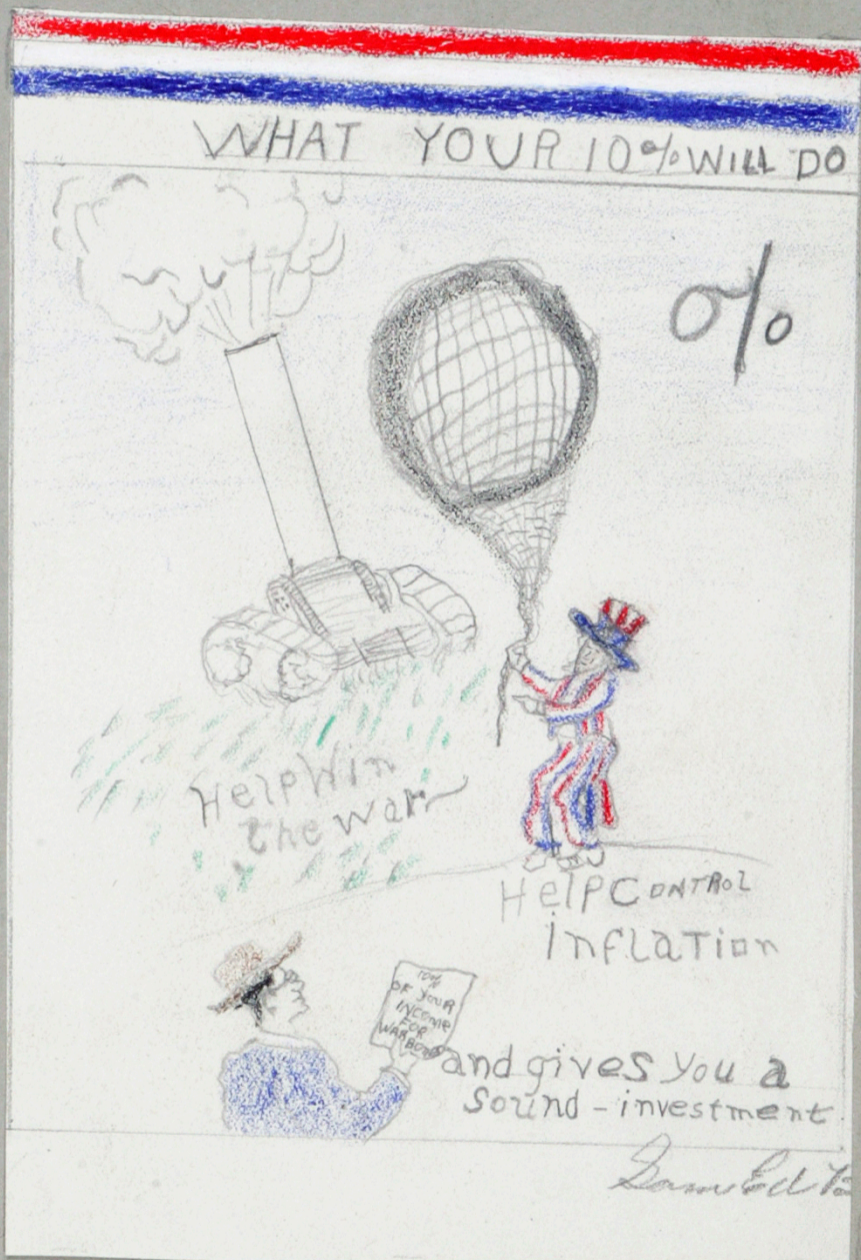

We're buying our share of War Stamps and bonds according to our means.  
On "Victory Day" November

17, 1942 an average of \$5.00 for each student in war stamps and bonds was purchased by the members of Henderson School.

Lieut. Sarah Flute, Sergeant Emma Christie, Privates Billie Joe Fields, Eva Pigeon, and Robert L. Bush were praised highly for their volunteer services for "Child Care" to help working mothers.

The Henderson School Board has decided to start their work one hour later, thus in effect restoring the central standard time. The motive behind this was conservation. It was figured that it would save many dollars in light bills in the homes.

The "Repairing Committee" consisting of Sergeants Ferrell Longshore and Berry O. Dotson has performed minor repairs on the soft ball equipment the past week.

A large crowd attended Sunday School and Church at John Bolin's Sunday. Brother Smith made his regular trip.

## First Aid Treatment of a Wound

Grade 6

First aid treatment of a slight wound is very simple.

First use the iodine or iodophore swab lightly on the wound and surrounding skin. Allow to dry. Then apply a dressing of sterile gauze being careful not to touch the side that goes next to the wound.

If the injury is only a slight cut adhesive plaster may be used to hold the dressing in place. But if the finger is badly bruised cut or burned a bandage should be used.

If use a one-inch bandage. Standing to one side cover the end with two or more turns. Hold the end of the tape in place until

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Use a one-inch bandage. Standing to one side cover the end with two or more turns. Hold the ends of the turns in place until a reverse turn can be made around the tip of the finger. Then wind the bandage around the finger to the base each turn covering about two-thirds of the previous one. Make a circular turn about the base, split the end of the bandage, and tie on the back of the finger. If this tends to slip cover the bandage round the wrist for a couple of turns and back round the finger.

birthday we celebrated Mrs. J.B. Hewin gave the welcome address and Mrs. B.H. Trott the response.

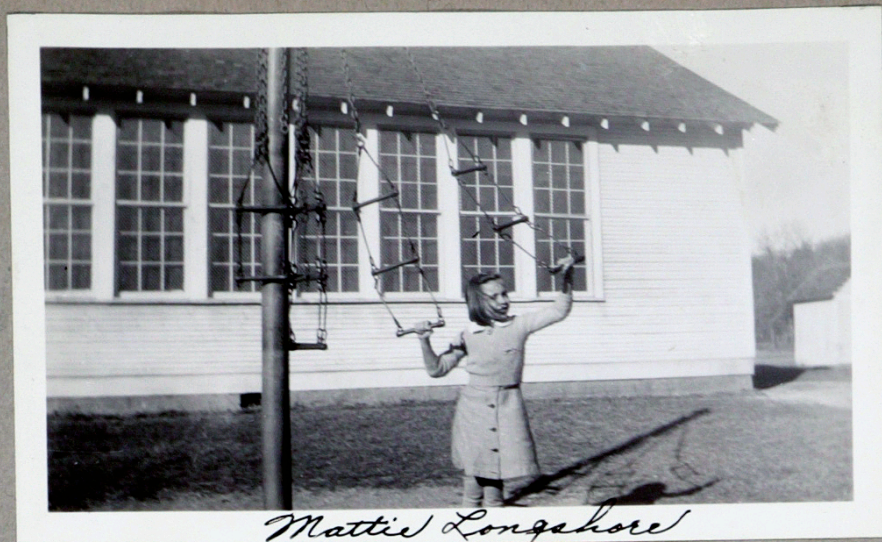
