MASTER THE AIR. U. S. Rubber airplane tires, flying suits, Koyalon* cushions, engine mountings, self-sealing tanks and fuel lines, are needed for the Army Air Corps.



TRANSPORT MUNITIONS. Thousands of U. S. Rubber truck tires of all sizes are required for the endless lines of trucks which supply the Army with munitions, food, supplies.
